The meeting was called to order at 6:45 p.m. by Andrew Kolstee, Chair. Secretary Mark Braiman conducted a roll call and determined that a quorum was present.

The Credentials and Nominations Report (Exhibit 1) indicated that there were thirty-four (34) of fifty-eight (58) voting members of the State Committee present at the time of roll call. Two (2) vacancies were filled during the meeting, to give thirty-six (36) members present out of sixty (60) members of the State Committee. Steven Becker later entered the meeting, to give thirty-seven (37) members present out of sixty (60) members of the State Committee. The Secretary

determined that a quorum was present at all times during the meeting, except following the quorum count.

The Agenda (Exhibit 2) was adopted without objection.

Chair Andrew Kolstee opened a period of public comment. No comments were offered.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of one (1) State Committee vacancy from Judicial District 5. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling this vacancy until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of one (1) State Committee vacancy from Judicial District 6. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that Michael T. Gately had been nominated in advance and had accepted the nomination and is eligible.

In the first round of voting for State Committee Representative from Judicial District 6 was conducted using OpaVote, since Porcupine ballots were not operational. The results were as follows:

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of two (2) State Committee vacancies from Judicial District 10. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Christian Padgett was nominated.

In the first round of voting for State Committee Representative from Judicial District 10 was conducted using OpaVote, since Porcupine ballots were not operational. The results were as follows:

Chair Andrew Kolstee called for the filling of one (2) State Committee vacancy from Judicial District 13. Secretary Mark Braiman reported that no one had been nominated in advance. Chair Andrew Kolstee, hearing no nominations from the floor, postponed filling this vacancy until the next meeting of the State Committee.

Treasurer William Cody Anderson issued a Treasurer's report.

Chair Andrew Kolstee issued a Chair's report.

The Chair called for the filling of vacancies on the Elections Oversight Committee.

John Clifton nominated Francisco Olvera, pending acceptance of his nomination.

Robert Schuon nominated himself and he accepted the nomination.

The Chair postponed the filling of vacancies on the Elections Oversight Committee until confirmation that Francisco Olvera accepts his nomination.

Rules Committee Chair Andrew Kolstee issued a report (Exhibit 4). [31:29]

Motion by Michael Rebmann on behalf of the Rules Committee to amend the Rules of the Libertarian Party to adopt Proposal 1 passed without objection.

Motion by Michael Rebmann on behalf of the Rules Committee to amend the Rules of the Libertarian Party to adopt Proposal 2 passed without objection.

Motion by Daniel Castello on behalf of the Rules Committee to **amend the Rules of the**Libertarian Party to adopt Proposal 3 was debated. Motion by Irwin Mark Weinblatt to

remove the striking of the word "in" in the first sentence was adopted without objection. The

original motion as amended passed without objection

Motion by Karyn Keniry-Thompson on behalf of the Rules Committee to amend the Rules of the Libertarian Party to adopt Proposal 4 passed without objection.

Motion by Michael Rebmann on behalf of the Rules Committee to amend the Rules of the Libertarian Party to adopt Proposal 5 passed without objection.

Andrew Kolstee issued a report on the updated Application of the 2024 Rubric (Exhibit 5) including changes to Delegate and Alternate Delegates based on new applications and withdrawals.

Motion by Christopher Olenski to amend the rubric in the Policy Manual to insert "Any State Committee member who has missed the past two State Committee meetings without advance notice shall be ineligible to serve as a Delegate or Alternate Delegate" was seconded by Charles Roggen and debated. Daniel Donnelly asked how many Delegates or Alternates currently assigned by the rubric this would affect. Andrew Kolstee stated that no current or proposed delegates would be affected. Motion by Steven Becker to amend motion by striking "or Alternate Delegate" was seconded by Daniel Donnelly, debated, and passed 14-13-1 (see Appendix 1A for details). Motion by Christopher Olenski to amend the motion to strike "the past" was seconded by Charles Roggen and debated. Motion by Michael Rebmann to commit or refer the issue of the wording of the Policy Manual to the Rules Committee was seconded by Michael Gately and debated. Motion by Michael Rebmann to call the question on the referral was seconded by Robert Schuon and passed by a two-thirds (2/3) voice vote. The motion to commit or refer to the Rules Committee passed by voice vote.

Motion by Leonard Morlock to ratify the list of Delegates and Alternate Delegates according to the revised Application of the 2024 Rubric (Exhibit 5) was seconded by Michael Rebmann and passed without objection.

A special Director Search Vetting Committee to consider candidates for Communications Director and Outreach Director was constituted without objection. William Cody Anderson, Justin Pelletier, Michael Gately, and Steven Becker volunteered to serve on the Committee and were appointed without objection. Michael Gately volunteered to chair the committee and was appointed without objection.

The retroactive renewal of the appointment of Jame VanDewalker as Acting County Chair of Allegany County on December 31, 2023, which will expire on March 31, 2024 passed without objection.

The appointment of Samuel Hordeski as Acting County Chair and County Liaison of Cortland County, which will expire on June 30, 2024 passed without objection.

The appointment of Michael Gately as Acting County Chair and County Liaison of Delaware County, which will expire on June 30, 2024 passed without objection.

Convention Committee Chair Michael Rebmann issued a report on the upcoming nominating convention to be held March 16-17, 2024 in Watkins Glen.

The Chair resumed the filling of vacancies on the Elections Oversight Committee. Francisco Olvera accepted his nomination via email.

In the first round of voting for the vacancies on Elections Oversight Committee was conducted using OpaVote, since Porcupine ballots were not operational. The results were as follows:

Motion by Blay Tarnoff that no person shall be nominated for a stand-in for President or Vice-President who has not completed and notarized a valid certificate of declination was seconded by Richard Purtell. Christopher Olenski made a point of order that this has the form of a rule that would limit the power of the State Committee and it was not sustained by the Chair. Motion by Karyn Keniry-Thompson to amend the motion to strike "certificate of declination and insert "promissory note" was seconded by Robert Schuon and debated. Christopher

Olenski made a **point of order** that this is an improper legal form to bind the candidate was sustained by the Chair, who ruled the amendment out of order.

Mark Braiman **called for a quorum**. Thirty (30) members were present out of sixty (60) members of the State Committee, and therefore quorum was not present, and no official business could be conducted.

William Cody Anderson called for orders of the day.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:14 p.m.

# REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE COMMITTEE MEETING OF FEBRUARY 13, 2024

Proposal 1 (G). Remove "primary" as there are no primaries when there is no ballot access.

6.7. **TERM.** State Committee members shall serve until the conclusion of the Organization Meeting following the primary election at which their successors are elected. State Committee members who move their residence out of their Judicial District but within the State of New York may keep their offices until the end of their term.

Proposal 2 (C). Simplify provision for Convention Oversight Committee for organization meetings.

8.5.1. CONVENTION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. The State Committee shall appoint a special Convention Oversight Committee to plan and execute the Organization Meeting. The Convention Committee shall also appoint the following special subcommittees: Convention Arrangements Subcommittee, Program Subcommittee, Rules Subcommittee, Credentials Subcommittee, and Resolutions Subcommittee. The Convention Committee and each subcommittee This committee may appoint subcommittees or assistants for the facilitation of their responsibilities. The Convention Committee This committee and its subcommittees shall cease to exist upon the adjournment of the organization meeting.

- 8.5.2. **AGENDA.** The order of business shall be as follows:
  - (a) The current Chair shall call the meeting to order.
  - (b) The Chair shall call the roll to identify the elected State Committee members present.
  - (c) The Chair shall serve as the Presiding Officer and Secretary shall serve as the Recording Secretary, respectively, of the Organization Meeting, unless they decline or are unable to serve, at which point a Temporary Chair and/or Temporary Secretary shall be elected for the duration of the meeting.
  - (d) Report of Rules Subcommittee Committee and adoption of the Special Rules of Order of the Organization Meeting.
  - (e) Filling of vacancies on the State Committee.
  - (f) Supplemental credentials report-of the Credentials Subcommittee.
  - (g) Report of Rules Subcommittee and adoption of the Rules of the Libertarian Party.
  - (h) Election of the officers and five Members-At-Large of the Executive Committee.
  - (i) Discussion and consideration of Platform amendments.
  - (j) Report of Resolutions Subcommittee.
  - (k) Adjournment.

Proposal 3 (D). Cleanup and clarifications for At-Large Delegates procedures. Allows the Executive Committee to ratify the delegate list once the rubric is approved.

13.4. MANNER OF SELECTION OF AT-LARGE DELEGATES. All At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected by the State Committee in accordance with the rubric provided in these Rules the Policy Manual in which a line of succession is established for ranking Delegates and Alternate Delegates. At-Large Delegates shall be selected in the order in accordance with the rubric until all the At-Large Delegate seats are filled. At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected in the order in accordance with the rubric until all the At-Large Alternate Delegate seats are filled. Vacancies of At-Large Delegate positions shall be filled by selecting the next individual in the line of succession. Ties shall be broken by a vote of the State Committee. The final list of Delegates and Alternate Delegates shall be ratified at a meeting of by the State Committee. Additional At-Large Alternate Delegates may be added after the election of the initial election appointment of At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates and shall be added to the end of the list in chronological order of their selection as an additional Alternate Delegate.

13.4.1. **RUBRIC.** Delegates to the Libertarian National Convention shall be selected in accordance with this rubric and in accordance with the Rules of the Libertarian Party of New York.

13.4.2. CRITERIA. Delegates shall be selected in accordance with the rubric in the Policy Manual.

13.5. **TIMING OF SELECTION OF DELEGATES.** At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates to Presidential Nominating Conventions shall be **held** selected one month before petitioning for the Presidential Primary Begins if such a primary is held. For all other National During Non-Presidential Nominating Conventions, At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected no later than three (3) months before the Libertarian National Convention.

Proposal 4 (E). Clarify that these are the rules of the LPNY, not just the State Committee.

- 21.1. These rules shall be the exclusive rules of the State Committee of the Libertarian Party LPNY.
- 21.2. These rules supersede and replace any document previously adopted by the Party LPNY and shall remain in effect until such time that the State Committee of the Libertarian Party adopts new or amended Rules. No other rules shall be effective unless approved in writing by the State Committee.

Proposal 5 (F). Remove index of contents of Policy Manual as unnecessary.

23.4. CONTENTS. The contents of the Policy Manual shall include but not be limited to the following.

23.4.1. SPECIAL RULES OF ORDER. The Special Rules of Order shall govern the procedures of meetings of the full State Committee.

23.4.2. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE. The Organizational Structure shall govern the procedures regarding the structure and operations of committees.
