The man most responsible for the success of the Libertarian Party in 1980 was Ed Clark - our guest of honor and speaker at the Saturday evening banquet. MAYOR TO SPEAK

Those of you who read REASON magazine have probably enjoyed the wit of Byron Farwell ("What Can Be Said For Nine Digits? Zip!" REASON, July 1981). He has also had articles appear in HARPER'S, the NEW YORK TIMES and WASHINGTON POST and he has authored six history books. Mr. Farwell is mayor of Hillsboro, Virginia. He has a lot to say about how the Commonwealth treats the small towns of the state. That treatment is not consistent with all the folksy small town goodness the legislators are fond of referring to, according to Mr. Farwell. There should be much information for us to use in this year's Assembly campaigns from this talk. Mr. Byron Farwell's wit will undoubtedly make him a highlight of the convention.

PREMIER SHOWING OF OSCAR-WINNING FILM

The premier public presentation in Richmond of the 1981 Oscar award winning life story of Karl Hess will take place Saturday evening at 8:30 in the John Marshall Hotel Roof Garden Room. The film TOWARDS LIBERTY is about 30 minutes in length. This is one Academy Award winning film you aren't likely to see in your local theatre. We are honored to also present the man himself - Karl Hess - to address the convention and answer questions from the audience after the film.

Karl Hess was a speech writer for Barry Goldwater in 1964 and eventually became an honorary Black Panther before authoring the 1968 award winning article for PLAYBOY entitled "The Death of Politics". This article popularized the term "libertarian" and established much credibility for our philosophy. Karl Hess has also written the book COMMUNITY TECHNOLOGY. Karl lives in West Virginia and is a self-employed welder. He and his wife, Therese, who will be with him at our convention, have introduced a newsletter called SURVIVAL TOMORROW. "It's a survival newsletter but not one of the hunker-in-a-bunker sorts. Optimistic and skill-centered. Very middle class - and libertarian," says Karl.

Don't miss an opportunity to hear and meet a man who has surely earned a place in history - a man who has had a profound influence on libertarianism!

KEYNOTE ADDRESS FROM CHRIS HOCKER

The 1981 convention of the Libertarian Party of Virginia will get off to a great start with an address from **Chris Hocker**, publisher of *Libertarian Review*. Chris was National Coordinator of the Clark campaign and has been the National Director of the LP. His address will begin promptly at 9 o'clock, so don't be late for a great libertarian speech-maker's comments on our movement. Chris Hocker's wit has enlivened many LP meetings in the past - he gets the credit for many of the humorous speeches and one-liners delivered by other libertarians. FIERY ORATORY

Two hundred and six years ago, in Richmond, Virginia, one of the greatest speeches in history was delivered by Patrick Henry. His words are world famous, "Give me liberty, or give me death." Millions of Americans have heard the paragraph that contains that galvanizing quotation. You have the opportunity to hear and FEEL, not just his entire speech (you may be surprised to how much else he said) but also the comments and speeches that other famous Virginians made on that historic day.

The convention will go to St. Johns Church, the original location, for an inspiring, full-scale, costumed reenactment from the minutes of the Virginia Assembly meeting on March 20, 1775. Bruce Evoy will be Patrick Henry for this day.

Bruce Evoy is a professional actor from Toronto, Canada. He was present at the formation of the LP ten years ago in Denver and he is the current Director of Libertarian International. This event will fulfill a long sought ambition. He has become famous in libertarian circles for his inspiring delivery of Patrick Henry's "Liberty or Death" speech. This was one of the highlights of Alternative '80 - last year's nationwide telecasted campaign event.

This will be the inspirational high point of our convention - don't miss it!

FINDING BLACK LIBERTARIANS

Have you ever wondered why the most tolerant political group in America - the Libertarian Party - has so few minority members? Finally, someone is working on finding an answer to that question. Vernon Brown and David Bergland have started the Minority Education Enterprise (MEE). MEE is a division of Concepts of Liberty, a California non-profit corporation.

Vernon Brown is a black syndicated columnist. He is president of American News Syndicate, Inc. - president and founder of Harvest Life Insurance Co. - and Executive Director of MEE. He ran for U.S. Congress in 1972 (as a Republican) in California.

Vernon Brown will speak at our Saturday luncheon about the libertarian problem of recruiting minorities. This may be the most important information we hear at our convention, because no social movement in the U.S. can succeed without significant minority support. If we are going to succeed - and we have so much opportunity and so many ideas to offer minorities - then we better reach a turning point in our attitudes and ability to communicate with minority Americans. Your personal involvement in this effort is needed to make this day the turning point for the LP of Virginia.

LIBERTY & LOVE AS A WAY OF LIFE

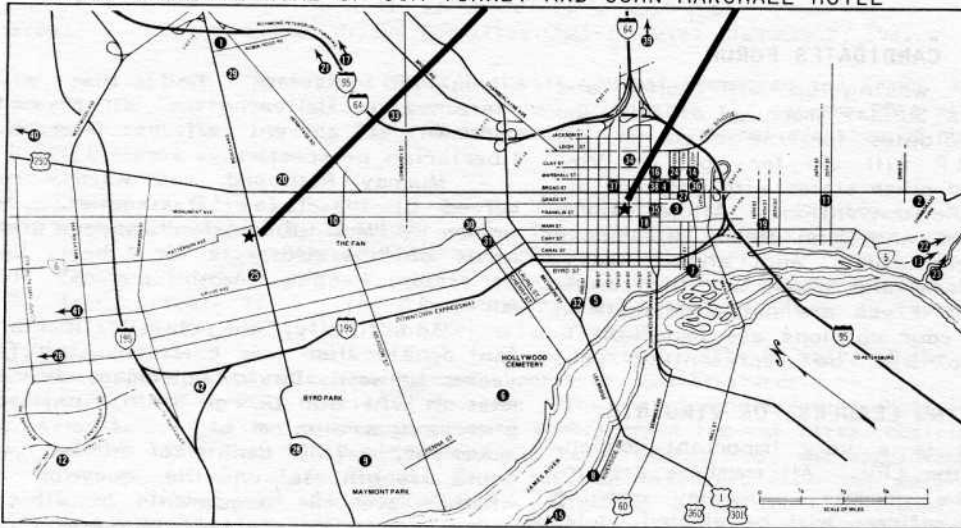

ROTHBARD-SMITH-FRIEDMAN-CHILDS

Sunday morning, starting at 9:00 there will be video tapes of the New York and Texas LP state conventions shown in the Lee Room (adjacent to Washington Room) for those not interested in the LP National Chair candidates or the Virginia LP business meeting. This is intended for the many out of state LP members that will be at our convention. Cost will be \$5.00 to those not paying the full \$50 registration.

Roy Childs keynote address to the New York convention will be first (20 minutes). As usual, Roy, editor of

Libertarian Review, had his wits sharp and delivered a first rate rundown of current affairs from the libertarian perspective.

Murray Rothbard was warmly received at the Texas LP banquet. No wonder - "Mr. Libertarian" made a great critic of "the prospects for Liberty Under the Reagan Administration" (45 minutes).

And finally, the classic libertarian debate that has been on-going for years between David Friedman, economist at VPI and George Smith, philosopher extraordinaire of the libertarian movement. This debate of almost two hours length is on the question of whether economic arguments or ethical arguments make the best foundation for the libertarian philosophy. Both men agree that both arguments should be used in the art of persuasion but the verbal gymnastics are great to watch - and you can learn many of the points-counterpoints to a fine array of arguments in favor of liberty.

The purpose of the Libertarian Party of Virginia is to legalize freedom by political action because we believe that no person, group of people or government has the right to initiate force against any other person, group or government; with "force" meaning fraud, extortion, stealing, threats against life or property as well as physical aggression.

Please read this report!

From: Scott Royce, Bylaws Committee Chair; Date: January 2, 1981

Pursuant to instructions from the State Central Committee and former Party Chairperson Jim Crowe, the Bylaws Committee has considered the current LPVA structure and procedures outlined in the Party Constitution. We recommend adoption of the following Constitutional amendments:

1. Revise Article I, Section 1 of the Constitution as distributed to implement the amendment adopted by the 1979 convention regarding the Party name. Amend the same section by adding "(hereinafter referred to as 'the Party')." Amend subsequent sections as necessary to eliminate references to "the Virginia Libertarian Party."
2. Amend Article II, Section 1 by striking "and who shall adhere to those principles in all matters affecting the Libertarian Party."
3. Amend Article III, Section 1 to read as follows: "The officers of the party shall be a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Treasurer."
4. Amend Article III, Section 3 to read: "The Chairperson's duties shall include, but not be limited to, acting as primary spokesperson for the Party, chairing meetings of the State Central Committee and all Party conventions, and appointing, with the consent of the State Central Committee, an Executive Director, ~~Parliamentarian~~, Legal Adviser, and all coordinators of standing and ad hoc committees. The Chairperson shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned by the State Central Committee."
5. Amend Article III, Section 4 to read: "The Vice Chairperson shall chair meetings of the State Central Committee and all Party conventions in the absence of the Chairperson, and shall chair a standing committee. Should the office of Chairperson become vacant for any reason, the Vice Chairperson shall assume the Chair. The Vice Chairperson shall also carry out such other duties as may be assigned by the State Central Committee."
6. Amend Article III, Section 5 to read as follows: "The Secretary shall take and distribute minutes of all State Central Committee meetings and of all Party conventions. In addition, the Secretary shall be responsible for official Party correspondence as required and, with the Membership Committee Chairperson, for insuring the accuracy and completeness of all Party membership and mailing lists. The Secretary shall also carry out such other duties as may be assigned by the State Central Committee."
7. Amend Article III, Section 6 to read: "The Treasurer of the Party shall establish and maintain all Party bank accounts and manage all Party investments, collect and disburse Party funds at the direction of the State Central Committee, keep records and receipts for all such transactions, and prepare and file any Party financial reports required under Virginia and federal law. The Treasurer shall also prepare and distribute a written financial report at each meeting of the State Central Committee and at all Party conventions, and shall perform such other duties of a fiduciary nature as the State Central Committee may assign."
8. Amend Article III, Section 7 to read: "Any officer of the Party may be removed from office upon a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the members of the State Central Committee. Members of the State Central Committee must be given written notice at least seven days in advance of a meeting that such a motion will be presented."
9. Amend Article III, Section 8 to read: "Any vacancy in an elected Party office, except that of Chairperson, shall be filled by the State Central Committee. Notice of such vacancy must be provided in writing to all members of the State Central Committee at least seven (7) days in advance of a meeting at which any such vote is to be taken. An affirmative vote by two thirds (2/3) of the State Central Committee shall be required to fill such vacancy."
10. Amend Article IV, Section 1, A to read: "Voting members of the State Central Committee shall be the officers of the Party elected by the preceding Regular Convention, or their successors, the Chairperson of the Party in each Congressional District of the Commonwealth, and the Coordinators of standing committees. Any

member of the State Central Committee may proxy his or her vote to any member of the Party, provided that such proxy is in writing and dated. No person may cast more than one vote. Persons holding more than one voting State Central Committee position shall be entitled to one vote only."

11. Amend Article IV, Section 1, B to read: "Meetings of the State Central Committee shall be held at least four (4) times in each calendar year. The time and place of the next regular meeting shall be determined by the State Central Committee at its previous meeting. Additional meetings may be called by the Chairperson at his or her discretion. Notice of all State Central Committee meetings shall be given in writing to all State Central Committee members at least seven (7) days in advance. Meetings of the State Central Committee shall be open to all members of the Party."
12. Amend Article IV, Section 1, C (3) to read: "removal, by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the State Central Committee membership, of the Party's endorsement of any candidate for statewide office and, in announcement, delineation of the reasons therefor;"
13. Amend Article IV, Section 1, C (4) by striking the word "to."
14. Amend Article IV, Section 1, C (5) to read "adopt and amend Bylaws to this Constitution by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the State Central Committee membership."
15. Add a new Article IV, Section 1, D: "A quorum to conduct business at any meeting of the State Central Committee shall be a majority of its voting members or their proxies." (3rd?)
16. Amend Article IV, Section 2, A to read: "Each District Committee shall consist of a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Treasurer whose duties shall parallel those outlined for state officers in Article III above except that the District Chairperson shall act as primary spokesperson only for his or her own District organization. In addition to these officers, each District Committee shall include up to two persons chosen by each city and county Party organization in the District."
17. Amend Article IV, Section 2, B to read: "Whenever ten (10) or more Party members in a district which lacks a District Committee shall petition the State Central Committee, the Party Chairperson shall call a District convention. The business of the District convention shall include election of District officers and adoption of District Committee Bylaws, which shall be submitted to the next meeting of the State Central Committee for approval. All Party members known to reside within a District shall be notified by the Party Secretary of such convention and its requirements at least seven (7) days in advance in writing. Only District residents who are members of the Party shall be eligible to vote at such conventions."
