Registration & Information Area

Convention Registration will be located in the Columbia C Room on the Ballroom Level and will be opened during the following hours:

This will be the central area and location to purchase tickets for all events. An information table will be found there throughout the convention.

One Day / Two Day Passes

If you purchased a one day or two day pass you are entitled to attend all of the speaker functions of that day. Please pick up your folder and program booklet at the registration desk.

If you care to listen to a speaker at any breakfast function, but do not wish to purchase the breakfast, please purchase a Speaker Ticket and present this at the door. Seating will begin at 8:15 a.m. each morning and all seats are on the first-come, first-serve basis. \$10 each.

In the Hotel

Park Promenade

Serves Breakfast, lunch as well as dinners at moderate prices. This is the best bet for all convention goers who want to return quickly to the floor action.

Spy's Eye Bar

The classic hotel bar which provides areas for late evening discussions, as well as a pool table. The place to go to quench your thirst.

Capitol View Club

This fifteenth floor restaurant has a view of the Capitol building which has long made it one of the most prestigious eating spots in Washington. Expensive.

Near the Hotel

Senators Restaurant

A moderately priced spot, with a sportsmen theme located directly across the street from the Hyatt. Wide variety of meals for both lunch and dinner. (location #1 on map)

New York Deli and Liquor Store

An inexpensive sandwich shop located on the second floor of a well supplied liquor store. Quick service available and a few tables. (location #2 on map)

Tiber Creek Pub

A cozy Pub serving breakfast, lunch and dinner, located on the left hand side of E St, halfway between New Jersey and North Capitol. Expensive, but worth one visit during the convention. (location #3 on map)

Washington Court Hotel

The Signature Room Restaurant offers breakfast, lunch and dinner in an attractive setting. The prices are expensive, as is the hotel. Happy Hours. (location #4 on map)

Kelly's Irish Times

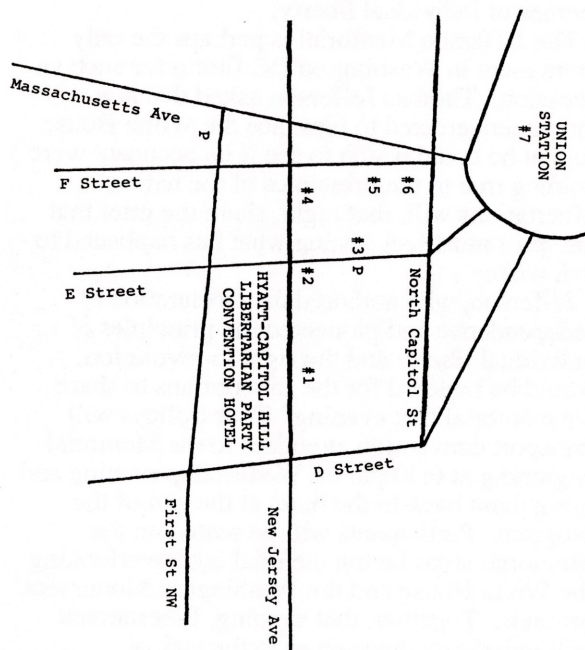
A great place to go for lunches or dinners if you enjoy an old style Irish Pub. Prices are moderate. Great collection of Irish beers. (location #5 on map)

The Dubliner

One of the most popular Irish pubs in DC. This spot sees crowds of Irish Folk Music fans gathering each evening. Irish bands featured nightly. Lunch and dinner available. Expensive. (location #6 on map)

Union Station

The bottom floor of Union Station features a huge food court with many varieties of food. Inexpensive for both lunch and dinner. 43 different fast food stations. Located about two blocks from the Hyatt. There are also 9 movie theaters and a large shopping mall. (location #7 on map)



An Evening at the Jefferson Memorial

Over two years ago, the organizers of the 1996 Libertarian Party National Convention conceived of the idea of using the Jefferson Memorial as the site of the opening ceremonies of this convention. It took a number of meetings with the National Park Service and a number of experiences filing legal applications and permits, but the evening of July 3, 1996 will see hundreds of libertarians assembling on the steps of the Jefferson Memorial to take part in a historic celebration of individual liberty in song and words as the 1996 Libertarian Party Presidential Nominating Convention opens.

The program will consist of two hours of music and quotations delivered by major activists in the Libertarian movement over the past 30 years, including a number of surprise appearances. The music will span a wide time period and stress themes of individual liberty.

The Jefferson Memorial is perhaps the only monument in Washington DC fitting for such an occasion. Thomas Jefferson asked that any monument erected to him face the White House so that he could watch to see if its occupant were holding true to the principles of the nation. Libertarians will, that night, share the grief that his spirit must feel seeing what has happened to that wish.

Jefferson, who authored the Declaration of Independence and pioneered the principles of individual liberty and the right to revolution, would be honored for the Libertarians to share his memorial that evening. Tour trolleys will transport convention attendees to the Memorial beginning at 6:30 pm on Wednesday evening and bring them back to the hotel at the end of the program. Participants will be seated on the Memorial steps facing the tidal lake overlooking the White House and the Washington Monument grounds. Together, that evening, Libertarians will rededicate themselves to the task of restoring liberty to this nation.

Special Events

Council of State Chairs

The Council of State Chairs will be holding a Pre-Convention Leadership Conference. This two day event will focus on leadership skills needed for operation of effective affiliate party groups. Seminars will be held on such topics as Effective Communications, The FEC, The IRS and Fund Raising. The Chairs of the LP State affiliates will also be meeting during this two day activity.

Guzzetta Candidate Training

On Tuesday and Wednesday political candidate training seminars will be held at the Hyatt-Capitol Hill. The two day "Sal Guzzetta National Campaign Institute" conducts in depth candidate training and will cover all basic aspects of campaigning including general evaluation, election regulations, time management, budget planning and fund raising. The special seminar was presented at the 1993 Salt Lake City Convention and was universally acclaimed by all attendees.

Mount Vernon / Gunston Hall Tour

Early arrivals to the convention will be able to participate in a bus tour to the mansion homes of revolutionary war leaders George Washington and George Mason. The tour on Wednesday will leave the hotel for a busy day in historical Northern Virginia

College Libertarian Workshop

On Thursday, Friday and Saturday there will be a special workshop session for libertarian college activists. Campus libertarians from all over the US will be participating in a series of discussions on organizing methods. In addition, they will participate in the Friday Speaker series which will feature educational reviews of major political issues.

LP Anniversary Party

The Libertarian Party was conceived during a meeting in the living room of David Nolan in Denver, Colorado on August 15th, 1971. This year marks the 25th anniversary of that meeting. On Friday evening in the Columbia Room, we will celebrate the birth of the Party with a special "visit" to Dave Nolan's Living room to relive those early days and explore the roots of the Libertarian Movement.

Liberty Pledge Luncheon

One of the most effective sources of revenue for the LP is the Liberty Pledge Program. Founded back in 1987, the program has grown to involve more than 1000 individuals who give a regular monthly contribution to the party. Most of the participants use a automatic credit card method which guarantees a dependable flow of funds to the National office. Pledge Program Members attending the National Convention are invited to a luncheon on Friday afternoon in their honor.

Presidential Awards Banquet

This convention's Saturday banquet is being planned to be the most memorable in the history of the Party. Attendees will be entertained by a string quartet during and after dinner. The evening will focus on recognition of the individuals who have contributed most in the 25 year history of the Party. A variety of awards will be given during the event including presentation of the Samuel Adams, Thomas Paine and Thomas Jefferson awards for distinguished service will also occur as well as awards for outstanding candidates, campaigns and state party organizations. The Presidential and Vice Presidential nominees kick off their 1996 national campaign.

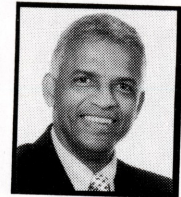

His keynote speech will have as its general theme a review of the predictions, warnings, and solutions posed by LP presidential candidates from Hospers to Marrou. Mr. Hornberger will remind the voters how support of these campaigns could have avoided many of the crises and problems now generally acknowledged to be the result of "big government" and ask that, to avoid being fooled again, they now support the Libertarian Party and its candidates.

Mr. Hornberger, founder and current president of a national libertarian foundation, is the coeditor of two books, "The Dangers of Socialized Medicine" and "The Case for Free Trade and Open Immigration." Born and raised in Texas, he received his BA in economics from the University of Texas. He was a trial attorney for 12 years and was an adjunct professor of law and economics at the Univ. of Dallas. From 1987 to 1989, he was director of programs for The Foundation for Economic Education, Irvington-on-Hudson, NY. Twice he served on the Libertarian Party Platform Committee and had lectured on libertarianism on three continents.

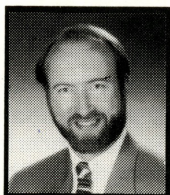
In 1991, a soft spoken data security consultant named Philip Zimmermann in Boulder Colorado created a powerful encryption program called "Pretty Good Privacy" (PGP). After hearing that the US Congress was considering banning such programs, Zimmermann decided to give it away for free over the internet. The program, which is almost impossible to decode, became a boon for individuals and businesses seeking to protect the privacy of their E-Mail transmissions. Human rights groups and protesters in foreign nations found it invaluable to their activities. However the Federal government took a very different view of his action. Immediately, the Assistant US Attorney General was ordered by the Justice Department to gather a grand jury to consider whether Phil Zimmermann should be charged with violating a vague Federal weapons export law that includes a section on "unlicensed export of encryption software".

The Zimmermann case became a rallying point for defenders of privacy rights and opponents of growing government interference in computer transmissions. The Clinton Administration meanwhile pressed forward with the "clipper chip" and other censorship of E-Mail systems. After three years of legal intimidation, the Justice department, in January 1996, dropped its case and decided to not indict Zimmermann. Mr. Zimmermann will receive the "Champions of Liberty" Award at the LP Banquet on Saturday night and tell about his three year battle., Zimmermann will also participate in a two hour seminar on Computer Privacy on Saturday afternoon at the convention. All those interested in his struggle, computer privacy and in the PGP software will be able to attend this seminar as part of the convention package.
