Busy Times at Hand


In the past, Nevada Libertarians have experienced one constant; post-election lulls. According to Al Western, Chairman of the Libertarian Party of Clark County, "those days are over."

"I have some goals to implement over the next year or so, "said Western, "one of the more immediate ones' is to provide local Libertarians an opportunity to participate on a consistent basis." Though he admits that the majority of LPCC functions are attended by the same individuals, he was quick to point out that "we are attracting new attendees all the time."

"I believe we have a great group of Libertarians in southern Nevada, now it's my job to enact programs to them involved." One thing Western has done to re-establish "Our By-Laws Committees. provide for standing committees," said Western, "Granted, some of the positions have yet to be filled, but we're working on it." According to Western, responsibilities accorded to committees that remain unfilled are assumed by others. For example, the Finance Committee, Chaired by Chuck Geshlider, will begin to work on
items that should be reserved for the Program Committee. Beginning this
month, the Finance Committee
will hold separate meetings
from those of the LPCC.
These meetings are designed
to consider financial conditions, fund raising events,
expenditure of funds, and
report their findings, conclusions, and proposals to
the LP membership at general
LP business meetings.

Western would also like to see more Libertarian social events. Plans include LP dinners, Bar B-Q's, picnics, and "anything else we can come up with that will get people to participate."

Admittedly, Western one primary reason for establishing these events. "I've studied recent election results and one theme is reoccurring, television legitimizes and produces results. "We must do everything possible to flood the television market with advertising in the 1990 election. Andre Marrou has been a proponent of this approach for years and it's time we start listening to the experience available to us."

To everyone who contributed to make this forward progress possible, a sincere "Thank You!" Come next election....Look Out!!!







1989 National Convention Announced
The 1989 bi-annual National Convention of the Libertar-

ian Party will take place Thursday August 31 through Sun-September 3rd, in center-city Philadelphia at the Wyndham Franklin Plaza Hotel. Themed "Proclaim Liberty" after the inscription on the Liberty Bell, it marks the return of the LP conventions to the East Coast after four of five being west of Kansas.

The organizers, Proclaim Liberty Convention Associates, are long-time Libertarian activists Don Ernsberger, Morrison, and Dave Walter. PLCA is developing a "don't want to miss" program and has set the lowest full convention package price in years for advance reservations; \$199.95 until April 15th.

The Libertarian Party of Nevada will be choosing delegates and alternates in the near future. The number of de-legates chosen can be increased by one for every 20 na-tional members we add by February 28th. National members receive the national newsletter and even if you aren't a delegate, by joining the national party you add to delegate strength by increasing the number Nevada's eligible. There will be plenty of work for delegates

lots of fun for non-delegates.

While there will be the ususal business sessions, kers, and exibitors, it is being billed as the convention where the LP's direction for the future is decided. The entire Convention will hear panel discussions on the Party's future and consider such questions as "should our Presidential candidates accept taxpayers' matching funds," "should presidential campaigns be de-emphasized," and "should the national Committee's size and duties be altered?" Visions of new goals and strategies will be an important part of the decision on a new Chair for the Party


with a three way contest appearing probable.

The program features "nuts and bolts" sessions on political techniques, of course, along with speakers on is-

sues and ideology.

"Special Events" scheduled include a trip to Atlantic City's casinos and famous boardwalk, a tour of historic olde Philadelphia including Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell, the gala Banquet on Saturday night, and 3 breakfasts with top Libertarian celebrities. An extra event you might wish to attend will be the Society for Individual Liberty's "20th Anniversary of the Movement" banquet on Wednesday night, honoring LP News editor Karl Hess.

New National Chair Dave Walter described the Convention thusly: "All-in-all, this is the convention to attend if you want to participate in setting the Party's agenda for the 1990's."
