Moved and Seconded that \$25.00 be allocated to Speakers' Bureau. Motion passed.

LPC BALLOT POSSIBILITIES FOR '76 - Discussion.

With the signing of AB-52 by Gov. Brown, qualified signature requirements for gaining independent ballot status has been greatly reduced to a little over 99,000.

With post card registration beginning July 1st, it should be easier to obtain qualified ballot signatures.

Dave Bergland and Carol Cunningham discussed petition

drive activities in other states.

Moved and seconded that the petition drive for independent Motion: ballot status be the first priority for the Libertarian Party of California in 1976, and that Carol Cunningham and Bill Westmiller serve as northern and southern cochairpersons of a ballot drive committee composed of members they appoint. Motion passed.

U.S. SENATE CAMPAIGN - Lynn Kinsky, discussion.

Lynn assured Execom members that there would be no problem in qualifying to petition for independent ballot status. She explained the need for coordination various groups outside the Party to help with the petition drive. asked that LPC members allow their phones to be listed as local campaign headquarters, and crash space for out of town petition gatherers. Lynn will be debating Tom Hayden, Demo candidate for U.S. Senate at a Santa Barbara radio show on May 17th, at 7:30 pm.

McBRIDE/BERGLAND CAMPAIGN - Discussion

Ray Cunningham discussed establishing local coordinators for petition gathering. Said he would try to provide "How to" manuals for anyone interested in this activity.

PROPOSITIONS - Discussion.

members via mail ballot. Motion passed.
