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RIGHT VS. LEFT

Many are left confused when trying to define the boundaries of left vs right. They have no theory to help them in bridging this ideological divide. Jared (@EndDemocracy) has written <u>the first chapter of his book on politics about</u> <u>this divide</u> and I want to bring it to everyone's attention. Allow me to summarize

When trying to define right and left, many try to rely on the conservative and progressive divide. The issue with this is that it misses what conservative is and relegates those on the right to purely reactionaries that react to whatever the left does. The true definition of a conservative can be written about in a future article. The false definition is to try to maintain the status quo. There simply is not a fully rightwing party in America to point to.

The true divide between left and right is between equality and hierarchy. Many egalitarian political systems try to enforce this equality through an artificial hierarchy and some others wish to provide the order and safety of a natural hierarchy with an artificial one. The former are open about their egalitarian agendas, while the latter is egalitarian with respect to their own systems. The former is the Soviet system that tried to create a new, Soviet man. The latter treat their artificial hierarchy as the same as a natural one. Power exudes from a natural hierarchy, but an artificial one will have to use power to exert itself over people.

News around FLPNM (Free Libertarian Party of New Mexico)

History and Future of the Free Libertarian Party of New Mexico

The FLPNM really started with the organization of the MIses Caucus in New Mexico in early 2022, which found itself in conflict with the leadership of the Libertarian Party of New Mexico (LPNM). This conflict escalated when the LPNM held a convention on July 12, in which they amended their bylaws to allow disaffiliation by vote of the board, rather than requiring a vote of members

in convention. The board then used this new power to formally disaffiliate from the national LP in August, and the national LP quickly reciprocated. In disaffiliating, the LPNM lost the right to send delegates to national conventions, and many other rights and perquisites as well.

This left the door open for the Mises Caucus to organize a new affiliate of the national LP, which would be open to both Mises Caucus and other libertarians. This was done in an organizing meeting on October 29th, 2022, which created the Free Libertarian Party of New Mexico (FLPNM). In this meeting, we approved new bylaws and elected a skeleton board of directors. Nominees of the LPNM were rejected. Elected were myself to chairman, Mike Blessing to vice-chair, Rudolf Kohn to secretary and Tyler Askin to treasurer. In subsequent board meetings, directors were elected to the vacant board seats and projects begun in the areas of membership, outreach, legislation and lobbying, communications and IT infrastructure, fundraising, county affiliates, and campaign development. To further our relationship with the national party, I joined their Bylaws Committee and Vice-Chairman Blessing joined their Ballot Access Committee.

Most recently, FLPNM became a registered Political Committee and established a treasury. A Founder's Party was held on December 11, and was a well-attended and joyous event.

Milestones in the future will be our first annual convention on March 4th, 2023 and the visit of the Libertarian National Committee (the board of directors of the national party) the following weekend. All our director positions will be up for election, and there will be some needed amendments to make to our bylaws. Plans are being made to have a well-organized and fun event on both weekends, and to make the LNC welcome in their first visit to New Mexico since the LPNM was affiliated decades ago.

Further out, we are looking to become a political party (as opposed to a political committee) in New Mexico. This will require about 3600 valid signatures on a petition. The petitioning process is postponed pending the resolution of a dispute between the national LP and LPNM concerning trademark.

We plan to run two or three candidates in 2023, two for city council in Albuquerque, and possibly a third in Santa Fe. Since these are non-partisan races, we can run these candidates even if our political party status is not yet official. Make sure you visit your website flpnm.org.

As Libertarians, we seek a world of liberty: a world in which all individuals are sovereign over their own lives and are not forced to sacrifice their values for the benefit of others.



People should not be forced to sacrifice their lives and property for the benefit of others.


Libertarians reject the notion that groups have inherent rights. We support the rights of the smallest minority, the individual.

As seen in <u>#TwitterFiles</u>, a small team moderating content at scale easily falls prey to ideological capture. That's why new Twitter should abandon the policy of "freedom of speech, but not freedom of reach." Moderating lawful speech will always be a game of selective enforcement.

To be clear, I'm not against moderation generally; I'm just against most moderation of noncriminal activity on Twitter (w/ exceptions like spam, targeted harassment). Were this a religious site, then, sure, moderate aggressively. But Twitter's mission is sharing without barriers.

A big problem right now is that new Twitter is (justifiably) criticizing old Twitter while not recognizing that the stated policy "but not freedom of reach" makes them vulnerable to the same errors. They can make Twitter what they want, but they should be honest about what it is.


Historical Take
