■ WHO CAN ATTEND?

(Most states have not yet filled out their entire delegate slates. So there's still plenty of time for you to contact your state party leadership for information on becoming a delegate. ■ WHEN IS IT?

Official Convention business is scheduled for July 2 to 5, 1998

(Thursday to Sunday). But Jerry Russell's "Grass Roots Campaigning" seminar is on Wednesday (July 1), and the Convention kick-off party is Wednesday night.





CONVENTION SPEAKERS AND EVENTS

Enjoy an all-star line-up of libertarian speakers!



JACOB HORNBERGER

He gave the electrifying Keynote Address at the party's '96 convention, and is also the president of the uncompromising Future of Freedom Foundation.



SHARON HARRIS

President of the Advocates for Self-Government — a nonpartisan group that teaches Libertarians how to be more effective communicators.



MICHAEL CLOUD

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Creator of the "Art of Political Persuasion" audio tape series and one of the LP's most eloquent, popular speakers.



FINLAY ROTHHAUS

In 1992, he became one of four elected Libertarian State Representatives in New Hampshire — and he's still in office, as a Selectman in Merrimack.



WALKER CHANDLER

He went to the Supreme Court in 1997— and won. Representing himself, Chandler overturned a Georgia law requiring candidate drug testing.

he Capitol Steps will bring their unique brand of musical comedy to the LP's National Convention on Thursday, July 2nd. Former Capitol Hill staffers with a talent for singing and satire, the Capitol Steps have become a "must-see" in the nation's capital, and have appeared on numerous TV and radio programs.

SHELLEY DAVIS

She's #1 on the IRS's hit list. After seven years as the IRS's historian, she blew the whistle on the feared agency with her book, Unbridled Power.



ROY INNIS

As National Chairman of the Congress of Racial Equality, he's a leading figure in the American civil rights

movement—but is better known for his outspoken and controversial *anti*-affirmative action, *pro*-Second Amendment, and *pro*-personal responsibility positions.



TANYA METAKSA

She's the "voice" of the National Rifle Association. As the Director of the NRA's Institute for Legisla-

tive Action, Metaksa works to protect gun rights in the state and federal legislative arena. She's also the author of *Safe Not Sorry*, a woman's self-protection book.



DAN GIFFORD

With his wife Amy Gifford, he's the producer of the Academy Award-nominated documentary *Waco*:

The Rules of Engagement, which paints a devastating picture of out-of-control federal agents at Waco. The movie will be shown, followed by a Q&A session with the Giffords.

TIM SLAGLE

He's been called "provocative and damn funny." He "fights a never-ending battle for truth, Liberty, and the American way" while sneaking barbed libertarian insights among his comedy gems. He's comedian Tim Slagle, and the Twin City Reader newspaper called him a "droll, flag-burnin', politically incorrect satirist. Slagle's delivery is matter-offact yet plenty polished, his arguments are more consistently rational than most you'll hear



and abundant."

He's a top-rated talk show host on New York's WABC — and a wry stand-up comedian who specializes in "irreverent, nonconformist" commentary.



MICHAEL Tanner

One of the nation's leading experts on privatizing Social Security, and Director of Health & Welfare Studies at the nonpartisan Cato Institute.



BARBARA GOUSHAW

Founder and head of the Libertarian Campaign Managers Association in Michigan and campaign manager for Jon Coon's U.S. Senate race (1994).




GENE BURNS

Named the "Best Radio Talk Show Host in America," he broadcasts his mellifluous libertarian opinions from KGO in San Francisco.



FRED COLLINS

Elected member of the Berkley (Michigan) City Council, he won office by focusing on three issues: Taxes, regulation, and "volunteerizing" city activities.



HARRY BROWNE

The Libertarian Party's 1996 candidate for president, best-selling author of 10 books (including *Why Government Doesn't Work*), public speaker, and world-renowned investment advisor. As the LP's presidential candidate, he appeared on more than 500 radio and TV programs, earned over 100 endorsements, and won the party's second-highest vote total ever: 485,759 votes.

CHARLES MURRAY

The author of two of the most influential libertarian books of this generation: *Losing Ground*, the devastating

and exhaustively researched expose of the destructiveness of government welfare, and What It Means to Be A Libertarian, which outlined how liberty creates a "civil society."



ROBERT POOLE

He founded the influential free-market Reason Foundation and helped make "privatization" — both the revo-

lutionary concept and the word itself — part of contemporary political discourse across the USA and around the world, thanks to his classic book, *Cutting Back City Hall*.



DAVID BOAZ

Executive vice president of the prestigious and hard-hitting Cato Institute and the author of the book, *Liber*-

tarianism: A Primer — described as a "bracing shot of 100-proof libertarianism" that generated widespread critical acclaim when it was published last year.
