SAVADEL ANNOUNCES FOR STATE SENATE; CALLS FOR REPEAL  
OF DRUG LAWS AND RELIEF FOR THE TAXPAYER.

Richard Savadel, a computer systems engineer from Glenwood Landing, tonight announced that he will be running for State Senate from the 5th district on the Free Libertarian Line. Speaking before the executive committee of the Nassau Libertarian Club Mr. Savadel called for the repeal of all laws against the private use of drugs. He said that prohibition had been a national disgrace which resulted in criminals amassing untold wealth. "Again we see legislators piously passing laws to regulate private morals with the result that criminals are again amassing fortunes."

When asked about the growing burden of taxation on the individual Mr. Savadel replied: "Taxation is theft. It is a crime for one individual to forcibly take money from another. It is equally immoral for a group, whether or not it calls itself a government, to forcibly take money from an individual. The state income tax and sales tax must be abolished. The practice of penalizing a property owner for improving his property by raising his taxes must be eliminated.

In 1972, when Mr. Savadel ran for State Senate he said he was "shocked at the number of special interest groups which had their hands out reaching for their neighbors money through taxes. I will fight for only one special interest--the individual taxpayer."
