ome people seem think that the only reason for having a political philosophy is


to get elected. With the Libertarian Party, principles are to represent what's right, not just what some poll shows

When the first votes were cast in the 1992 New Hampshire primary, none of the bigspending Democrats or Republicans won.



Libertarian Andre Marrou won.

The voters of Dixville Notch, N.H. which every four years holds the first vote in the nation — were sending a signal that they were tired of a federal government that believed its role was to tax the nation for everything under the sun. Andre Marrou and the Libertarian Party stand for less government and more individual freedom. Marrou stresses a return to the values on which the American nation was founded.

Marrou is a graduate of MIT and has worked as an engineering manager. He was

elected in 1984 to the Alaska State Legislature, where he fought for legislation to limit the size of government and reduce state taxes. He also was a part of the successful effort to end Alaska's state income tax.

In 1988, Marrou was the Libertarian Party's vice presidential nominee and running mate of U.S. Rep. Ron Paul of Texas.

Marrou plans to cut the size of government to allow the tax bite out of your pocket to shrink from the current 50 percent to only 10 percent or less, by ending foreign aid and

farm subsidies, and ending congressional

Marrou believes the only proper role of government is to protect individuals against foreign invasion and to fight crime in this country. He believes we should be in control of our own money and lives.

Dr. Nancy Lord is an Atlanta attorney who specializes in both medical-legal issues and constitutional law, which is



appropriate for someone who has both legal and medical degrees.

Lord was a candidate for mayor of Washington, D.C., in 1990, finishing fourth out of 11 candidates. She moved south shortly after that election.

As a businessperson, Lord could see in Washington how taxation and bureaucratic regulations were stifling entrepreneurship, which led her to make the run for mayor.

As the vice presidential running mate for Andre Marrou, Lord has already made

one campaign swing through Alabama to support state candidates and the national Libertarian platform.

Among key planks in the Libertarian platform:

Opposing all personal and corporate income taxes, and repeal of the 16th Amendment.

Allowing citizens the right to plan for their own retirement rather than forcing them into the virtually bankrupt Social Security system.

Opposing any government interference in health care, including opposing any national

health care plan.

### JEROME SHOCKLEY

America is in desperate need of fresh solutions to its problems, says Jerome Shockley.

And that's why he's running for U.S. Senate.

"I feel America is on the wrong track," he says. "I want to fight for the basic American principles that will return us to a right track for our children and their children."

Shockley, a resident of Valley who publishes a magazine about fox hunting, wants to lead a return to responsible goverment beginning with the federal deficit.

'I feel that the greatest danger facing America is the huge federal debt," he says.

Shockley is in favor of cutting federal waste and some programs, privatizing some services and selling federal assets to balance the budget.

He would also eliminate all foreign aid. He would vote against any tax increase and work to cut existing taxes.

This year's election is crucial to America's future, he says. It's important that Americans send the message that big government has failed.

"1992 is the most important election in my lifetime," he says. "A new voice, with fresh ideas, will do more to change America's direction than simply changing Democrats for Republicans or vice-versa. Libertarians can provide this direction.'

Shockley, Third District representative for the Alabama Libertarian Party, is the father of two children, Jonathan, 12, and Shanna, 9.

He is a member of Valley Baptist Temple, a lifetime member of the International Society of Individual Liberty and a national director of the National July Foxhunters Association.

### JOHN GARRETT

Government has gotten out of control, and things must change, says John Garrett, congressional candidate in the First District.



"I will work for the return of fiscal responsibility in civil government," he says. "I will serve the people of Alabama not as a ruler, but as a defender of individual life, liberty and property.

### We believe your taxes are too high.

The Republican Party has tried to make this its big issue for years, but taxes keep going up anyway - even though it's been a Republican president signing the tax increases into law for 12 years now. he has a list of solutions that respect the freedoms of common people.

"I want to get the government back to its original purpose of protecting our rights and I have the determination necessary to be effective," says Reeves, who is a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives in the Second District. He owns a sign business in Montgomery, where he grew up.

The primary issues for the people he talks to: 1) too much taxation and regulation, 2) money is unsound, 3) violent crime is high, 4) low economic activity, 5)

poor education system and 6) jobs are scarce.

Reeves has a list of how he would handle those problems as a member of Congress.

"I would vote 'no' on taxes and 'no' on spending, stop inflating the currency supply, stop the drug 'war,' privatize government services, allow competition and choice in schools, remove obstacles to new businesses who wish to compete in the market and stop dictating how businesses should oper-

protected monopolies,"

Reeves says. "We must have a free market.
"We should get out of the United Nations and disband it. Stop the one-world order, stop subsidizing foreign governments and stop military adventurism. Let Japan and Europe pay for their own defense."

For Rod Templeton, it's easy to say what separates him from the other parties' candidates.



"I'm running for Congress to offer the voters a candidate who stands for less government in our personal and economic lives," Templeton says.

U.S. HOUSE-DISTRICT 3

Templeton says the primary issue in his race is the record of the incumbent.

."In the Third Congressional District, our incumbent's spending record is 20 percent more socialistic than the only admitted socialist in Congress, Bernard Sanders of Vermont," Templeton says. "Since socialism is a destructive force upon society, this is a main topic for my campaign."

Templeton says his election is important

not only because he's not like the incumbents in Congress, but also because of the message it will send to the country. He says the election of a Libertarian to Congress will tell Alabama and the nation that there is a sane way to solve the problems facing the country.

"My principles are not corruptible," Templeton says. "I will not vote for any program which does not relate to the basic functions of government, that is self-defense, protection from criminal

system of civil courts."

Templeton and his wife, Ann, have four children and five grandchildren.

"I believe the first responsibility of a congressman is to protect the individual rights of his constituents," Templeton says. "I'll do everything I can to prevent the raping of the Third District taxpayers."

"I want government to have spending limits just as I do," he says. "A balanced budget would be a major priority for me."

King said the recruitment of businesses and jobs for the Fourth District is important to the area. The district has a ready workforce, he says, and needs jobs that pay good wages and businesses that contribute to the community. But, he adds, the government is taking away too much of people's pay through taxes. Instead of the govern-

ment deciding where to spend our money, King says, we should make those decisions.

King feels that a congressional representative should be a speaker for the people. He vows to frequently report to those he represents — and not just through quarterly mail updates.

"Our Constitution and founding fathers didn't say a representative needed to be special, rich or otherwise, but one who represents their citizens and I will."

King is employed in automotive sales and repair, as well as being a cattle farmer. He is a member of Blountsville First United Methodist Church and is a Blountsville city council

He and his wife have one son, Robert Christian.

### MICHAEL SEIBERT

The American government needs to be put back into the hands of the people, says Michael Seibert, a Huntsville attorney



who is a candidate in the Fifth District.

U.S. HOUSE-DISTRICT 5

"America needs statesmen and not politicians," he says. "The American people need to understand that in a truly free society, government has a very limited function."

Seibert says that health care and the tax system are two areas of concern in his district. He says that he would work to require that the Internal Revenue Service use the regular court system, and to put IRS practices and the fairness of them

before a jury if a taxpayer requests it.

He would develop a plan for private solutions for health care problems affecting the poor. One possibility is to create a fee voucher system and tax credits for the medical profession, he says. Another would be to begin a system similar to state bar associations in which their members work with a certain number of indigent or reduced fee cases.

The more private solutions which are

implemented, the more freedom people will retain in their private lives, he says.

Seibert is a member of the Alabama Criminal Defense Lawyers Association, Tax Section of the Alabama Bar Association and the Alabama Bar Association.

### We believe you can choose your kids' school.

The politicians believe you can't be trusted to choose your kids' school. So they've set up a massive bureaucratic machine which has destroyed American education. In the past 30 years, the government has gotten more and more involved in education; in the same time, the quality of schools has gone down. We believe that if parents can choose their kids' schools, they will choose the good schools and force the lousy ones out of business. We believe you can choose what's best for your kids.

We believe big brother should leave you alone.

Our governmental agencies at all levels are compiling information on you every year. And despite laws which should protect you, you have no control over that information. Government has no business asking you the kinds of personal questions the Census Bureau is allowed to ask you and you are required to answer. We believe it is the business of our government to provide a national defense and to protect us against criminals, but we believe that's where its business stops.

#### We believe in your right to bear arms.

We oppose all attempts to take your weapons away. While we strongly condemn any violent attack on a person or his property, we do not believe disarming the potential victim is either prudent or right. Laws

which are supposed to keep guns out of the hands of criminals will only protect the criminals. We believe you are the one who should decide whether you need the protection of a weapon.

#### We believe deficit spending must end now.

For years, politicians have lied to us by saying they could continue to spend more than taxes allowed. That is and always was a lie. A balanced budget must be achieved by slashing spending, not raising taxes.

### We believe environment is a property matter.

If someone dumps garbage on land you own, you sue that person for damaging your property, because you care about that which you own. The matter of environmental damage is the same way. It should be handled as a private matter between the polluter and the people whose property has been damaged. Strict liability, not federal agencies and arbitrary regulations, should regulate pollution.

#### We believe in human charity, not public dole.

The American people are the most generous on Earth. We believe they should be allowed to contribute to the needy as they see fit, not through government giveaway programs which only foster dependence on government.

### **U.S. HOUSE-DISTRICT 6**

### MARK BODENHAUSEN

Crime and a slow economy are the main problems facing voters in the Sixth District, says Mark Bodenhausen — but he says he



can make a difference in dealing with the problem areas.

"Crime, lack of jobs and a slow economy are the primary issues," Bodenhausen says. "People need to help the police to fight crime and get involved.

"The government has caused our

"The government has caused our economy to slow by burdening businesses with excess taxation, over-regulation and unfair laws and policies that punish successful businesses and reward failure."

Bodenhausen says people should send him to Congress at least in part because he's not a member of either of the country's ruling parties.

Bodenhausen and his wife, Brenda, own their own computer consulting firm in Birmingham.

He attended a Ph.D. program at Georgia State University in Atlanta before returning to Samford for a degree in business administration.

He attends the Doctrinal Studies Church of Birmingham. □

### MICHAEL MAYER

Michael Mayer says the federal government has an attitude toward the American people that he compares to "mafia theology": "We



get our cut up-front. Nothing personal; it's just business."

Mayer says he will represent the Seventh District in Congress to change that kind of thinking.

"We have taken this government that was 'for the people, by the people' and made it our master," Mayer says. "At times, those in power have the idea that the money they spend comes from the great public money tree. Their minds are set on how to control more of our money or how to make a tax increase not look

"They have no sens

Mayer says he's watched the situation in government get worse and worse starting in the '60s, and he says now is the time to fix the problem.

### STATE SUPREME COURT

### DAVID L. RAWLS

American courts should be working for justice — not the expansion of government power, says David L. Rawls, a Decatur at-



torney and candidate for the Alabama Supreme Court.

As a member of the Alabama Supreme Court, Rawls plans to lead the charge to change the way the Constitution is interpreted — and to work to stop or at least slow erosion of citizens' freedoms.

"It's time for a 'changing of the guard," he says. "I consider myself to be a servant of my clients and, when I am elected, I will try my best to carry this attitude into office and serve the people of my home state."

Rawls supports the idea of "fully informed juries." This concept says a jury has the right to try not only a person, but also to judge the morality of the law under which the person is accused. A jury is allowed to nullify an immoral law.

He believes that both the state and national constitutions are being misinterpreted by courts.

"In this position I would be able to bring the proper interpretation to Constitutional issues based upon common sense and through

following the original intentions of our forefathers," he says.

Rawls is a member of the Church of Christ, the American Bar Association, the Alabama Bar Association, the Morgan County Bar Association and University of Alabama Alumni Association.
