

Los Angeles Convention Report Gathering in Glendale

wenty-nine people attended the Libertarian Party of Los Angeles County (LPLAC) annual convention on June 7th, at Shakers Restaurant in Glendale, including many from outside the county. Events included an impromptu debate on the Iraq War, followed by the election of new and returning officers.

Bob Weber moderated the Iraq War debate, which also touched on possible war with Iran, and America's growing police state. Sandor Woren took what he termed the "prodefense" position, while Alan Pyeatt argued against the war.

Admitting that his was the unpopular position among libertarians, Woren justified preemptive war, saying that it was a dangerous world, and that America's enemies "in that part of the world" only understood strength and force.



On Monday, May 26th, Memorial Day, the entire LP national delegation stood for one minute of silence in honor of U.S.

Shortly thereafter, the delegation passed, by the required two thirds majority, the following antiwar resolution:

"Whereas the War in Iraq was sold to the American people based upon lies, exaggerations and half-truths,

Whereas the War in Iraq was prosecuted for the private interests of the Administration and its cronies and was not, and is not, in the national security interests of the United States,

We call for the withdrawal of U.S. troops from Iraq as quickly as can be safely accomplished."

The resolution was authored by Los Angeles County Vice

Purists Scare Voters

Purists have a place in the libertarian movement. However, what purists must not do is prevent the party from growing into an effective political force. This is the goal of the party. To get Libertarian candidates elected so we may effect real political change.

We need to have the libertarian movement separate from the LP. The movement should contain all purists and involve education. The party should contain people who can communicate to non-libertarians. We call these people candidates, and they do this best with their toes hanging over the libertarian/centrist line on the Nolan chart, or as close southward to that line as they dare venture.

A purist will never go there and thus will never get elected. Purists often terrify non-libertarians and send them fleeing. While the purist is 100% correct, it is just too much for a non-libertarian to handle all at once. Candidates understand this Purists often do not.

Candidates must attract voters who are south of that line. Successful candidates will not use purist language. They will use the language of non-libertarians. This language confuses purists.

Only after a candidate has convinced a voter to cross the line should a purist begin any advanced education courses upon these newly converted libertar-

While purists keep the membership of our party of principle solidly directed toward a philosophical ideal, it is candidates who grow our party. Purists speak of ideals, achievable actions to incrementally move society in that direction.

These two entities are mutually exclusive. Yet in past practice they have not been mutually exclusive. We have had purists running for office. This is why we have so

Purists and candidates must be separated for each to be effective in accomplishing their respective roles. This is what we are currently witnessing in our party. We will be larger, stronger, and more powerful when it is complete. I am excited to watch it finally beginning

azim Kira described the American Muslim Task Force as "an umbrella organization of all Muslim organizations in this country, focused on civil rights and elections." Their booth at the LP convention had two goals. "To create a dialog between the Libertarian and Muslim communities. And to get Muslims to become part of the Libertarian Party."

Stressing that Muslims are not monolithic, Kira said that different planks of the LP platform appeal to different Muslims, including economic freedom, foreign policy, less government, separation of church and state, and "especially civil rights."

Do some Muslims agree with the entire LP platform? "Absolutely,

One California Muslim, Maad Abu-Ghazaleh, ran for Congress on the Libertarian ticket in 2002 against Democrat Tom Lantos. Abu-Ghazaleh got 7% of the vote. The Republican got 25%.

The AMTF is non-partisan and encourages Muslims to participate in the political process, whether as a Republican, Democrat, Green, Libertarian, or whatever party best represents an individual Muslim's

Kira added, "There is a verse in the tradition of The Prophet that says, 'Follow the law of the country that you are in.' We want Muslims to be part of every party. [This booth] is our attempt to get them to know what the LP stands for."


