PROPOSITION THIRTEEN WINS IN CALIFORNIA

Proposition 13, sometimes known as the Jarvis bill, won an unoffical total of 64% of the votes cast in the primary in California on Tuesday, June 13th. The proposal would cut up to 60% of the property tax levies in California.

Gov. Jerry Brown acknowledged that the radical proposition was approved, but said that the state will not step in to aid local governments financially hurt by its passage. The California governor also stated, "There will be no new taxes, we must put a lid on government spending.".

There was a heavy turnout throughout California, largely due to Proposition 13, and backers of the tax cut measure said that it will start a nationwide tax-revolt as other states and eventually the Congress are pressured to adopt similar statutes. A move of this nature is already under consideration by the Indiana LP, and we expect to get it underway soon.

Whatever our public one may think about the merit of the creationists' case, one must admit that they have a valid point. The schools are, after all, supported in part their tax dollars. How can by fair to deny them a it be say in their children's education while granting it to parents with more orthodox views?

The problem is not restricted to the question of mans origin. Liberal parents worry about the schools being pro business, conservatives about their being pro-socialist. Some parents want sex-ed, some don't.

Obviously, since these are contradictory, everybody can't satisfied. The painful truth be is that as long schools as are tax-supported and government operated, parents---who foot the bill--- will not have the kind in their children's of say education that they ought to have.

The program will be designed to provide the opportunity to all youth to volunteer their services to their local community for a period of approximately one year. The total contractual effort during fiscal year 1979 is subject to Congressional appropriation of funds but should amount to approximately 60 professional person-years of effort. Multiple contracts may be awarded for this effort. Requests for more detailed information should be adpressed within 10 days from publication of this notice. The deadline for receipt of resultant qualification statements is 26 Jun 78. This synopsis is not a request for proposal, but a request for capability information. Organizations responding with information to support their qualifications and experience will be considered for participation in forthcoming procurement actions. Education (continued fm. pg. 2) schools are run on a for profit basis.

These schools would not have a guaranteed income from tax monies. They would be completely dependent on the voluntary purchase of their services by parents (and other customers) to be able to stay in business. Thus would consumers of education be assured of getting exactly what they wanted at an affordable price.

There would not be the enforced uniformity which now characterizes public education. Parents who wanted their kids taught the Bible could send them to Bible-oriented schools, parents who believed evolution would have other schools and so on.

Some other advantages would be: the use of voluntarism as opposed to coercion and that only those who used education would be required to pay for it.

The ideal of a private educational system cannot be achieved overnight. But since it offers the prospect of a better quality education for our children at lower cost, we should do everything in our power to attain it.

KARL JACK BRAY DEAD AT 34

One of the origanal founders of the Libertarian Party, Karl J Bray died of cancer Sunday May 7th in Miami Beach.

Karl Bray was born in Provo Utah on June 12, 1943. He had attended Provo City schools before attending Brigham Young, Univ. of Utah, Weber State and UCLA, recieving a law degree from Blackstone School of Law in Chicago.

He was a member of the Independent Bar Asso. of Mass. and the Utah LP. He ran for Congress on the LP ticket in Utah in 1976. He was also the chairman of the board of the Rocky Mountain Mint in Salt Lake City, a precious metals firm.

Karl had been very active in the tax revolt movement, and that activity had had him in jail many times. The QUILL Wants to take this opprotunity to remember his achievements, and offer our condolences to friend and family alike at the passing
