Former LPVA Chair Campaigning for Pork

Rick Sincere, former chairman of the Libertarian Party of Virginia, is one of 11 "candidates" vying to kiss a pig at the Arlington County Fair on August 24. The "prize" will go to the candidate who raises the most money for the Warren G. Stambaugh Foundation, a non-profit devoted to meeting the needs of Virginia's mentally and physically disabled citizens. O'Leary explained to Sincere that the "Kiss-a-Pig" contest aims to raise about \$35,000. The foundation's grants are not limited to Arlington or Northern Virginia, but will be distributed statewide. He added that this effort shows how libertarians, whether party members or not, can get involved in their communities, helping dispel the misconception that we are aloof from our neighbors. Sincere told Virginia Liberty that there are two ways to help him win the "honor" of kissing a pig. First, send him a check made out to the Warren G. 



CAMPUS LIBERTARIAN GROUPS ACTIVITIES

Libertarian groups at the University of Virginia and Washington and Lee University recently concluded their activities for the 1996-97 school year. These organizations achieved a considerable degree of success in their efforts to promote libertarian ideas in their communities. Students for Individual Liberty (S.I.L.) at the University of Virginia concluded the school year by celebrating their 10th year of activity (a national record for longevity among libertarian student groups). S.I.L. will welcome back several of its top activists next year, while bringing in at least two new activists of demonstrated competence and enthusiasm. Planning is currently underway to increase substantially the number and quality of outreach activities.

University Libertarians (U.L.), the major L.P.- oriented organization at U.Va., will undertake an LPVA recruiting drive next fall. In addition, U.L. will endeavor to assist LPVA candidates this fall in Richmond and Northern Virginia, and to promote the efforts of the Jefferson Area Libertarians (the local LPVA affiliate). The Washington and Lee Libertarians are preparing for a big effort next year. Jason Sorens, president of the group, will serve as a summer intern at the Cato Institute. He hopes to bring several speakers to Lexington next year, and to build links with sympathetic organizations at W&L. If all goes as planned, libertarian groups will be active at James Madison University and George Mason University next year. Summer Gathering of 9th District Libertarians?Jim Lark, 9th District State Central Committee member, is attempting to put together a meeting of 9th District libertarians this summer. The purpose of the meeting is to bring together LPVa members for an afternoon and/or evening to discuss ways of increasing our efforts to promote liberty. Our thanks to all of you who sent in your reservations and checks for the Charles Murray/campaign Workshop event scheduled for May 31. We had hoped to have a response large enough to finance 2 or 3 Virgininia House of Delegate races this Fall. Unfortunately, we fell short and I 'd like to explore why we fell short and what we can do to be more successful in our fund raising and our interest level for campaign events in the near future. The most important message I received from this experience is that libertarians are not accustomed to thinking about campaigns and what is needed not only to finance them but to create the energy needed for success. At this point, winning a campaign for any office is probably not a realizable goal, but achieving a percentage of the vote and gaining recognition for libertarian ideas and candidates most certainly is. There are many narrow reasons why the Charles

Murray event failed to gain enough sponsorship-time of the year, day long commitment, nearness to Memorial Day, etc. None of these should be determinative when scheduling such an event. To get someone of Charles Murray's stature and name recognition it is necessary to pick a date far in advance to mesh with her schedule. I spoke to Mr. Murray in January to secure a May date. When I called him with this postponement, he was receptive to rescheduling in the Fall. I am very excited and optimistic about our future in the political arena when we have nationally recognized figures willing to help us locally. If we use them judiciously they can be tremendous assets
