#### Platform & By-Laws Changes

Platform discussion was relatively brief, with only a few new planks added to the platform. One puts the Libertarian Party on record as being in opposition to the principle of police power. Police power doesn't mean simply the prosecution of violent crimes. It's the special power that is claimed by the state as a "right" to prosecute victimless crimes, go after midwives, incarcerate innocent people in mental institutions, close down unlicensed day-care centers—that sort of thing. It's what's done to "protect" people and society in the name of the so-called common good.

Another plank was adopted declaring our opposition to any proposed legislation that would make English the official language of California. In this spirit a resolution was passed condemning civic bodies that adopt ordinances requiring English-only or bi-lingual signs on businesses.

A third new plank endorses our support of the right of individuals or groups to conduct a lottery.

It was also written into the By-laws that it is the primary duty of the State Ex-Com to promote Libertarian Party candidates.



#### Karl Bray Award

One of the highlights of the Convention is the presentation of the Karl Bray Award, the LPC's highest award for self-initiated, meritorious activism on behalf of the Libertarian Party. This year, the coveted award went to long-time activist Bob Lehman. In presenting it, Bruce Lagasse (originator of the Award) described Bob as "the glue that has held the Party together over the past year," and cited in particular his outstanding efforts in the Membership Drive and his work as state-coordinator.

Bob's efforts go far back. He has served in many offices and capacities: chair of Region 14, LPC Secretary, editor of LiberCal, and Calif. Libertarian News, indefatigueable worker in the registration drive, etc., etc. Whenever a job needed to be done, Bob has always been there to give wholehearted support and to be sure it is carried out.

The award, named in honor of the late tax protester Karl Bray, consists of an engraved plaque and a \$20 gold piece. Bob says the plaque will always have an honored place in his home; and the gold-piece? Well, we bet he'll do what Jack Dean (winner of the first Award) will do. Jack told those at the Banquet he still has his mounted on a chain so he can keep it around his neck. In any case, Bob is not about to spend it.

#### Changes at CLNews: Sarah E. Foster, New Editor

Bob Lehman has decided to give up the editorship of *California Libertarian News* in order to devote full time to his duties as Secretary, and asked me to take over its editorship. Frankly, I'm honored and flattered—just hope I can do as good a job as he's done. It'll be a tough act to follow.

I hope to expand *CLN* into an eight page publication, especially with so much happening between now and November. However, in order to do this two things are necessary: advertising to cover the costs, plus lots of news.

Please send me information not only about your regional meeting, (when, where, what about), but news of what the candidates and activists in your area are doing: on what battlefield do they fight, what banners do they carry? Also wanted: letters by libertarians published in local papers; reports and alerts on whatever legislation is being proposed and considered in your city, county, Sacramento, Washington (always give bill number, sponsors, who to contact and other relevant material); anecdotes; articles; and so on.

#### LPC Membership Drive: Button, Button, Who Wore the Button?

It was close right down to the wire in the race to win the banner in the great LPC Membership Drive. In January, Santa Clara and Sacramento Counties were leading, but during the last weeks before the Convention Southern California counties renewed their efforts so *two* winners emerged victorious: Sacramento (best percentage, 91%) and San Diego (most new members, 41).

Northern Vice-Chair Dennis Schlumpf and Southern Vice-Chair Sam Treynor had challenged each other to a button-duel. If LPC membership increased by a greater percentage in the north than in the south, Sam would wear a button at the Convention announcing that "Northern California Is Best", and vice versa. It was close, but Southern California pulled ahead with a 30% increase over Northern California's 38%.

Dennis lived up to the agreement and wore a button saying, "Southern Calif. is best." (Hey, we know that already! This is just more evidence).

Besides the banners, two plaques were presented by Bob Lehman at the Sam Adams Luncheon to San Diego and Sacramento Counties. They are to be kept by those counties for a year, but next year could go to other winners if these counties rest on their laurels.
