If we are trying to sell the idea that people can do anything government does, then we'll have to roll up our sleeves and demon strate our willingness to do just that. 
California. A hearty welcome is in order.

On Monday, September 18, our Albany people submitted our petition to the board of elections, with 28,617 signatures. FLP'ers from Rochester, Albany and NYC spent a working weekend at Mike and Barbara Kessler's house doing the final processing. About 35 FLP'ers collected signatures (about 1/10 of our membership), and they all deserve thanks, but I'd particularly point out Bob Flanzer, who underwent open heart surgery last spring, but who nevertheless filled a couple of petition sheets (although, since Bob is a dentist, it is said that he has a captive audience), Judith Olney, who filled a couple of sheets in the very small town of Russia, Herkimer Co., and Dave Hoesly, who organized the Rochester drive, netting 4,000 signatures, Dave himself getting over 1,000. By comparison, I got 2,500, working full time, while Dave got his in his spare time.

Another project for the next two years will be an attempt to get people to commit themselves to getting a certain number of signatures in the 1980 drive, so that the same 35 people won't have to carry all of this burden themselves. Don't wait to be asked.

We are getting new members. They aren't exactly breaking down the door, but they are trickling in at roughly one every cople of weeks. This, however, isn't really enough to make up for the loss of older members who move out of state or simply become inactive. I could see the exodus in the general population while petitioning.
