

From the Editor **Finishing Fourth**

arr/Root finished 4th among 2008's national tickets. As of November 20, 2008, Barr/Root have 512,643 votes, behind Nader/ Gonzalez's 701,139.

Barr/Root also rank 4th among LP national tickets to date, percentagewise. A few days after the election Alexander S. Peak at the Last Free Voice blog crunched some numbers. He reports the following vote percentages: Ed Clark in 1980 (1.06397%); Harry Browne in 1996 (0.50468%); Ron Paul in 1988 (0.47137%); Bob Barr in 2008 (0.40145%).

Barr improved on Harry Browne in 2000 (0.36472%) and Michael Badnarik in 2004 (0.32491%), but Barr failed to bring the LP back up to 1996, 1988, or 1980 levels.

Root, who's already running for 2012, stresses in a press release that Barr/Root got the second highest number of votes among LP national tickets. Browne pulled the third highest number of votes: 485,798 in 1996.

But that was 12 years ago, when the U.S. population was smaller. Do those 12 years really matter?

The Census Bureau estimates the U.S. population in July 1996 at 265,189,794. The July 2008 estimate is 303,824,640.

That's 38,634,846 more Americans. The LP should get more votes just by standing still and doing nothing. Thus, the better measure of success is not vote *numbers*, but vote percentages.

Some provisional, absentee, and write-in votes remain to be counted. The 2008 vote totals may change slightly. The percentages less so.



While supplying the os-U.S. media filtered out information that refuted the claims of Washington's war planners. "Journalists, too many of them, some quite explicitly, have said that they see their mission as helping the war effort," an American media critic warned during the lead-up to the invasion. "If you define your mission that way, you'll end up suppressing news that might be important, accurate, but maybe isn't helpful to the war effort.'

Jeff Cohen spoke those words before the story uncorked by Katharine Gun's leak splashed across British front pages and then scarcely dribbled into American media. He uttered them on the MSNBC TV program hosted by Phil Donahue, where he worked as a producer and occasional onair analyst.

Donahue's prime time show was canceled by NBC three I weeks before the invasion, on almost the same day the revelation of the NSA memo became a big media story in the United Kingdom and such a carefully bypassed one in the

A leaked NBC memo confirmed suspicions that the network had pulled the plug on Donahue's show to obstruct views and information that would go against the rush to war. The network memo said the Donahue program would present a "difficult public face for NBC in a time of war." And: "He seems to delight in presenting guests who are antiwar, anti-Bush and skeptical of the administration's motives.' Cancellation averted the danger that it could become "a home for the liberal antiwar agenda at the same time that our competitors are waving the

I flag at every opportunity." To the editors of American I mass media, the actions and revelations of Gun merited little or no reporting -- especially when they mattered most. My search of LexisNexis found that for nearly three months after her name was first reported in British media, U.S. news stories mentioning her scarcely existed.

When the prosecution of Katharine Gun finally concluded its journey through the British court system, a surge of American news reports on the closing case "had people won-

Marshall William Fritz, RIP

arshall William Fritz peacefully V Tuesday, November 4, 2008 of pancreatic cancer. He was an intelligent, witty man who founded three nonprofit organizations. A Catholic mass was held in his honor at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, in Clovis, CA on November 7th. A graveside service was held at the Holy Sepulcher Cemetery in Orange, CA on November

Marshall was born in Inglewood, CA on March 10, 1943. He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Joan; his son, Eugene Fritz of Calwa; his three daughters and their husbands: Susan and Christopher Bethea of Clovis, Lucie and Tony Ruiz of Fresno, Ann and Kyle McKenna of Pittsburgh, PA; twelve grandchildren and his brother, Russell Fritz of Baja, Mexico.

In 1994, Marshall founded the Alliance for the Separation of School & State and was Chairman of the Board until his death. He was a leading spokesman in how ending state, federal, and local government involvement in schooling can improve education for all children, strengthen the family, and lead to a turnaround of our collapsing society.

Prior to founding the Alliance, Marshall was president of the unaccredited Pioneer Christian Academy. His ideas for high quality education were so advanced that his school received endorsements of educators from William Glasser, to Nobel Laureate Milton Friedman, to New York State Teacher-ofthe-Year John Taylor Gatto.

Prior to his work in K-12 education, Marshall founded the Advocates for Self-Government, an educational organization that teaches Americans how to express their love for liberty


