#### BY THE NUMBERS !

US News & World Report forecasts that by 2010 only 30% of the people of the US will be literate.

This is because the public schools are turning out illiterates by its anti-phonics plan. Assuming normal birth & death rates, & that immigrants from Mexico may

increase the illiteracy, etc., consider:

Most of the folks now alive will be alive & 20 years older 20 years from now. About every year 1½% of the people die, and mostly among the older & more literate. For the illiteracy problem to go down that far in just 20 years, almost every literate dying will be replaced by 1+ illiterates. The public schools will not be turning much besides illiterates.

#### HOW DO WE GET THE MEDIA'S ATTENTION ?

Curiously, the wrangling between city & county is like a cat-and-dog fight (usually for the loot); even the media get tired of it. So, we suggested that the county name be changed, to that of a former county of half of it, Liberty. Naturally, it is a county name that Libertarians must come out in favor of. In case you're interested, there are 4 Liberty counties in US: Georgia, Florida, Texas, & Montana.

Instead of fighting the so-called War on Drugs, with bystanders among those killed with stray bullets, there is an alternative: de-criminalization. Naturally, the Czar Against Drugs, said to be addicted to alcohol or tobacco himself, is opposed to any plan that would cut out all the opportunities for enriching bureaucrats at the taxpayers' expense. Tax-eaters are like that; they want to keep everything in the trough.

By de-criminalizing drugs, Holland has found a sharp decrease in addiction. This is just the same as this country, and others, found when they repealed Prohibition, and saw the alcohol drinking rate go down.

Curiously, some "illegal" drugs are available on a doctor's prescription, with huge amounts of paperwork. Most doctors believe that the ones entrusted with prescription of drugs should be graduates of medical school, not ignorant governmental bureaucrats. They think, mostly, that heroin should be allowed on prescription only for those dying of cancer who need a pain-killer, and are in no danger of living long eneough to become an addict. They think that marijuana should be available to those with glaucoma or menstrual cramps (which Queen Victoria took it for) as a medicine. There are even those who think that the leaves that cocaine is made from can be used to make a medicine for altitude sickness, like the kind the Pope took on his trip to Bolivia.

After all, the reason for drugs is to help the sick. I don't deny that drugs can kill some. George Washington grew marijuana for the hemp to make ropes out of, and there were some pirates hanged with these ropes.

But the main argument for de-criminalization is to make it legal to cure addicts.

# Beach dwellers should pay if land destroyed



Re: DOT-mandated drug urine testing

The Department of Transportation has issued regulations (Part 199 and Part 40) demanding the implementation of random urine drug testing throughout the pipeline industry. This program is due to Original, Substantive be in place by April 20, 1990.

What I've discovered is frightening!

First, and foremost, I find the institution of this program, mandated by the federal government through the Department of Transportation, to be an insult to my integrity. I have been in the pipeline industry for over five years, advancing to my present position as a controller for the nation's largest refined petroleum pipeline.

I take pride in my work. I realize its importance to the nation's economy and security, and I fully realize that it is a safety-Operating errors could result in sensitive field I work in. Operating errors conserious accidents, threatening lives and property. I would not willingly report for work if I felt I was in any way not fit for I resent the implication that the the demands of the job. government, and my employer by agreeing to this invasion of privacy, would believe otherwise. I believe many of my co-workers, both at my company and throughout the industry, would say the same.

Article IV of the Constitution of the United States says: "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated; and no warrant shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath of affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched and the person or things to be seized."

The list of horror stories of humiliating experiences while providing a urine sample, and of tales of shattered lives after being accused based on "false positive" test results, is endless. I could refer to you countless news articles and books written on the subject, and to many court cases.

A joint CDC/NIDA study in 1985, as reported in the Journal of the American Medical Association (4-26-85), led to this conclusion: "Error rates for thirteen laboratories on samples containing codeine, amphetamines, methadone, cocaine, morphine ranged from 11% to 94%, 19% to 100%, 0% to 33%, 0% to 100%, 0% to 100%, and 5% to 100%, respectively. Similarly, error rates on samples not containing these drugs (false positives) barbiturates, ranged from 0% to 6%, 0% to 37%, 0% to 66%, 0% to 6%, 0% to 7%, and 0% to 10%, respectively."

Granted, these tests may have been improved since 1985. But even assuming they're now 95% accurate, what about those five percent who lose their jobs because of this program, though they've never taken an illegal drug in their lives?

From September 1987 through October 1989 the Department of Transportation conducted 24,526 random urine drug tests of its own A whopping 138, less than 6/10 of 1 percent, tested Less than one percent. And only 25 of these nearly positive. 25,000 people were removed from their "safety sensitive" jobs.

There is something very UN-American and very scary about this whole drug-hysteria witch-hunt. It reeks of McCarthy era loyalty oaths. It conjures up images of Nazi SS troops. King George's Redcoats.

I'm asking you to put a stop to this. It's my understanding that several states, and a few cities, have passed laws forbidding the use of random urine drug tests. I would like for you to sponsor legislation outlawing this gestapo-like invasion of privacy and violation of every American's Constitutional right to privacy and due process.



ANARCHIST OPPOSITION TO CAPITALISM ?

Once in a while I run across things, and fall back on the Gullah proverb, "It ain't necessarily so."

"Don Holbrook replies: 'Becoming part of the system of economic exploitation in order to have an income, is certainly a way to plan for one's old age. Buying a duplex, for instance, and then renting it out, could mean that for an initial outlay of \$80,000 perhaps, you could then have an income from tenants, amounting to \$700 a month (about \$10,000 a year, so that in under nine years your expenditure would be fully repaid). Then, no matter how long thereafter, to the end of your life and for your successors and heirs until the end of time, the tenants would keep on paying into your fund and supplying an unearned income to you or somebody else." (The Match!, 11-11-87)

Now, let us meat the real world. To get the \$80,000 you have done something, somehow, deserving it or not. So you buy the duplex. You rent it out. You receive rent.

(1) You must, if you have any sense pay insurance on the duplex. If it burns, you could lose everything otherwise except the vacant lot. So, there goes 1 month's rent every year.

(2) The city & county charge you a real estate tax. There goes another month's rent every year.

(3) You have regular repairs & upkeep, from the annual termite spraying to replacement of broken window panes, broken screens, etc., etc., etc., .... There goes another month's rent every year.

(4) Then there are major repairs. Fortunately, they do not come up every year, but sooner or later the roof has to be reroofed, and things like that. There goes one more year's rental income. The roof does not last forever.

(5) Tenants come, & go. They move to another town, or they buy a house of their own, or they die of old age, or whatever. The house sits vacant until a new tenant can move in. But it has to be fixed, and probably repainted, before anyone of any worth moves in. There goes 3 months rent while it's being fixed up & rented while vacant, and the rest of a years rent for that half of the duplex for a

(6) Buildings do not last forever, not even for your whole lifetime if it is not a new, long-life house. Soon or late, you reach the choice of tearing down the house & replacing it with a new building, not necessarily a home, as the location may change, or rebuilding it from the old foundations up, at more cost than building it originally.

This is not all. I spare you going into all the other possibilities. It is a way to save money. It is a last resort in a depression - you can move into one side & rent the other side to pay for food, electricity, & other barest necessities. The worst is for the house to burn & the fire insurance co. fail at the same time, or that everything be destroyed in a war.

But economic exploitation? Or is it better to leave the poor to live in tents, as unable to be allowed to rent half a duplex?

i cannot reasonably argue with publisher Ben Morris' explanation. Despite Columbia Newspapers Inc.'s practically having a local monopoly on evening newspapers, and their forever advertising that newspapers are "indispensable," their recognition of the low income from a small and declining readership and of rising costs resulted in a rational decision to discontinue publishing The Record.

Not everyone reasons as Mr. Morris does, and even Columbia Newspapers has not always reasoned that public services by a monopoly should pay their way or die.

Example 1: The front page of the edition that carried publisher Ben Morris' explanation for the death of The Record, reported that CSX and

Amtrak, which have a monopoly in Columbia, are considering discontinuing Columbia rail passenger service because of financial losses, insufficient patronage, low fares, and high and rising expenses. Mayor Patton Adams and Sen. Strom Thurmond are reported to think CSX and taxpayers should continue to subsidize Amtrak through Columbia. (Politicians enjoy being generous with the money of others.)

Example 2: Recently, when South Carolina Electric & Gas Co. sought to increase local bus fares in the face of \$8 million in annual losses, very low bus fares, and high and rising costs, the PSC decided to be generous to SCE&G bus riders with the money of shareholders, forcing SCE&G to continue to lose millions annually. At least one of Columbia's newspapers editorialized that the

Government should legislate that the cost of everything to each of us varies in proportion to the income of each of us.

Or maybe the rules are: If my business is losing money, get out of it. If someone else's business is losing money, force him to continue to lose, if you can.
