One of the weekend highlights was to have LP candidates on site when Governor Rowland came to the fair. Candidate Walter Gengarelly and a couple of other members spoke with him briefly. Moreover, several other candidates and volunteers from the other parties stopped by to meet us and find out more about the Libertarian Party. One candidate actually took our political quiz (he came out extremely conservative, but not Libertarian).

We were present, on site, between the Democrats and Republicans, and we were noticed! It was a great opportunity to let the competition and Walter's constituents know that we are here working for liberty in Connecticut.

Other vendors around us noticed that we had a lot of support with different people coming and going each day. They were surprised that there were so many Libertarians. In fact, one vendor challenged the LP by saying that they would vote for the party that was the last to leave the Fairgrounds in the face of a heavy rainstorm.

The Democrats left very early (they are probably going to pass a law against rain). The Republicans stayed almost to the end. Only the dedicated LP members stayed until the fair shut down, working in a downpour and mud to break down the tent and contents. The vendor who challenged us confirmed his promise to vote for us.

Seven LP volunteers stuck it out and broke this booth down in the storm. This is the kind of effort and commitment that impresses people. Quite a few folks will remember the LP as the party of hard-working, gutsy volunteers – people worth casting your vote for.

On September 21st the Libertarian Party of Connecticut was on the road again, setting up its attractive fair tent at the Connecticut Pride festival at Bushnell Park in Hartford. This event brings together people of diverse lifestyles from all over Connecticut for entertainment and short speeches.

Our own Walter Gengarelly, Congressional Candidate for the 5th Congressional District, was kindly invited to share the Libertarian Party principles to an audience of several hundred people from the Bushnell stage. He stressed separation of government and bedroom, and the Libertarian Party's strength as the third largest political party. He was the only candidate who had this opportunity.


The booth was well-staffed, and was visited by many fairgoers. More than a couple of hundred brochures were passed out through the crowd. At one point, Gubernatorial candidate Curry stopped at the booth and voiced his concern that the LP not do "too good of a job". It was fun and was yet another successful fair event.

Media coverage included an eleven o'clock news shot of the LP booth. Flanked by the United States and "Don't Tread on Me" flags, it was the most attractive setup at the site. Libertarian Party branding was advanced again.

Simultaneously, up on the hill overlooking the park on the steps of the Capitol, Gunsafe held a rally that was also attended by several LP members. Once again, some of our candidates were greeted by Republican candidates — our activism is quite visible to the competition.
