STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE TO MEET

OPINIONS/ISSUES SOLICITED The next meeting of the LPVA Central Committee will be held in Williamsburg on Saturday, January 10th, 1981. The amount that will be accomplished at this meeting depends to a large degree on the amount of coordination that takes place in advance of the meeting. To this end, I will be meeting informally with Michel La Vean and Jerry Sklute in Richmond (1710 Wilmington Ave., 355-1923) on the 3rd and 4th of January. At this meeting topics to be considered at the upcoming Central Committee meeting will be discussed and formal motions will be drafted and typed, along with the agenda.

One issue which came up in the last meeting and which is likely to be brought up again this January is the question of a platform on issues of concern to Virginians (assuming national issues are handled by the National Convention). The questions are: Should the Central Committee establish such a platform at all? Should such a platform be presented to the April State Convention for adoption? Which issues should be addressed? Should mixed issues (like SALT, ERA, abortion, etc.) be addressed, even when different local Virginian Libertarian Candidates will be running on apparently opposite sides of such issues? Will such a platform handicap Libertarian candidates or will it better direct their efforts to the benefit of the Libertarian cause, or both?

My address is given below for anyone interested in putting their ideas on paper on this topic or on any other topic. Those letters reaching me before my trip to Richmond on the third will affect the motions drawn up at that meeting. You are continued on page 9

This is a partial list of things for Jim Chowe to do. His constant presence and involvement did lead to one thing -- accomplishment. He found out what was necessary in order for the LPVA to appear on the ballot and made certain that those requirements were met. He collected signatures for the ballot drive -- more than anyone else in the state -- and hounded enough to make the other libertarians produce the remainder needed to qualify the LPVA along with all of the other states.

He organized local meetings in Roanoke, Blacksburg, Va. Beach, Lynchburg and Charlottesville for the Clark Campaign. In between, Jim kept up correspondence as the Secretary/Treasurer, worked the State Fair booth, helped with Jim Turney's campaign, distributed Clark pamphlets door-to-door, wrote letters to the editor, helped with the literature to the schools and newsletter mailings, held meetings locally and state-wide, coordinated the Clark visit

SECOND DISTRICT NEWS



NO STATEWIDE CANDIDATES

One of the most important issues at the upcoming convention of the LPV A will be whether or not we intend to nominate candidates for statewide office in 1981. We believe that running candidates for statewide offices would be a mistake. Here are just a few reasons:

In order to get our candidates on the ballot, we would have to go through another 1980 style petition drive, with over 10,000 valid signatures per candidate required. As those persons who suffered through the '80 drive know, separate signature sheets are required for each city or county, for each candidate. It's hard enough to convince the average person to sign one petition, much less three. The result, as several downstate activists testified at the last State Central Committee meeting, would be an early burnout of many persons needed for the fall campaigns.

Successful third parties are generally built from the bottom up, as one constructs a house, not from the top down. The Alaska LP -- one of the few to show any real results -- operates on this principle. The ALP did not contest the House or Senate race this year, concentrating instead on local and state legislative offices. The ALP apparently recognizes that if you have good candidates, you should run them for achievable offices, not waste them where there is little opportunity to make an impact.

We need to concentrate our good candidates, and our manpower, time and money, on the races for House of Delegates in '81 (all 100 seats are up) and for local offices like the county board. It requires only a few hundred signatures for such candidates to secure ballot status.

We are not likely to win anyway, but we will almost certainly get a better percentage of the vote (thus more credibility for the LPVA in the long run) than any statewide contender we could field. And if the results are good enough, we can then consider running someone for one '82 state race -- Harry Byrd's Senate seat, which he seems almost certain to vacate.

You and your columnists constantly are alarming us about the Soviet Union outspending the United States militarily. Yet according to an article by Barry Posen and Steven Van Evera printed in the Wall Street Journal (February 2) the Warsaw Pact nations are not outspending the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, and the U.S. is outspending the rest of NATO. And a quarter of the Soviet Union's military effort is directed toward China.

If an unfavorable military balance exists, it is certainly not due to lack of spending by the U.S. More spending by the U.S. alone will cause our goods to become even more competitive with those of nations whose defense we supply gratis.

Oil blackmail? No matter who controls the world's energy, it will still be sold and/or consumed. We have no God-given mandate to allocate it by force.

The solution? Equitable, economical, non-hysterical collective security, keeping in mind that the Soviet Union cannot get to North America and would not want to come if it could, and that our allies are lying down on us. Horace D. McCowan Jr.

Monday, January 5th, 1981, is a BLACK MONDAY for all people who love liberty. Our government is once more asserting its raw power and showing everyone that we are all owned by the state.

On that day, continual "registration" begins again, and all American boys will have to register within one month of their eighteenth birthday under penalty of fines or jail.

President-elect Reagan has spoken against registration and the draft many times in the past, but he has not said what he will do when he officially becomes President. Many of the representatives which we elected to preserve our liberty are clamoring for him to continue registration. You may be able to sway him by writing a letter. Send them to: Ronald Reagan, c/o Transition Team, 1726 M Street, NW, Washington, DC 20270.

The only real solution to this atrocity is to get the American people to understand that the issue is individual liberty; either we own our bodies or else we belong to the state. Anti-draft groups are active in Northern Virginia (NVAIS-Scott Royce) and around Richmond, where CARD plans a protest march in front of the Main Post Office at High Noon on Black Monday.

The Richmond Peace Education Center is also offering a draft counseling service (Steve Hodges (804) 358-1958) where young men are encouraged to call to learn what (few) options are available and what the requirements and penalties are, so they can make their decision knowledgeably. This counselling service is free and does not advocate any course of action -- the young high school students will have to make their first big decision all alone.

10TH DISTRICT MEETING REPORT

Tenth District Libertarians met in Convention on December 6, 1980 to choose officers and adopt a set of bylaws. Elected without opposition to the District Chair was Julie Floyd, who ran on a platform stressing the need to organize local party units. Kathleen Taylor of McLean was chosen as District Secretary. Bylaws passed after debate lasting less than an hour. Also adopted was a resolution which commended the efforts of Ed Clark, David Koch, media director of the 1980 campaign Ed Crane, and the national headquarters staff for their "tireless efforts" to spread the Libertarian message this year.

Floyd, who served as Volunteers Coordinator of the Arlington Clark campaign, has also been active in the women's and antidraft movements. Taylor worked as a paid staffer at Clark National Headquarters.

Convention keynote speaker Alan Crawford, author of Thunder on the Right, praised Libertarians as a "refreshing new group in an otherwise dreary political scene", and gave his insights into future Reagan policy and the position of the LP in national politics. Announcements were heard from spokesmen from NVAIS (antidraft) and for a seminar on the subject of how to avoid paying taxes legally. Jim Hainer then addressed the meeting on the topic of inflation.

Although no theme had been planned, the de facto theme emerged each time a speaker addressed the topic of what challenge lay before the Libertarian Party: Get the message out! This last election has taught the nation a new term, "Libertarian". The next task is to teach the meaning, to publicize libertarian solutions versus libertarian positions.

Twenty LPVA members were present and voting, plus a handful of non-libertarians. A good time was had by all and all will be looking forward to the next such meeting in '81.

Eric O'Keefe of Michigan became the new National Director of the Libertarian Party. Eric made his reputation by being the State Chair of Michigan, a Regional Representative and the Ballot Drive Coordinator for the Clark Campaign.

Kent Guida, formerly State Chair of Maryland, has become the new National Membership Director.

The Computer Oversight Committee reported that our current computer took us through the campaign, thanks to Dallas Cooley, but we are victims of our own success! The computer can no longer hold all of the names aquired throughout the campaign. Craig Franklin (North Carolina), the Committee Chairman, is currently raising money to buy a new computer. people of Afghanistan, who have held the Russian army off for months? Would the communists attempt a military takeover? Not likely. Another big lie, accepted as truth by almost everybody.

Why does our government continually scare us with this threat? Why do the statists and the media continually support these lies? Some of course, are just parroting what they have been hearing for 35 years, without thinking about it. But our leaders, especially our military and foreign policy leaders, must know that this threat does not exist. What do they gain by having us believe? They gain POWER: Power to spend money on cost-plus contracts given to people who support the politicians. Power to control those same people. Power to tax us more and more. Power to blackmail our "allies", or to bribe them to support us, which doesn't always work. Power to enact emergency measures over our lives and property. Power to enslave us with the draft. Power to manipulate the economy, which got us into World War II, and may get us into World War III. Power to threaten anyone who would oppose them, including all the media, which once stood guard against the government, but now is in cahoots, partly out of fear, and partly because they get power from this support.

Some people will try to ignore these arguments by saying that they are "simplistic", or "too black and white", that the issue is "more complex". This is another technique for countering facts with emotion, somehow equating "simplicity" with "stupidity". If the facts are true and the logic makes sense, the conclusion must be correct. After all, 1 + 1 = 2 is very simple, but it is correct!

A "Fortress America" where we defend only our shores, where we do not meddle in the affairs of other countries, where we do not give away billions of tax dollars, and where there is minimum risk of any confrontation with communists is just what the average American wants. We must teach them that this will only happen with a Libertarian Foreign Policy. Every time someone uses the term "Fortress America" we must challenge the concept, and show people that it is just not true. Once they understand that, they will understand that their real enemy is the present government, which they elected.

LIBERTARIAN MAGAZINE PROJECT

One of the main problems confronting Libertarians is the lack of familiarity with our ideas in the mainstream of American culture. Conservative, liberal, democrat and republican, all are familiar terms that most people have heard all their lives and are comfortable with. Since many people are threatened by new ideas, we need to make libertarian ideas pop up so frequently in the culture that the average person no longer feels threatened by them. One of the ways to do this is to make libertarian publications as visible as possible

In Richmond, one of the projects some of us are working on is to get libertarian magazines in public or semi-public places such as doctor's offices, libraries, etc. The people who publish Libertarian Review are sending us sixty copies of recent back issues at no charge except postage and we have agreed to place the magazines in public locations where they will be available for people to browse through. Since most Doctor's offices have magazines dating back at least a year, it's likely that a copy of a libertarian magazine left there will stay for a good while and many people will causually pick it up and read an article or two.

We're also trying to get the Richmond Public Library to subscribe to a libertarian publication, but with no success so far, even though we have offered to give them a gift subscription (to the <u>Libertarian Review</u>). Although they gave us several bureaucratic reasons for refusing our offer, it is believed that they were afraid of controversial ideas on their magazine rack, and that the very title, <u>Libertarian Review</u>, made them nervous. It would perhaps be better to use <u>Inquiry</u> or Reason to present to a library since these do not appear to be so specifically "libertarian" as the Review.

One important fact that we have learned in this project is that you will not get non-libertarians (such as head librarians) to cooperate with you if you appear to threaten either their values or their territory, so choose your publications carefully. The simplest way to get a radical idea accepted is to give it a familiar, non-threatening appearance. This way you won't have to spend a lot of valuable time overcoming soneone's initial fear of something new and unknown.

WE HAVE NOT YET BEGUN TO FIGHT

It was 1780 and the British under Lord Cornwallis had overrun the state of South Carolina. Across the border, in the village of Charlotte, a tired governor, John Rutledge, began the weary task of setting up a government in exile. It was to Charlott that the "rebels" retreated, still reeling from the battering that they had taken in their struggle against tyranny.

There were no recriminations or finger pointing, Charleston was occupied by foreign troops and there was work to be done. General Rutledge called together three militia officers, Francis Marion, Andrew Pickens and Thomas Sumter.

"Some of our people", the governor said, "may agree with the British that South Carolina is prostrate. But I'm encouraged. Not one of the dozens of officers who have come here in the past few days has even thought about surrendering. Neither have I, although there is little that I can do at the present. I must rely on you."

"For the present I can give you only my prayers. I have no funds. Your men will have to serve under you in good faith and wait until we regain control of our state before we can pay their wages. I am writting to General Washington and the Continental Congress, but I expect little help from either. They're having their own problems."

By 1782, the "Swamp Fox" and "Light Horse Harry" Lee had made life so unpleasant for their oppressors, that Cornwallis abandoned South Carolina and began the retreat north that became known as the Yorktown Campaign. The United States won its independence because patriots refused to be beaten.

It is now 1980. Two hundred years later we find ourselves in Governor Rutledge's shoes. We have made progress, although not as much as some would have liked. We cannot allow ourselves to become weak. We cannot tolerate anything that would prevent us from preparing for our own Yorktown Campaign in '82.

We cannot afford to adopt any posture other than one of readiness. One in which we demonstrate that we are not defeated, that we will not go away, that we will restore the American Tradition: Liberty!

Some words or phrases have an emotional content independent of their actual meaning. Once this emotional content is accepted by people, the word or phrase becomes a 'shorthand" to convey paragraphs of meaning which are very difficult to refute. Rather than attempt to debate the issue, in many cases it is more effective to use a synonym which does not contain the emotional content. Libertarians have switched from "isolationist" to "non-interventionist" for this reason, and have had some success. except that "non-interventionist" is neutral and does not have a positive emotional content to offset the negative content of "isolationist."

Other phrases with negative content used to disparage Libertarian Foreign Policy proposals are "Fortress America" and "Garrison State", now being used more and more. Rather than finding other neutral synonyms which concede the point and put us on the defensive, let's start a campaign to transform the negative connotation and show people that "Fortress America" is in their interest and is good for them!

One approach could be to explore the literal meaning of "Fortress America", which creates a vision of a huge wall on our shore, bristling with guns, keeping everyone else outside. There is no rational way anyone could use our foreign policy proposals to support this image. To the contrary, we want to tear the walls down! We want no limitations on immigration. We

want no tariffs restricting trade. We certainly do not want an 'iron curtain' keeping people in, nor repressive laws which make it difficult to travel or invest abroad. To disparage Libertarians with the literal meaning of "Fortress America" is the technique of the "big lie"--a falsehood so great that people cannot believe anyone would distort the truth so much, and so they accept it.

Another approach is to explore the current belief that withdrawal of American military forces from other countries would instantly result in communist takeovers, leaving us alone in the world. We are told that it would be much better to fight on foreign soil rather than in America. No one can argue with that idea, but what do our allies think? Do they want to sacrifice their homeland for us? Why should they? Geography does not allow them the option of fighting on foreign soil, so they do the next best thing; allow foreigners (Americans) to die on their soil! This also gives them lots of American equipment and money, and requires much less spending for defense out of their pocket. Less spending, less taxes, and German and Japanese businesses can compete very favorably for the American market, using our subsidies to milk us "rich" suckers.

If we withdrew, would these smart, vigorous and dynamic people roll over and surrender to communists? Wouldn't they fight even more effectively than the poor, backward continued on page 9
