RE: Judicial Committee Appeal regarding 2025 Convention Notice
Tewksbury, et.al. vs. LPCA Executive Committee - November 28, 2024

RULING

The Libertarian Party of California Judicial Committee held a hearing on December 19, 2024, regarding the above stated appeal on December 19, 2024.

The appellants asserted that the Libertarian Party of California (LPCA) Executive Committee (EC) failed to provide sufficient notice, per the LPCA Bylaws, for the 2025 Annual Convention.

The appellants requested the following relief:

1. Determine that the Executive Committee has violated Bylaw 20, Section 2, by failing to provide the membership at least 120 days' advance notice of the 2025 convention arrangements.
2. Direct the Executive Committee to take corrective action, including:
 - A. Setting new convention dates that will allow for a practicable convention-notice process in compliance with the bylaws.
 - B. Providing at least 120 days' notice to the entire membership per the bylaws, being clear that this corrects and supersedes previous information.

The unanimous ruling of the Judicial Committee is as follows:

1. The Executive Committee has violated Bylaw 20, Section 2, by failing to provide the membership at least 120 days' advance notice of the 2025 convention arrangements.
2. The Executive Committee shall take corrective action, including:
 - A. Setting new convention dates that will allow for a practicable convention-notice process in compliance with the bylaws.
 - B. The LPCA shall provide at least 120 days' notice to the Central Committee Members per the Bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (RONR). This notice needs to make it clear that it supersedes the previous 2025 convention notice.

This is a summary; the full report will be issued per the LPCA Bylaws.
