- Jeff P notes that CivilCRM is mislabeled as "State Member Dues"

- Andrew C notes that he has some hotel cost reimbursements pending, and that Soaring Eagle has yet to issue the final invoice for the convention
- Paul $V$ requests a breakdown of the streams of income from the convention; Norm P agrees to tabulate

- Greg S notes that Emily is prepared to step down; Greg is willing to step up if approved

- Greg $S$ notes that this may be best saved until new committee nomination process discussed
- Tim Y moves to amend agenda to add these nominations immediately after new committee selection process discussed

- Proposed change in subcommittee selection process per Tim Y's video (nominate a chair at LEC meeting 1, allow chair to select preferred subcommittee members, then approve these along with any additional nominees at the next LEC meeting)
- Joe B RFI: how does current process work?
- Tim Y: Currently a call is issued, and prospects email the LEC, then a chair is selected from among those elected to committee
- Brian E notes that this process effectively establishes a committee of 1 for a month, or else creates an absence of a committee for a month; recommend instead appointing a committee in one meeting, then approving any additional members requested by the chair at the next meeting (if proposed)
- Tim Y notes that there is typically no major time constraint on committees, so a month's delay is unlikely to cause a problem
- Andrew C notes his support, and contends that properly structuring motions can avert the possibility of the existence of a committee of 1
- Proposal accepted without objection
- Legislative Committee
- Tim Y notes that committee has historically consisted of 2-5 members, and occasionally appears on MI House floor to speak on behalf of LPM for or against various bills. This could expand to become an information source for the LPM membership
- No nominee forthcoming; will appear on next month's agenda Social Media Committee/Communications Director
- Tim Y contends that the last Social Media Committee did not perform as desired due to personal clashes, lack of quorum, and other issues. Would like to create the role of Communications Director, with Connor N expressing an interest in serving in this position
- Connor N contends that the previous committee was in fact productive, though with some administrative challenges due to the issues noted by Tim
- Would like to pivot toward a greater role than simply conducting social media work
- Presents proposed organizational chart, consisting of input parties and outputs from Comm Director to various committee members
- Will leverage CiviCRM media contact data to gain maximum possible earned media
- Joe B agrees that our organization should have a strategic communication policy, as this is critical to any business. The Communications Director should commit fully to setting out strong policies and procedures so each member of the committee does not need to individually judge every decision. Would like our party to take a neutral position toward which media outlets it pursues, and would like to avoid trying to fund the creation of new media sources.
- Connor N notes that the recent NH issue demonstrates that solid policies are necessary (i.e. chair can request/require removal of items not in line with party aims). One of the first tasks as Comm Director will be the creation of a temporary committee to establish such procedures.
- Brian E notes that many tasks noted in the org chart appear to be items presently delegated to the chair, and think this should potentially stand as an elected position by party membership
- Connor N notes that the elected position idea was proposed but failed in 2021 bylaws committee
- Brian E moves to table to next month
- Tim Y requests that Connor N provide a more detailed policy for this position for consideration at next month's LEC meeting
- Joe B 2nds

## Chair Report for the August 2021 meeting

Since our last meeting, a lot of my focus has been dedicated to personal contact with individuals who have expressed some level of interest in being a part of the legislative committee.
$\checkmark$ I created an article and a video, that can be found on YouTube, with my appeal to join the legislative committee.
$\checkmark$ I had ongoing discussions with Steven Fox, Adam Childress and Stephanie Dunn, who have all indicated they want to be involved with the new committee. I have also personally reached out to a few others.
$\checkmark$ Since July $11^{\text {th }}$, 5 letters have gone out to new members and ongoing discussion has occurred with one of those who recently joined. He is in my county and ready to plug into the Oakland affiliate but was unable to attend our July $21^{\text {st }}$ meeting. Others were friended on Facebook and, in some cases, got involved in our new FB discussion group.
$\checkmark$ I added an event to our LPM state page to generate interest in the upcoming Region 3 training in Indianapolis, October $16^{\text {th }}$ and 17th. I got data from Sam Goldstein that indicated that we only had one sign up from our state, before I published and shared the FB event, and there were states not in the region (namely Illinois and Missouri) that had more attending than we have. Please take the initiative to invite those who you know will likely run in 2022 or are officers in their local affiliate. If you go to the state page and click on events, you will see one there with all the details. Since it seems there is limited interest, I didn't continue my effort to search out van rentals or continue discussion, in today's meeting, about subsidizing the trip for participants.
$\checkmark$ I finished and sent a letter to the Bureau of Elections to update them on our new officer roster. So you all have been named in order to help the state identify who the extremists are.
$\checkmark$ On July $33^{\text {st }}$, the database sent out an automatic email erroneously telling many members that their membership had lapsed. All were due to multiple database entries for the same person and most were the result of them switching from annual to lifetime LPM memberships (not national). The email looked as if it was coming from Jeff Pittel. I responded to all who messaged us confused about the error and explained what occurred. Later that day, Jeff researched all who had received this email and sent a message to everyone informing them they could disregard it.

I knew the period between this meeting and the previous one would be a real test for me since it is the busy season at my restaurant and we have not been able to hire help, due to the worker shortage. But I am pleased to say I didn't let it hinder me from handing tasks for this new role. At the same time, I recognize there was more that could have been done towards the goals I laid out for this party. As we approach the fall, I will stay committed to not just fulfilling my duties as Chair but to advancement of liberty in Michigan. Thanks for understanding my current situation and for giving me grace if I have failed to follow-up on anything for which you have tried to contact me.

Below is my report as outgoing Convention Committee Chair.
The 2021 LPMI Convention occurred on June 25-27, and by all accounts was a huge success. I would like to sincerely thank all of the members of the convention committee: Connor Nepomuceno, Dan Ziemba, Ben Boren and Ryan Roberts. They all did great work to help prepare for and execute the event, and it wouldn't have been the success that it was without all of their help. Also, the "Shoot with Spike" event on Friday night was initiated by James Peace, and he did most of the work to identify a venue and initiate discussions with them to hold the event.

Financially, the event was a huge success. The overall total cost was $\$ 18,300.37$, while the total income for the event was $\$ 25,185.00$, giving a profit of $\$ 6,884.63$ for the LPMI! We had approximately $25-30$ people attend the "Shoot with Spike" event on Friday night. For Saturday, we sold 123 lunches, and 123 dinners for the Liberty Fest Banquet. On Sunday, we had 104 people pay for attendance, along with 90 breakfast sales, and 91 lunch sales.

We had great speeches and presentations from all of our guests, including an unplanned Q+A session by Justin Amash on Sunday afternoon, who graciously stepped in to fill in for Magnus Panvidya who backed out due to some unfortunate circumstances at the last minute.

The convention committee is planning to hold a follow up meeting to assess Lessons Learned and document those to pass on to future convention committees for their benefit. If possible to receive access to detailed information about the income, I would also like to make a more detailed assessment of the expense vs income for each part of the event to further support successful planning and execution in the future.

## Tom Arnold's proposed bylaw change:

Note: the part in quotes is the added language.
Purpose: We need more time to run.
The Party shall hold a regular convention every two years, at a time and place selected by the National Committee. Regular conventions shall be held sometime during the period of July of an odd-numbered year through August of an even-numbered year, "except for Presidential, Vice Presidential nominating conventions which shall be held 12 to 9 months prior to the presidential election". All business required to be conducted at regular conventions shall be conducted at regular conventions only.

Whereas the Libertarian Party of Michigan believes that all people at all times in all places, as a fact of their existence, are endowed with fundamental inalienable human rights, including but not limited to:

The right of self-determination in what steps, if any, are appropriate to take in mask wearing, social distancing, or otherwise equipping, preparing, or conducting oneself to avoid contracting or spreading communicable diseases;

The right of absolute bodily autonomy and self-determination in what medical treatments, if any, are appropriate for the avoidance or amelioration of communicable diseases;

The right to assemble for any peaceable purpose including commerce and public or private social gatherings;

The right to provide venues for said assemblies and of independent determination of entry requirements to said venues without coercion from government mandates instituted via Public Health Code, Legislation, Executive Order, or other decree;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Libertarian Party of Michigan:

Opposes any and all mandates requiring the wearing of masks originating from any level of government;
Opposes any and all mandates requiring vaccination originating from any level of government;

Opposes any and all restrictions on the aforementioned right of peaceable assembly originating from any level of government;

Opposes any and all restrictions on the aforementioned right of venue provision including so-called "vaccine passports;"

Urges all people and the businesses they operate to exercise their above inalienable rights in peaceful opposition to any and all restrictions on these rights.
