

America. Freedom was the original idea.

In 1776 Thomas Jefferson wrote in the Declaration of Independence, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." These words summed up the motives and ideals of the American revolutionaries.

In 1984, David Bergland and hundreds of other Libertarian candidates are saying that society can and should be run by these ideals. Individuals have the right to control their own lives, and must take responsibility for their actions.

Government today is run according to the opposite principle. Individuals are treated as the property of the state and are taxed, regulated, and prevented from acting according to their own judgment. Peace and prosperity are threatened every day by bureaucratic meddling at home and overseas, whether the President is a Democrat or a Republican.

Bergland's Libertarian stands on the issues . . .



Unemployment Over 8 million workers are currently unemployed. Countless more have given up looking and are not included in the statistics. Politicians call for more power for themselves and more of our money to solve the unemployment problem. The politicians conveniently ignore their own role in creating the problem: Minimum-wage laws make employing someone at \$3.00 an hour a crime. Government-created union restrictions and occupational licensing close the door on countless individuals seeking work. "Jobs programs" only take money out of the productive private sector to put people into unproductive public jobs. If the poor are to stand on their own two feet, then we must stop the politicians and bureaucrats from breaking their legs. End government interference in the marketplace, and the unemployment problem will disappear.

Welfare Individual liberty must be accompanied by individual responsibility. As government controls and taxes are destroying our liberty, they are undermining our sense of responsibility as well. Banks, big businesses, and corporate farmers are enjoying bailouts, subsidies, and other welfare for the rich. The government has set up expensive, corrupt, and demeaning welfare programs for the poor as a substitute for the opportunity and upward mobility of a free market economy. These programs have severely damaged the traditional American spirit of charity toward the truly needy. The welfare system currently spends over \$40,000 per year for each poor family in the country, and fritters away more than 80% of it on bureaucracy, providing little to the poor themselves. Welfare should be privatized, and the taxes supporting the government's poverty industry should be abolished.

Foreign Policy Our foreign policy must protect the liberty of the American people by guarding American territory from attack. Instead, the U.S. government is trying to act as the world's policeman. An estimated \$229 billion (75% of Reagan's 1985 military budget) is devoted to meddling and entanglements overseas in Western Europe, the Far East, the Middle East, and Central America. The U.S. government has spent over \$2.35 trillion since 1946 on foreign aid and international bailout agencies like the IMF and the World Bank.

We should stop pouring American blood and treasure down ratholes in Grenada, Lebanon, and El Salvador. A fully adequate defense of American territory combined with policies of armed neutrality and no foreign wars will best protect our lives and liberties.

Nuclear Arms
The U.S. government now has nine times the explosive power needed to effectively destroy the Soviet Union. Solely on its undetectable submarines at sea, the United States currently has enough destructive power to obliterate the Soviet Union. The Soviet government has a similar ability to destroy us many times over. The present U.S. military buildup — begun during the Democratic Carter administration — is robbing Americans blind and threatening the destruction of the world. Instead, we must take active steps toward mutual arms reduction, including sensible steps on our own such as retirement of all U.S. land-based missiles. These missiles are simply tempting targets that invite an attack on our homeland.

Taxes Taxation is legalized theft, pure and simple. It is also the ultimate reason that all government programs fail. These programs have no equivalent to the profit test, by which private groups and individuals can measure their success. Government waste, corruption, inefficiency, and failure are not a result of bumbling or stupid people running the programs. They are a result of financing of these programs via taxes — a process which robs our wallets while it removes any true measure of accomplishment and all incentive to improve productivity.

The largest source of revenue for the Federal government is the income tax. The Internal Revenue Service collects this tax in the only way it can—using arbitrary and tyrannical methods. Thus, it is no accident that the Internal Revenue Service is the closest thing America has to a government terrorist organization. The income tax must be repealed, and the IRS must be abolished.

There was no permanent income tax before 1914, and the country prospered. Since then, the federal bureaucracy has been our major growth industry.

Inflation The government, specifically its Federal Reserve Bank, causes inflation. In essence, this is done by printing paper money. Bankers, bureaucrats, and government contractors make a good living off the inflation process. Those on pensions and earning wages are the victims. What America needs is a halt to the printing of paper money and a return to a dollar that's sound and honest — literally, a dollar that's as good as gold.

Rights & Liberties Despite Reagan's 1980 campaign promises to America's youth that he would end draft registration, he has instead prosecuted and jailed young men who have not registered. The draft itself is an intolerable use of slaves to defend freedom. The draft violates the most basic human right to control our own bodies and lives.

If we are to enjoy the right to pursue happiness that is enshrined in the Declaration of Independence, we must have privacy from government spies and protection from criminals. Yet the record of the Reagan years has been stepped-up government spying on American citizens. At the same time, Reagan is covering up — in the name of secrecy — government activities that the taxpayer pays for. Even the fundamental human right of self-protection is today threatened both by Reagan who has failed to restore our right to bear arms and by his Democratic opponent who would violate this right with further gun bans.

Education The most pressing personal concern of America's families is the miseducation of our children. The enormous budgets of government schools never seem to be enough to provide decent schooling, and literacy is declining as fast as crime in the schools is rising. There is only one answer: separation of education and state, abolition of the tremendous tax load to support these schools, and freedom for parents to educate our children as we see fit. Ghetto parents have the most to gain from freedom in education, since it is children there who are getting the least out of the present system.

Steve Givot on the issues...

"Prosperity and growth can come only from a free, unfettered economy."

Contrary to what most politicians and special interest groups would have us believe, improvements in our standard of living and elimination of human suffering are not the result of "responsible government planning." They are the result of voluntary private effort, not government intervention through taxation, regulation, or subsidies for favored corporations, industries, advocacy programs, or other special interests.

To understand what happens when government takes control of the economy, look at the Soviet Union. For all its natural resources and population, the Soviet economy repeatedly fails to meet its own government's forecasts. Soviet farming is a disaster. Soviet industry is grossly underproductive in comparison with any free nation with comparable resources. Why? Because no government can possess the knowledge and skill necessary to control, operate, or even guide an economy composed of millions of people and enterprises.

Rather than learn the obvious lesson from the Soviet situation, the Federal government imposes more and more lawers of economic regulation and controls every year.

Steve Givot will work to reverse this trend, moving us away from centralized government planning and toward economic freedom.

"We must stop spending 3/4 of our military budget to defend other countries."

\$225 billion this year, approximately 77% of the U.S. military budget, will be spent on the defense of other mations. Such spending has in the past done little, if anything, to bring peace and stability to the world. On the contrary, oppressive regimes, both right- and left-wing, have increased in strength. In fact, the U.S. has armed both sides in 17 wars this century.

What is worse is that most of this money is spent on countries that could well afford to defend themselves: \$47 billion on Japan and East Asia, and \$127 billion on Western Europe. Since these countries don't have to pay for their own defense, they can produce goods cheaper than we can at the cost of millions of American jobs.

Nonmilitary aid has been a similar failure. Much of the money ends up in the pockets of corrupt bureaucrats in these countries and never reaches the people it was intended to help. Furthermore, ill conceived programs have often harmed the economies of these countries, making them still more dependent on U.S. aid. In contrast, private aid programs have dome flair more to develop self-sufficiency and to meet human meeds.

American aid to other countries was supposed to promote freedom and prosperity throughout the world. It mas failed dismally. Steve Givot believes that world peace and progress are better served by free trade among all nations, and he opposes all forms of government aid to other countriess.




