

LP BACK IN COURT Judge Lloyd George has called for a final hearing of the LPN's claim challenging the constitutionality of the "Minor Political Parties Qualifications Procedure" statute. Previously, LPN State Director Gordon Morris succeeded in overturning the ru ling that would have allowed two Democrats to run against one Libertarian. That was the first phase of this court case.

Morris will return to Federal Court on Friday, April 28th at 1:30 P.M. in the Foley Federal Building. "This legislation is like a poll tax,"

said Morris, "the ballot is not the private property of the Demoblicans."



The Democrats have chosen to pursue what's commonly called the "Black vote."
