SIXTH LP CANDIDATE IN THE RACE

IS DEMOCRACY DYING IN VIRGINIA?

JIM VENCILL TO RUN FOR HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Jim Vencill of Nokesville has declared that he will run for House of Delegates in the Thirteenth District. A supporter of libertarianism since reading the works of Robert Ringer 20 years ago, he rejoined the Libertarian Party at the Prince William County convention last November after an absence of a few years.

Jim was born in Sidney, Nebraska and lived in nearby Kimball until entering the army for a four-year tour. He learned electronics in the army and in night school, and currently is the owner of The Technology Group, a systems integration company specializing in computer telephony. Jim has been a resident of Virginia for the past 15 years.

The Vencill campaign marks the fourth consecutive year that there has been a Libertarian on the ballot in Prince William County. Jim was inspired to run for office by the efforts of the Reams campaign last year. He expects to further popularize Libertarian ideas and contribute to building a professional political organization in Prince William County.

Jim intends to run on a platform of support for the First Amendment, restoring the Second Amendment, repealing drug prohibition and eliminating the business tax on gross proceeds (a business 'license' known as BPOL). Under consideration by the campaign committee are issues such as massive tax credits for parents who remove their children from public school and place them in private school or school them at home. Development issues and legislation to allow Virginia residents to withdraw from the Social Security system are also being discussed.

Jim's campaign manager i s J a n e McKenzie of Sterling, a contracts manager with a major corporation. His campaign treasurer is retired Air Force veteran Pat



Snider of Dale City. His communications director is Cynthia Neil of Woodbridge, a long-time fan of Ayn Rand and Objectivism. Both Pat and Cynthia were supporters of the Reams for Congress campaign.

Jim is opposed by incumbent Republican Bob Marshall. There is no Democrat or independent in the race, so this will be a great opportunity to talk to dissatisfied and open-minded voters. See page 4 for how you can help Jim and the other LPVA candidates.

IS DEMOCRACY DYING IN VIRGINIA?

I just received a copy of the candidate lists for the November 4 election from the State Board of Elections. I've compiled some statistics for House of Delegates candidates. Three of our six candidates are in 2-way races. An incredible 47 candidates out of 100 seats, all incumbents, are running UN-OPPOSED! An additional 12 seats are lacking candidates from both major (Dems & Reps) parties. Ten of these are incumbents opposed by "independents" (including 3 of ours). One is an independent incumbent opposed by an independent. The last is a Dem vs. a Reform, no incumbent in that race. Only 7 races have no incumbent; 93 of the



We Don't Compromise.

Most policy debates between libertarians and statists focus on the role of markets versus governments. Dr. Fred Foldvary in the Jan. 1997 issue of the Freeman believes this to be a misleading distinction. He believes we should be asking not whether the market or the government can do the best job, but whether the governance should be voluntary or coercive.

Governance is required for the provision of collective goods. Markets can determine the demand for private goods, but finding out the individual demand for collective goods is a problem, especially in ascertaining pricing. However, Foldvary points out that governance can be consensual and contractual even with collective goods.

Spencer MacCallum, in <u>The Art of Community</u>, points out the similarities in functions between hotel and city governance. The hotel, like city hall,

provides managment, collective goods: a town square (like a lobby), streets (like hallways), transportation (elevators), fire protection, recreation, and other services. The collective goods are paid from the rental paid by guests and user fees pay for individually consumed items such as phone calls and room service.

Hotels, like condo and homeowner associations, are a contractual community. They provide services that make the territory more valuable, increasing economic rent (the value of a specific space), which in turn pays for the collective goods by market processes. Taxation of labor, capital, and sales is not required! However, market processes, demonopolization of operations, and decentralization are required. Foldvary maintains that consensual communities are models for tax and governmental reforms because they bring society closer to voluntary governance.




THE SAM ADAMS AWARDS
