1982 State Convention

ACTIVISM IN THE 80's

The 1982 State Convention of the Libertarian Party of Virginia will be held August 8 in Richmond, Virginia. This year's convention is not intended to be a media event or forum for debating issues. This year we will focus on being effective campaigners and activists for libertarian ideas.

The convention will be held at Tuesday's Restaurant, on the corner of West Cary St., and Pine St., in central Richmond (see map). There will be no pre-registration but a \$6.00 charge per person will be collected at the door. There is no charge for attending the business meeting.

The State business meeting is expected to be brief. There are constitutional amendments possible — but none has stirred controversy. After the business meeting there should be ample time for lunch at Tuesday's. A sampling of menu items is listed here to give an idea of what to expect.

The highlight of the day will probably be the **Dr. Dallas Cooley** seminar on fundraising. As we all know, money is the mother's milk of politics and we sure need more of it to grow into an effective state party. Dallas has been a leader in the Virginia party and past Treasurer of the National LP. He has also been an effective fund-raiser and is currently the major force

behind a series of weekend seminars on fund raising being conducted across the country.

Most members of the Virginia LP have never heard of **Sandy Burns**, but that will all change very soon. She recently resigned as LP National Committee Region 11 (Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky) representative to move to Virginia. She has become known in libertarian circles for her abilities to get media attention. She was on the LP/10 workshop panel, "Media Development" last year. She will present to us a short course in how to get to know the media and how to provide them with the materials to get good coverage.

Video-taped presentations will be interspersed throughout the day starting with **Emil Franci** on Building Membership. Emil is on the LP NatCom and is National LP Membership Chairman. This was recorded at the California LP convention in February 1982. Emil is a very entertaining speaker but he is also full of good ideas on promoting membership.


Psychology. The biggest success was John Northrup's acceptance speech for the New York LP gubernatorial candidacy.
