US Senate Doane, Raymon

Raymon was the Libertarian Party of Colorado's nominee for CD1 in 2018. He's seeking the nomination for US Senate to run on a platform of reduced spending, economic sanity, and to bring a Libertarian message to people from all walks of life. Through his campaign, Raymon hopes to use his platform to help downballot candidates and to use events to help create new development groups and affiliates by bringing Libertarians together. Raymon would consider it an honor to be given this important spot on the ballot and to utilize it to bring the LPCO greater notoriety.

US Senate Kent, Gaylon

My name is Gaylon Kent, and I am seeking our US Senate nomination. I carried our party's banner in 2014 for the United States Senate and in 2018 and 2016 for the US House, District 3. In 2014 I received the highest vote total any third party candidate had ever received in a Colorado US Senate election, a record that was broken in 2016 by Lily Tang Williams. I moved to Steamboat Springs in 2011 and now live in Hayden. I served in the Navy on the USS Blueback, an old diesel submarine and have spent time as a radio announcer and newspaper reporter. I currently do some writing, am a hotel night auditor and the Veterans Service Officer for Routt County.

My campaign has three pillars:

1. An end to our perpetual wars. The world is entitled to see the benefits produced by an America at peace.
2. Fiscal sanity. I support doing away with the federal income tax. I don't think Americans are ready for that though, and I support a flat tax of 5% on incomes over \$35,000 and eliminating the corporate income tax. It is merely an expense they pass on to us.
3. Let's stop convicting the innocent. The fact this is happening in a nation conceived in liberty should cause all of us to go stand in a corner in shame.

It needs proper leadership in the legislature to help local government and residents to meet and surpass that potential, because the Fountain Valley has been ignored in Denver. It needs to have its infrastructure desperately upgraded with a better I-25 and US-85. Economic development is still in a stagnation with not enough competition in the area for groceries (no King Soopers or Costco) and not enough medium and heavy industry to diversify the economic base beyond supporting Fort Carson. While progress has been made on fixing the water supply problems over the past four years, there is still much to do in state-local-private partnerships to make the water clean again. The future of the Fountain Valley lies not in the partisan politics of the Republicans vs. the Democrats, but in representation for all of the Valley in a Libertarian. That Libertarian is Michael Seebeck.

Additional work in Colorado has been in auto repossessions, mental health case management, and occasional photography jobs.

Campbell's community involvement includes volunteer work at the Pikes Peak Humane Society and serving as Vice-Chair for the Libertarian Party of El Paso County in 2013-2014. He is also a current member of The Sons of the American Legion Eber Duclou Post 39.

Living for 10 years in NYC has been an immersive learning experience in the issues of dense city living. Having grown up in Manitou Springs gives Tim a historical foundation of Colorado Springs's westside. Colorado Springs has growth and development issues that need long term planning solutions tailored to our history, geography, and Olympic City lifestyle.
