# The Law

What is the law? Is it the myriad of codes, rules and regulations that swamp our daily lives? Is it the written law legislated by politicians who, many times, have no regard for any constitution? Ultimately, is the law what the United States Constitution says, or what the Supreme Court says it says? On all the above, I think not. Ultimately, the law is what twelve jurors says it is or one juror says it isn't.

The last check and balance of a free people on those

that govern them (besides the Declaration of Independence option) is that of jury nullification,—the right and responsibility of individual jurors to decide if a law is just or unjust according to their conscience, irrespective of what "the law" may be. It only takes one juror of twelve not to convict.

Think of the implications for freedom. Every prospective

juror determines justice according to his conscience instead of rubberstamping the law as the judge directs.

To inform people of this traditional right and responsibility is what the Fully Informed Jury Amendment (FIJA) is all about.


As was reported in the October issue, Larry Dodge, Libertarian from Montana, is leading this endeavor to enlighten the nation on jury nullification. He reports that in eighteen states, preliminary filings have been made to proceed with getting FIJA on the ballot.

The FIJA movement is a no-lose proposition. Jurors already have the right to nullify unjust laws according to conscience. But judges routinely instruct jurors on the opposite. This amendment would force judges to instruct jurors on the right of jury nullification. But even if the amendment loses, freedom fighters will still have won. The education process of proposing the amendment will inform countless prospective jurors of their right. If this initiative becomes national in prominence, judges no longer will be able to run roughshod on freedom fighters.

This initiative has a great chance on becoming a popular movement. Consider all the groups that would benefit from a fully informed jury: Tax resisters, draft resisters, pro choice groups, pro life groups, gun advocates, entrepreneurs stifled by regulation, alternative health practitioners, home educators, midwives, NORML, and petty

It seems to me that with all these people on our side, getting enough signatures to put FIJA on the ballot should be no problem at all. In Illinois, we can only propose an advisory referendum, but that's all right. The process of getting on the ballot and engaging in argument for FIJA will become a successful educational project in of itself. I am organizing a FIJA initiative in this state. Please let me know

### The Sanction of the Victim

Libertarians claim that there is more out there than just the left-right spectrum. They claim that the political spectrum looks, in fact, like a diamond divided into four quadrants (the Nolan chart). If this is the case, the following question arises: If libertarians want people to abandon the out-moded left-right spectrum, why do they do everything in their power to further its survival?

A concept, in order to survive, must be recognized. A concept is not like a physical object which exists regardless of whether or not a human is there to perceive it. If humans stop recognizing a particular mental construct, it vanishes.

The left-right spectrum would disappear if people stopped recognizing its existence. How many times have you read an article written by a libertarian that used the terms "left" and "right" in a political context? To use these terms is to recognize the concept these terms are meant to represent—and more significantly, to deny the existence of any alternative. To a libertarian, an idea should not belong to the "left" or to the "right"; an idea is either "libertarian" or "unlibertarian".

The "left" supposedly believes in a person's "right to choose"—unless it is day care or education (or drugs) that one is choosing. The "right" believes in "freedom"—unless it concerns the freedom to view pornography or compete against established companies (or take drugs). Countries ruled by the "right" are headed by generals who put down labor movements—unless the country happens to be Poland. A political party sponsored by a labor movement belongs to the "left"—unless it is in Argentina. Whether you are a "leftist" or a "rightist", sympathizing with Palestinians depends upon your view of capitalism. If you oppose pornography you are a "rightist" unless you are a feminist in which case you are a "leftist". Latin American countries dominated by the military and headed by a uniformed dictator are "right-wing"—unless the country is Cuba.

Libertarians desperately want their ideology to be recognized and respected by the American public. The best way this can be realized is by encouraging new ways of classifying ideas. Events or ideas should be described either as libertarian or unlibertarian or not classified at all.

## 'Statistiganda' on Drugs

Mr. Rassbach may very well be a victim of government-handout statistical propaganda (see "Crosstalk," July 31, page 26).

True: England's registered addicts more than doubled from about 1964 to about 1967 (during the period of the "experiment" that was tried and didn't work). But Rassbach left out or didn't know the actual figures and from whence they came.

A Madame Frankau operated a clinic for opiate addicts who wanted help. She supplied them with maintenance amounts daily, required them to seek gainful employment and counseled them to not associate with other addicts. There was to be no forced withdrawal.

Word of this program spread to Canada and the United States. Over 400 American and Canadian addicts, who had plenty of trouble with the law, entered her clinic, complied with her terms and became peaceful, productive members of the community. These immigrants were the means by which England's "addicts more than doubled"—a total of little more than 800 addicts! Hardly a cause for hysteria.

But by 1968, as a result of U.S. Commissioner of Narcotics, Harry J Anslinger's statistiganda and incitement, the whole lot of Canadians and Americans were deported. Then came the strict, ruthless anti-narcotics criminal statutes of 1970. From then until now, the narcotic addict population has grown to an estimated 500,000 to 1 million.

So, the "experiment" which didn't work really did work; it cleaned up the lives of over 400 people with little more than common-sense humane treatment. The threat of jail has dirtied the lives of millions—not just addicts.

Viewed vis-a-vis the history of civilization, the experiment that doesn't work is prohibition. It took patients out from under the care of their physicians and left them to their own devices in the streets. Incidentally, the deportees to the United States and Canada resumed a life of crime to "enjoy" their habits.

The sooner government relinquishes jurisdiction over "public health," the sooner this society will regain its health.

#### **Paul Jacob Hired**

The Tax Accountability Amendment petition drive has received a major boost in its campaign to fulfill the requirement of 266,000 signatures by signing on Mr. Paul Jacob as the coordinator in the petition drive. Paul Jacob recently resigned as Field Coordinator for ballot access of the National Libertarian Party. Paul is also well-known for his courageous stand against draft registration for his refusal to register, and his subsequent jail term.

As was reported in our August issue, the tax Accountability Amendment is a binding statewide initiative which if passed would require a three-fifths majority of both houses to pass any tax increase. The amendment requires a two week notice to the public before tax increases can be approved by revenue committees. Another requirement mandates that no politician may serve more than four consecutive years on a tax committee in Springfield.

## Clarification


