Bastiat's Sophisms Part 2

Efficiency

All people in pursuing their occupations make it their business to increase the ratio of result to effort, namely to work more efficiently, to produce more with less effort and resources.

Protectionist government policies reverse this trend by increasing the ratio of effort to result. They do this by erecting obstacles to labor or resources, be they in the form of tariffs, taxes, duties, licenses, restrictions on labor, etc. The economy must expend more labor and resources to achieve the same effect it would have if it were not for the obstacles. Bastiat calls this *Sisyphism* after Sisyphus, who was condemned to roll a burden continually uphill, whereupon it fell downhill again.

The justification put forward by all advocates for protectionism is that the artificially erected obstacles provide jobs for people. Indeed they do - witness the enormous number of civil servants in this country - but only at the cost of diverting labor from productive to unproductive uses. Labor, like energy, is not destroyed but is merely displaced into different areas. Unfortunately, these new forms of labor do not increase the supply of goods and services of a nation but diminish it. Government jobs are based on obstacles (overseeing regulations, collecting taxes, etc.) created by the government to provide *jobs* to those who would otherwise have to seek productive employment. If reformers point out the obstacles which government policies have unnecessarily set up, the defense is always made that those obstacles provide many people with jobs.

Bastiat points out that it is not labor itself, but consumption that is the goal; unproductive labor is a dead loss. In failing to make this distinction, protectionists confuse the means with the end and be-

lieve that because more people are working, the economy is improved. Today we see many women working who would rather stay home with their children full time, but their families' tax burden is so great they must work to pay it. It is true that this makes for high employment and an elevated GDP. However, massive social costs - less supervision and family contact for children - have resulted from the increased presence of women in the work force.

To illustrate the absurdity of protectionist measures restricting abundance in the interests of providing artificial jobs, Bastiat has conceived a delightful spoof: a petition to the government from the

candlemakers for special relief against the unfair competition of the sun. It seems its bounty is flooding the country and undercutting their prices. The candlemakers require that all windows and other openings in buildings be shut against the intruder so as to protect their trade, and people not be allowed to go out of doors during the day.

In Ayn Rand's <u>Anthem</u>, a similar situation occurs. The hero has discovered lighting by electricity and presents it to the elders, confident that they will eagerly accept the labor- saving device. But he finds that their goal is not to have abundance of lighting but to give candlemaking employment to people who might *otherwise* have too much free time in which to think.

Growth of the State

Bastiat characterized the state as being like an individual, tending to expand in proportion to its means of existence and habitually living beyond its means. Thus the people must continue to support it and its excesses. If the populace cannot limit the state's growth by clearly perceiving its dangers, they will lose both freedom and wealth. But those who make their living by state employment are cunning and offer many inducements.

If a nation is open-handed, the government offers to cure all the ills of mankind. It promises to restore commerce, make agriculture prosperous, expand industry, encourage arts and letters, wipe out poverty, etc., etc. All that is needed is to create some new government agencies and to pay a few more bureaucrats. In a word, the tactic consists in initiating, in the guise of actual services, what are nothing but restrictions; thereafter the nation pays ... for being disserved. Governments, assuming gigantic proportions, end by absorbing half of the national income.

Command Economies

Bastiat was strikingly prescient in foreseeing the problems that command economies would face, although they were not in existence in his day. He did this by analyzing the concepts inherent in theories of socialism and taking them to their logical conclusions. The influence of Adam Smith, one of the three great economists whom Bastiat studied (the others being Jean-Baptiste Say and David Ricardo) can be seen in his characterization of the economy of the city of Paris and his forecasting of the disaster of central planning:

How does each succeeding day manage to bring to this gigantic market just what is necessary - neither too much nor too little? What, then, is the resourceful and secret power that governs the amazing regularity of such complicated movements? That power is an *absolute principle*, the principle of free exchange. Where would you be, inhabitants of Paris, if some cabinet minister

decided to substitute for that power contrivances of his own invention, however superior we might suppose them to be; if he proposed to subject this prodigious mechanism to his supreme direction, to take control of all of it into his own hands, to determine by whom, where, how, and under what conditions everything should be produced, transported, exchanged, and consumed? ... The arbitrary *intervention* of the government would infinitely multiply suffering and spread among all of you the ills that now affect only a small number of your fellow citizens.

To the assumption, implicit in socialism, that the government can know everything and plan for everything in an individual's life better than he can himself, Bastiat retorts that there is no government apart from the people themselves. "Nothing is more senseless than to base so many expectations on the state, that is, to assume the existence of collective wisdom and foresight after taking for granted the existence of individual imbecility and improvidence."


Bastiat's writings have influenced many and will deserve to be read as long as the siren call of socialism is heeded by those who have not examined its consequences in detail.

Why does the State kill people who kill people to teach people not to kill people?

The Independent Institute on S(I)S

The Independent Institute at 100 Swan Way in Oakland sponsored a Policy Forum titled "Private Solutions for the Social Security Crisis?". Speakers included Professor Alan J. Auerbach (UC Berkeley), Preston Martin (Former Vice-Chair Federal Reserve Board), and Michael Tanner (CATO Institute & Co-author "A New Deal for Social Security") Michael Tanner spoke first explaining that there is no Trust Fund (just government IOU's) and that without massive reform our children could be paying up to 40% SSI taxes. His book outlines a concrete method to privatize Social (In)Security. While his proposals may not appeal to the more radical libertarians it is doable and infinitely better than what we currently have. He calls it, "Radical change, conservative implementation." Major point; "Everyday we wait, the problem gets worse and the solution will be more painful." Prof. Auerbach, in classic leftist tradition, minimized the problem and feels moving S(I)S into the general revenue, raising the retirement age and increasing taxes would suffice. He said, "If we privatize and the market fails we (read government) won't let people starve on the street." I pointed out that prior to S(I)S families, Fraternal Orders and Mutual Aid Societies did the job for less illustrating Harry Browne's position that; "Government cripples you then hands you a crutch and says 'See, you couldn't walk without me'." It was obvious that Mr. Martin spent 40 years in government service because after listening to him for 20 minutes I couldn't figure out what the hell he said except "pester your Congressman for incremental change." I don't think you can cross a chasm in two small leaps. The Independent Institute is a non-political (they aren't Republicans or Democrats), professional (next time I'll wear a suit), and scholarly (there were more degrees in that room

thought they were protected by Prop. 215, the Medical Marijuana Law. Michele told us their harrowing story at the State LP Convention.

Michele is a drop-dead knockout blond with brains. She gave Steve a beautiful little girl, Brooke, for a daughter three years ago. She loves her husband and family. You would be happy to have them as neighbors.

She told how three different Police agencies, Placer County, The DEA, and Nevada (different State even) spent 6

months "investigating" them. How the cops' secretly used a telephoto lens to take pictures through their bedroom window from less than 4 feet away. What kind of bush were these peeping cops looking for? The grow room was in the basement. Uncle Ernie, from the rock opera "Tommy", meet Uncle Sam!

The cops served their warrant in the morning while the family was getting ready for work. Steve told them he knew what they were there for and that no one would resist. Luckily their baby sitter, a grandmotherly type, arrived and Michele asked her to take the baby to keep her safe. They searched the house for 4 hours, handcuffed Steve and Michele and paraded them from their home. After a lengthy processing at the local jail they were arraigned and given \$100,000 bail. EACH!!! Not being able to raise that kind of money, they were taken to the County Jail in Auburn. Another humiliating processing procedure and they were placed in adjacent cells with a wall between. Having been deprived of <u>all</u> his medicine for over 9 hours now, Michele listened helplessly to Steve retching in the cold concrete holding cell with only a thin blanket for comfort. Eventually, after


much crying, screaming and pleading, Steve was taken to the infirmary. No one would tell Michele of his condition for days. Four days in jail and they were taken before another Judge. They had completed a questionnaire to rate their flight risk. The scale runs from a low of 1 to 12. Michele's cellmate told her a 5 was pretty good. They

scored 11. The Judge had never seen an 11 and asked the stammering "Persecutor" why he though they deserved \$100,000 bails. The judge released them on there own recognizance.

The cops have taken their plants, their computer, their business and their dignity. But they can't take their courage. Steve and Michele face a long legal road and they need our help. They intend to fight not only for their own freedom but also for full implementation of Prop 215. There are at least 4 other families in Placer County and countless others through out the State whose lives are being destroyed by police that refuse to uphold the law that Californian voters passed. The Compassionate Medical Marijuana Law. Steve and Michele need our help. I sent them \$50 and I wish it were more. "Lights of Liberty" will give awards and special gifts to libertarians who achieve *any one* of the following three libertarian outreach activities in 1999:




