


President of the Advocates for Self-Government — a nonpartisan group that teaches Libertarians how to be more effective communicators.

THE CAPITOL STEPS



the National Rifle Association. As the Director of the NRA's Institute for Legisla-


tive Action, Metaksa works to protect gun rights in the state and federal legislative arena. She's also the author of Safe Not Sorry, a woman's self-protection book.

Founder and head of the Libertarian Campaign Managers Association in Michigan and campaign manager for Jon Coon's U.S. Senate race (1994).





An leading expert on college organizing, he is the advisor to the Liberty Coalition at the University of Virginia and past national LP campus liaison.




FRED COLLINS

Elected member of the Berkley (Michigan) City Council, he won office by focusing on three issues: Taxes, regulation, and "volunteerizing" city activities.



HARRY BROWNE

The Libertarian Party's 1996 candidate for president, author of 10 books (including Why Government Doesn't Work and How I Found Freedom In An Unfree World) which have sold over 2.1 million copies, public speaker, and world-renowned investment advisor. As the LP's presidential candidate, he appeared on more than 500 radio and TV programs, earned over 100 endorsements, and won the party's second-highest vote total ever: 485,759 votes. Currently, he is helping the LP with its membership growth plan and is mulling whether to seek the party's presidential nomination again in 2000.



CHARLES MURRAY

The author of two of the most influential libertarian books of this generation: Losing Ground, the devastating

and exhaustively researched expose of the destructiveness of government welfare, and What It Means to Be A Libertarian, which outlined how liberty creates a "civil society."



ROBERT POOLE He founded the influential free-market Reason Foundation and

helped make "privatization" — both the revolutionary concept and the word itself - part of contemporary political discourse across the USA and around the world, thanks to his

classic book, Cutting Back City Hall.



Executive vice president of the prestigious and hard-hitting Cato Institute and the author of the book, Liber-

tarianism: A Primer - described as a "bracing shot of 100-proof libertarianism" that generated widespread critical acclaim when it was published last year.



SANDI WEBB

A two-term Simi Valley (California) City Council member, she's made headlines for carrying a gun in "dangerous" areas

like Los Angeles; walking out of a meeting with Senator Diane Feinstein; and forcing the local police to end their de-facto ban on issuing concealed-carry permits.



BRIAN HOMAS

He parlayed his 18 years of experience in the broadcasting industry into an election victory in 1997, winning a

seat as a Town Meeting Member in Holbrook, Massachusetts. This combination of talents has made him one of the LP's rising stars of political communications.



METHENY He's the Libertarian

Party's newest mayor — stepping into the top spot in Auburn, Georgia, in mid-May

after citizens voted to recall their former mayor. Since he was first elected as the only Libertarian on the City Council, "the job has proved anything but dull," he said.

DEWAYNE



A multi-million-copyselling author, he's written two #1 New York Times bestsellers. But he's probably best

known to Libertarians as the author of Ain't Nobody's Business If You Do, a scathing attack on the immorality and foolishness of arresting people for "consensual crimes."

LAN

"The Father of the Libertarian Party" is how he is often described because it was in David Nolan's living room in

1971 that the party was formed. A successful marketing professional, publisher, and radio talk show host, he has also served as LP National Chairman and LP News editor.

RGFNSFN

As the Libertarian Party Vice Presidential candidate in 1996, she campaigned in 31 states and won praise as a

political "dream woman." She is also a successful businesswoman and entrepreneur, and was the LP Congressional candidate in South Carolina in 1992.



PERRY

Past LP National Director and the guru of the LP's Project Archimedes, he's also one of the party's most successful practitioners of local organizing.



for governor in Arizona, he won 4% of the vote and an enormous amount of respect. Now he's running for State House — and plans to win.








STEVE
