# LPNY Convention '99 Set For Holtsville, Long Island

The 1999 LPNY State Convention is set for Saturday and Sunday, April 24 and 25 in Holtsville, LI. The featured speakers will include Roy Innis from the Congress of Racial Equality, Steve Dasbach, former Chair and current Director of the national LP, David Nolan, one of the founders of the Libertarian

Party, Social Security expert Michael Tanner of the Cato Institute, and Robert James Bidinotto from Institute of Objectivist Studies.

The convention will be at the Best Western MacArthur Hotel, 1730 North Ocean Avenue in Holtsville. It's located at exit 63 off the LIE.

The cost is \$99.99 for the complete package including lunch & dinner on Saturday and all speakers, \$79 for speakers and 1 meal, \$49 for speakers only. All prices are good through April 10. After that add \$10 per package.



#### Change to Bylaws Proposed

The following changes have been proposed to LPNY's bylaws. These changes will be debated and voted on at the annual convention in Holtsville on April 24 and 25.

Article 8, Endorsements, in 1998 had added to it paragraph E:

"No candidate shall appear on the Libertarian Party line for any political office in New York State who is not a member in good standing of the Libertarian Party of New York."

Proposal 1 changes this to read:

"No candidate shall appear on the Libertarian Party line for any political office in New York State who does not subscribe to the Principles and Objectives of the Libertarian Party of New York."

Proposal 2 changes it to read:

"No candidate shall appear on the Libertarian Party line for any political office in New York State who has not certified in writing, 'I do not believe in or advocate the initiation of force to achieve political or social goals."

The reason for either of these changes is to allow greater flexibility of the state and county LPs in choosing candidates, who may not want to belong to the national AND state parties, as now required by paragraph E with the Unified Membership Plan in force.
