

Rep. McClarin resigns in NH

The Libertarian Party's recently elected New Hampshire State Rep. Jim McClarin has resigned his office.

McClarin moved to another town in the state, and "that disqualifies me from representing the district," he said. "I had, initially, some hope of holding on to the seat, but the more I got into it, the worse idea that seemed."

State legislators in New Hampshire are required to tend to government business about three days a week, but receive only \$100 per year for their services. McClarin found his political obligations to be a severe burden on his personal affairs.

"I lost a lot of ground economically—financially—and I really need to get my nose to the grindstone and get back in the flow of things here," he said.

McClarin said that most members of the state party seemed to be quite accepting of his decision to resign, "not happy, but they understand that the necessities of life sometimes require people to move," he said.

"We are obviously disappointed," said Jeff Emery, state LP chair. "It's difficult to elect Libertarians, and when we do elect one it is a source of great pride to the party. But you cannot serve a district if you move outside of it—that's pretty straightforward. The resignation was handled quite honorably, as you would expect it to be done, and Jim has done that at this point."

McClarin's resignation leaves Rep. Don Gorman as the sole Libertarian Party representative in the state house, for the present.

"It's not going to keep Don Gorman from having fun. He's a one-man dynamo," said McClarin.

The state party is planning to contest not only the race for McClarin's seat, but also several other seats that have come open since the November election. With 400 members in the state house, it is not unusual for personal situations to cause vacancies.

"Right now there are three vacancies just since the November elections," said Emery, "and whenever a special election comes up we look for a Libertarian candidate."

Reaction

LP Challenge gets rise from GOP

Republican Party leaders have quietly issued instructions to House members to ignore the Libertarian Party's Challenge to the Republicans, according to inside sources on Capitol Hill.

Reportedly, the GOP's influential Congressional Campaign Committee (CCC) urged Republican congressman to disregard the LP's 21-item "hit list" of federal programs, agencies, and policies to abolish.

"Don't take the Libertarians seriously because they are not capable of kicking us out of our [House] seats" is the message that Don Ernsberger said Republicans were hastily circulating on Capitol Hill in early February.

Ernsberger, a member of the LP National Committee who maintains close ties with several libertarian-leaning congressmen and their staffs, said conversations with several Republican House staffers confirmed the story.

"It was scuttlebutt that everyone was talking about [in the Capitol Building]," he said. "[They said] the message had come down from the Congressional Campaign Committee. They knew about the Challenge."

Steve Dasbach, national chair of the Libertarian Party, said these reports clearly show the Challenge has "struck a nerve" with the GOP.

"If they weren't concerned, they would have ignored us as they have in the past," he said.

"In past elections, when Republicans didn't stand up for less government, Libertarians have cost them their seats," Dasbach noted. "Now that they've been elected on a plat-

form of less government, if they fail to cut the size of government, they could face increasing numbers of angry voters in 1996. Of course they're nervous."

Dasbach said even Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich understands this. "He's the one who said, 'If this just degenerates back into the usual baloney of politics in Washington, then the American people will move towards a third party in a massive way,' " quoted Dasbach.

The Challenge to the Republicans—delivered to GOP leaders in January—demanded that Republicans live up to their 1994 campaign promises, and "drastically reduce the size of the federal government."

The LP's 21-item "hit list" featured economic issues, pork barrel projects, personal freedom issues, and foreign policy. It included Amtrak, the Selective Service, the Davis

WSJ highlights LP growth and libertarianism's growing appeal

The Wall Street Journal featured the Libertarian Party and the "growing appeal" of libertarianism on the front page of the Jan. 20, 1995, issue. The lengthy article was written by WSJ staff reporter Gerald F. Seib and subtitled, "When the Government Fails, Many Voters Are Asking: Who Needs It, Anyway?" The following excerpts demonstrate once again the realization of many that the libertarian philosophy is rapidly gaining popularity with the American public.

It just might be that Bill Frezza, not Newt Gingrich, best illustrates why the American political system is quaking.

Mr. Frezza, a onetime McGovern Democrat, today is a libertarian. This Philadelphia-area computer consultant doesn't just want to cut government: He questions the very need for most of it... "Government isn't simply irrelevant," he says, "it's *totally* irrelevant."


... Though many voters probably don't even realize it, much of the angry sentiment coursing through their veins today isn't traditionally Republican or even conservative. It's libertarian...

Because of their growing disdain for government, more and more Americans appear to be drifting—often unwittingly—toward a libertarian philosophy. That seems particularly true among baby boomers returning to the "do your own thing" ethos of their youth and among young people involved in the intensely independent computer industry. Indeed, when the Gallup polling organization last year asked questions about government's role that were designed to distill Americans' political philosophies, it categorized 22 percent of the public as "libertarian"...

A true libertarian would do away with laws banning marijuana and hard drugs. . . Many libertarians would like to see Social Security become voluntary. Libertarians see little need for foreign entanglements, so they see ways to pare defense spending.

Some of these ideas are too rich for the blood of even

antigovernment Republicans, not to mention middle-ofthe-roaders. "I do not for a moment pretend to believe that what is taking place in the Republican Party has any semblance of libertarianism," asserts Gordon Black, a politically indepen-



dent pollster who considers himself a "free-market civil libertarian". . .

Some Americans, no doubt, are drifting toward libertarian thinking because of careful analysis. "People are starting to at least consider the idea that many of their problems come when they start thinking of the government as their own agent of change, or their major agent of change," says Gregg Gaylord, an Indiana physician and Jimmy Carter voter who now regards himself as a libertarian.

But since many Americans don't spend all that much time analyzing their political beliefs, it is likely that much of today's antigovernment sentiment arises from what people see as the government's trial and error: Voters feel government has tried to solve problems but has been inefficient or ineffective in doing so. "It's not doctrinaire," says J.D. Hayworth, a freshman GOP lawmaker from Arizona, as he analyzes his constituents' views. "It's inherently practical."

Many analysts, in fact, think it was President Clinton's ill-fated health-care reform proposals, widely supported at first but gradually abandoned by many voters, that sparked a rethinking of government's role. "People were saying,

Bacon Act, the latest gun ban, "War On Drugs" civil liberties violations, and U.N. military expenses.

Ernsberger said the quick GOP reaction to the Challenge was unusual. "It has been reacted to more credibly than things we've done before," he agreed.

Ernsberger said the CCC obviously was trying to reassure new GOP congressmen that they didn't have to cut government as aggressively as the Libertarian Party proposed. "They're trying to paint us as way overboard [compared to their] go-slow approach," he said.

However, despite the CCC's recommendations, Ernsberger said the Challenge may inspire many Republicans to be more vigorous in their efforts to reduce govern-

"I think there's a lot of Republicans who feel comfortable slashing away at agencies when there is another group advocating more slashing. It makes them feel more moderate," he said.

Meanwhile, in Florida, the Challenge generated an unusually positive response from a staff member of a new GOP con-

Phillip Hackenberg, vice chair of the LP of Escambia County, said he received a call on Feb. 13 from the head of Congressman Joe Scarborough's (R-FL) local Pensacola office. Hackenberg had faxed a copy of the Challenge to the office earlier that week.

congressman's office]," reported Hackenberg. "He also wanted to know what the total cost of the pork barrel projects was."


Hackenberg said he sensed the Challenge was having an impact. "I feel that if [the congressman's staff] wants to put it up on the wall, he plans to do something with

On the media front, the LP is publicizing the Challenge as widely as possible, and party representatives already have appeared on more than 50 radio stations around the country to promote it, including WELI in New Haven, CT; WMAL in Washington, DC; and WNDB in Daytona Beach, FL.

"The reception from the talk show hosts has been overwhelmingly positive," said LP Director of Communications Bill Winter. "And there seems to be a general skepticism from the callers that the Republicans will live up to their promises. They seem to appreciate that we're putting pressure on them."

Dasbach said the popularity may stem from the fact that the LP was careful to select only "politically feasible" items for the Challenge.

"Yes, there are worse examples of government waste and bigger ticket government programs we could have selected," he said. "But we didn't want the GOP to be able to dismiss this as a frivolous wish list. Our criteria was simple: Was legislation introduced in the House or Senate within the past two years to abolish, reduce, or defund this program? That's why the Republicans can't run from our Challenge.'

WA LP issues own challenge to GOP

The Washington State Libertarian Party recently announced its Contract with Republicans. The contract states that the Libertarian Party will expect the newly elected Republicans in the state's delegation to abide by their campaign promises to limit government, or else face Libertarian Party opponents in the next election.

While all the Republicans are targeted with the contract, the Libertarians are particularly addressing freshmen Congressmen Randy Tate, George Nethercutt, and Rick White. The three Republicans were each elected to the U.S. House with extremely narrow margins.

"One of the reasons they won is that the Libertarians decided not to run candidates in those races," said Jim Campton, the chair of the state Libertarian Party. "Libertarian candidates draw their votes mostly from Republican voters, and therefore would have certainly spoiled at least two of those races for the Republican candidates."

The Libertarian Party stayed out of those and other races in order to give fiscal conservatives the best chance at defeating the Democratic incumbents, but now they will make sure that state Republicans come through on their campaign promises.

"We will be watching them very closely," Campton said. "If they do not work hard to reduce taxes, regulations, spending, and the government's assault on the Bill of Rights, we will run candidates against them in 1996. And if the political dynamics are similar to this year, they will certainly lose."

Libertarians who ran in senate races in Arizona (receiving 6.8 percent of the vote), Missouri (4.6 percent), Michigan (4.2 percent), and Hawaii (4 percent), among others, illustrate that similar performances by Libertarian candidates in Washington state would have meant at least three fewer Republicans heading for Congress.

"Now that the Republicans have solid control of Congress, they have no excuses," Campton said. "We respect their victory and the gamble they took in putting their Contract With America on the table. We hope it was not just a campaign gimmick or the American people will reject them as they rejected the Democrats. Our role as Libertarians is to show them a more free-market, limited-government path than they have typically followed. Our contract with them means we'll be holding them to their libertarian rhetoric. If they don't live up to it, our contract is that we will run Libertarians against them next time, especially those who won by less than 5 percent this

International news

Over the past six months the International Society for Individual Liberty (ISIL) has been working with Dr. Rigoberto Stewart of Alajuela, Costa Rica, regarding the founding of a libertarian movement in his country.

ISIL President Vince Miller reports that Stewart and his associates have formed a libertarian party called "Movimiento Libertario" and a thinktank called the "Institute for Liberty and Analysis of Policy and Government" (INLAP)

Stewart says that his group chose the name "Movimiento Libertario" to align their party with the international libertarian movement.

Stewart reports that the new party has received very positive press coverage in his country.

ers in the state jumped from 2,909 to 3,585 an increase of more than 23 percent. Among the more impressive countywide increases were: Okaloosa, 41 to 100; Escambia, 44 to 83; Sarasota, 47 to 76; Lee, 73 to 102; and Palm Beach, 118 to 161. Impressive increases in less populous counties included Columbia, 1 to 13; Indian River, 7 to 14; and Osceola, 11 to 25.

Voters registered with a minor party in Florida lose the right to vote in either major party's primary election, and there has never been a strong third-party political trend in Florida history. In light of these factors, the increased number of registered Libertarians is all the more welcome and unexpected.

➤ Irma Lanning, chair, and Eric Glumpe, vice chair, of the Manatee County LP have increased LP registered voters by more than 52 percent in less than a year since the affiliate was founded. Lanning has been giving presentations on "What is Libertarianism" to local high school Amercian government classes and groups such as "Dads Supporting Dads" and "For the People." Glumpe has been attending weekly meetings of "For the People," as well as gun owner group meetings.

The LP affiliate's monthly meetings have more non-libertarians than Libertarians attending, according to Lanning. Lanning said those non-libertarians attending are "seeking Libertarians' viewpoints and a clarification of principles."

Georgia

The Cobb County LP lost the first round of legal action in its attempt to have a \$513 million sales tax election overthrown. But Cobb Libertarians say the fight has just

In December, a judge rejected the party's suit, saying it should have passed through the state ethics commission first. The group says the election was illegally tainted when the county government inserted pro-tax propaganda in water bills mailed to 117,000 Cobb residents.

"I feel sure that when we can get a ruling on the actual issues of the case," said Sharon Harris, Cobb County chair, "we will get this election overturned and the tax thrown out.'

Hawaii

Libertarian U.S. Senate candidate Dick Rowland lost to his Republican opponent by a mere 1.8 percent in a statewide mock election held in all government and private high schools. Dubbed Prepvote '94, the election ballot was accompanied by an informational booklet in which all candidates for statewide office were asked to state their positions and make their case.

While the Democrats did well in all the federal contests, Republicans performed miserably across the board.

"If these students turn into real voters, Libertarians can take heart in the future," said Larry Bartley, state party vice chair. "The Republican mainland juggernaut sank off the coast of California. Republicans should re-evaluate their hopes of ever making a dent in Hawaii politics.'

State party members have been getting a good response by setting up outreach booths at gun shows across the state. Booths were set up in Chanute and Holton recently, and efforts are planned for gun shows in Seneca and Hays this month. For more information, call 800-335-1776.

Michigan

Jeff Grund, of Jackson, and the LP's 1994 Jackson County Commission candidate, has been appointed to the South Central Michigan Substance Abuse Advisory Council. Grund applied for the position, which involves oversight of substance abuse treatment.

"I see this as a way to monitor how

taxpayer dollars are spent and to lobby quietly for drug legalization," Grund said.

Missouri

➤ In mid-January, the Kansas City Metro Libertarian Club hosted a candidate question-and-answer period among the three candidates for mayor of Kansas City. None of the three candidates is Libertarian. The gathering received coverage in several newspapers as well as on television news.

"I think that if we really apply ourselves we could pick up a seat or two in the special elections," said McClarin. "These things come up rapidly, and the other parties don't have much time to prepare for them. If we got a good candidate and some money behind him, I think we could pick it up."

McClarin said he understands the disappointment others feel about his leaving office, but personally the disappointment is not so great.

"I signed up as a paper candidate," he said. "It was only after seeing that the Republicans left a wide opening there that I decided this was too good an opportunity

for the party to pass up. So I went for it. But it was not my personal goal to be elected. That has not contributed to my move for turning loose of the seat, but I suppose all it means at this point is that I don't feel a great sense of personal loss, but I feel bad from a partisan standpoint that we've chopped our delegation in half once more."

McClarin, who also acts as newsletter editor for the state party, is also looking for someone to replace him in that role.

The essence of liberty

What is it that really makes one a libertarian?

BY DAVID F. NOLAN

As a founder of the Libertarian Party and editor-in-chief of California Liberty, I am often asked how to tell if someone is "really" a libertarian. This question has arisen more often than usual in the past few months, as more and more politicians are starting to use libertarian-sounding rhetoric—and it's a point worth raising.

There are probably as many different definitions of the word "libertarian" as there are people who claim the label. These range from overly broad ("anyone who calls himself a libertarian is one") to impossibly doctrinaire ("only those who agree with every word in the party platform are truly anointed"). My own definition is that in order to be considered a libertarian, at least in the political context, an individual must adhere without compromise to five key

Ideally, of course, we'd all be in agreement on everything. But we're not, and probably never will be. Debate is likely to continue indefinitely on such matters as abortion, foreign policy, and whether, when, and how various government programs can be discontinued or privatized. But as far as I'm concerned, if someone is sound on these five points, he/she is de facto a libertarian; if he fails on even one of the five,

What, then, are the "indispensable five"—the points of no compromise?

You Own Yourself

First and foremost, libertarians believe in the principle of self-ownership. You own your own body and mind; no external power has the right to force you into the service of "society" or "mankind" or any other individual or group for any purpose, however noble. Slavery is wrong, period.

Because you own yourself, you are responsible for your own well-being. Others are not obligated to feed you, clothe you, or provide you with health care. Most of us choose to help one another voluntarily, for a variety of reasons—and that's as it should be-but "forced compassion" is an oxymoron, a contradiction in terms.

The Right to Self-Defense

Self-ownership implies the right to selfdefense. Libertarians yield to no one in their support for our right as individuals to keep and bear arms. We wish only that the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution said, "The right to self-defense being inalienable . . . " instead of that stuff about a "well-regulated militia." Anyone who thinks that government—any govern-

ment—has the right to disarm its citizens is NOT a libertarian!

No "Criminal Possession"


In fact, libertarians believe that individuals have the right to own and use anything-gold, guns, marijuana, sexually explicit material—so long as they do not harm others through force or the threat of force. Laws criminalizing the simple possession of anything are tailor-made for police states; it is all too easy to plant a forbidden substance in someone's home, car, or pocket. Libertarians are as tough on crime—real crime—as anyone. But criminal possession laws are an affront to liberty, whatever the rhetoric used to defend them.

No Taxes on Productivity

In an ideal world, there would be no taxation. All services would be paid for on an as-used basis. But in a less-than-ideal world, some services will be force-financed for the foreseeable future. However, not all taxes are equally deleterious, and the worst form of taxation is a tax on productivity i.e. an "income" tax-and no libertarian supports this type of taxation.


What kind of taxation is least harmful? This is a topic still open for debate. My own preference is for a single tax on land, with landholders doing their own valuation; you'd state the price at which you'd be willing to sell your land, and pay taxes on that amount. Anyone (including the tax

collector) who wanted to buy it at that price could do so. This is simple, fair, and minimizes government snooping into our lives and business. Is this "the" libertarian position on taxes? No. But all libertarians oppose any form of income tax.



WE CAN CUT WELFARE, DEFENSE, WHATEVER,

The fifth and final key test of anyone's claim to being a libertarian is their support for an honest money system; i.e. one where the currency is backed by something of true value (usually gold or silver). Fiat money-money with no backing, whose acceptance is mandated by the State—is simply legalized counterfeiting and is one



Conclusion

The five points enumerated here are not a complete, comprehensive prescription for freedom... but they would take us most of the way. A government which cannot conscript, confiscate, or counterfeit, and which imposes no criminal penalties for the mere possession and peaceful use of anything, is one that almost all libertarians would be comfortable with.

LP Chair Dasbach blasts Clinton's annual message

President Bill Clinton has finally acknowledged the most serious problem facing America—but still doesn't have a clue what to do about it, said the Libertarian Party.

"In his State of the Union speech, Clinton said what Libertarians have been saying for years—that government doesn't work, said LP National Chair Steve Dasbach. "Unfortunately, his solution was just more government programs, draped in flowery New Covenant language.

"Clinton said, 'We have to cut yesterday's government to neip solve tomorrow's problems.' He's wrong," said Dasbach. "We have to cut today's government to solve today's problems. Libertarians know it, and the American public knows it. But all Clinton did was crudely graft libertarian-sounding rhetoric on top of his old-style big-government proposals.

"For example, Clinton said, We must not ask government to do what we should do for ourselves.' Yet, he boasted about his National Service Corps, a \$389 million program that pays people tax dollars to volunteer-something that tens of millions of Americans already do without drawing a federal paycheck.

"He acknowledged that America no longer has any significant enemies. Yet, he called for a \$25 billion increase in the mili-

"He said that government should 'help people raise their incomes immediately by lowering their taxes'—but didn't offer to repeal his own record-snattering tax in-

"He said he 'would never infringe on the right to keep and bear arms.' Yet, he boasted about his support for the semi-automatic weapons ban, which clearly violates the Second Amendment.

"He said that his 'test for any proposal is: Will it create jobs?' Yet, he proposed an increase in the minimum wage. The last hike in the minimum wage threw at least 240,000 teenagers out of work.

"He said we must end the 'illusion that there is somehow a program for every problem'—then proposed a new government job training program, defended his \$40 billion Mexico bail-out, said the debtridden Social Security program wouldn't be touched, said we should force television stations to give free air time to politicians, proposed the creation of a Big Brother-type national worker identification data bank, and threatened a 'step-by-step' government campaign to control health care," said

"It's clear that Clinton's timid reforms and false libertarian language won't be enough to put out the anti-government fire that's sweeping the country," said Dasbach.

'His State of the Union speech did not deliver what the American public really wanted. The American people want the government cut-not reformed, re-invented, or repackaged."

there's also no pressure to keep the cost under control. This is what the government does, and in a massive way, every single day."

While Clinton's efforts were defeated, the GOP did not cover itself with glory. Libertarians did, and should, lead the fight for free-market health care. Jon Talton, business editor of *The Cincinnati Enquirer*, decried the "fundamental dishonesty of the health-care debate":

"For most Republicans, the dishonesty consisted of a pathological unwillingness to raise. . . questions. Some Republicans are convinced that the American people really do want socialism. But in the health debate, the people bridled at the Clinton plan as more details emerged. Where were their free-market tribunes? Not in the Grand Old Party. As we prepare for the Second Battle of Health Care, the time has come for a more modest view of reform. We have the best health-care system in the world. But we have problems of raising costs and

availability of insurance (not care). Reform must address these problems. Reform's intellectual basis should be truly market-based. When insurance companies, HMOs, and government pay for everything, demand will always rise."

Virtually all sides of the health care debate agreed that people with pre-existing conditions should not be denied health insurance. But there is a major problem with this, as columnist Tony Snow points out:

"The second reform, coverage of preexisting conditions, invites people to avoid getting insurance until they need care. After all, why should a healthy person buy a policy when doctors and insurance companies have to patch up everyone who gets sick? This approach makes irresponsible behavior not only cost-free but economically sensible. It creates an enormous temptation for people not to take care of themselves."

Snow thinks the GOP can overcome its reticence on this issue, but Libertarians know how hard it will be:

"Health care's future depends on the GOP. A fair number of Republicans won't oppose low-income subsidies or coverage of existing conditions because they don't want to be perceived as coldhearted. But if there's anything worse than a Scrooge, it's a coward who will do anything—even saddle workers with an expensive, ineffective medical system—to avoid being called bad names."

Issue: Immigration

The names of prominent political and social commentators can be found on both sides of the immigration debate, but there is nevertheless a substantial consensus of scholarly opinion of whether or not immigrants constitute a net economic gain for the U.S. Among distinguished economists there appears to be little doubt that immigration into this country does more good than harm.

"In 1990 the Cato Institute surveyed 38 prominent economists, including past presidents of the American Economics Association, former members of the President's Council of Economic Advisers, and seven Nobel laureates in economics. Of these distinguished economists, 70 percent said that illegal immigrants 'have a positive economic impact,' and 63 percent supported raising immigration quotas. This pro-immigration consensus didn't split along tra-

ditional lines; both Milton Friedman and John Kenneth Galbraith favor liberalized immigration quotas.

The freedom to immigrate can be defended not only on practical economic grounds but also can be defended as a matter of principle. The following excerpt suggests that immigration should be considered a basic human right:

"Because it is missing from the list of recognized human rights, immigration has almost no rules of acceptable discourse. With the partial exception of the right to political asylym, it is not illegitimate for a minister to say that he or she advocates 'zero immigration'—as did French Interior Minister Charles Pasqua last year.

[Y]ou do not have to believe in the unfettered power of ideology or logic to believe that part of the problem is the almost universal failure to regard the freedom to move as a basic human right. If there existed a country in which various ethnic groups lived and in which the richest and most powerful group divided the country into ethnic areas and forbade the poorer, less powerful groups to enter the provileged groups' areas, then there is a good chance that it would be declared a pariah by other nations for its denial of human rights. Such a country did, until very recently, exist: South Africa under apartheid. And it was universally condemned. Yet viewed as a whole, the world is worse in these respects than South Africa under apartheid. The freedom to migrate would be an essential plank in an antiapartheid movement for the world.'

Yes, the Second Amendment is good. Private guns are good. A trained citizen militia is good. But the government supplying guns and training is not necessary.

Initiative

The national LP, with the help of all LP members, must do initiative petitions in the states that have them since there is a minimal "realistic" chance in almost all states to elect LP members to state legislatures or the U.S. Congress (i.e., the offices with the power to repeal statist laws).

Obvious general-issue type petitions include equal ballot access requirements for all candidates for the same office, the use of multi-member districts and proportional representation in electing state and local legislative bodies (to give LP legislative candidates a "realistic" chance to be elected), and non-partisan nomination and election of all elective executive and judicial officers (to reduce partisan discrimination against the LP).

Single-issue type petitions include limiting or cutting taxes or limiting or repealing any of the numerous statist laws referred to in the LP platform.

Voting

In our age of sophisticated electronics and communications, I would propose that we initiate a system of voting tied to the telephone and registration rules now in place. 

constitute a major threat to private property, but it also actually causes many varieties of animal life to be more endangered than they would have been if the ESA had never existed in the first place.

"The current Endangered Species Act is terribly destructive. It gives the Fish and Wildlife Service complete control of anyone's land if Fish and Wildlife officials think the land might help an endangered animal species. The owner who must give up use of the land gets nothing in return...

"The Fish and Wildlife Service faces no budget constraint on the number of acres it can control in the name of endangered species, so it always wants more.

"Millions of acres have been closed to logging, farming, or development, many of them to protect a single species, the northern spotted owl. And application of the law has barely begun.

"In addition to being unfair to people, the Endangered Species Act is a disaster for the species at risk.

"Trees that might attract a listed bird are cut down. Brush that might provide cover is cleared. Too often, a landowner who sights a listed animal on his or her property chooses to 'shoot, shovel, and shut up.' Listed animals become the enemy."

"Because it can deny landowners all use of their property if it is home to a listed species, the act has created perverse incentives among landowners:

• Owners destroy habitat attractive to listed species before they can migrate there

• They destroy the habitat of species that have been proposed for listing.

• Sometimes landowners even kill members of listed species before federal authorities can find them and declare the property critical habitat. . .

"Many of the ranchers do value diversity. But as the costs of the ESA grow, they're coming to view wildlife as a threat. People who could be allies of environmentalists are being turned into enemies,' [P.J. Hill, Montana rancher and senior associate at the Political Economy Research Center] said...

"The ESA is the most antiwildlife, antibiodiversity piece of legislation on the books,' said Robert J. Smith, senior environmental scholar at the free-market oriented Competitive Enterprise Institute and a past president of the New Jersey Audubon Society."

Wussiocracy on the Hill

Once again those stumbling morons in the Republican Party have blundered into a manhole, and this time they're going to pull the rest of the country in with them.

What they solemnly promised us all last

year, in their much-vaunted "Contract with America", was

a balanced budget amendment to the United States Constitution that would necessitate drastic reductions in federal spending—and at the same time steer well clear of increases in what each of us is forced at metaphorical as well as literal bayonet-point to send the government for the dubious service of curtailing our lives, liberty, and property more and more each year. The budget should be balanced, the Republican consensus seemed to be, but not on the taxpayers' backs.


Their means of assuring this was to have been a revolutionary provision in the amendment requiring a "super majority" of three-fifths—or 60 percent of the Congress—in order to increase taxes or create new ones. Some joker I was talking with while the argument plodded on in the media (a surprising lack of outraged hysteria on the part of liberals should have given us a premonition), observed that to him, a "super majority" means 100 percent.

I was inclined to agree, but willing to concede that an additional 10 percent represented significant progress—in principle if nothing else—toward the kind of unanimous consent society (or "hyperdemocracy", as Time would end up calling it) we need to become in the 21st century if we wish to survive as a single nation. For that matter, America would be significantly improved if it took two-thirds—or 67 percent—to pass *any* kind of law at all.

I don't suppose anybody should have been surprised when the Republican "revolutionaries" couldn't quite muster the votes at the last minute and the revolution didn't happen. Call me a cynic, but it was almost certainly never meant to. And the proof, should you require any, is that, instead of simply acknowledging their failure and starting all over again, they adopted some Democrat's bill that—the minute it becomes clear that the budget isn't going to balance in any particular year-gives them AN EXCUSE THEY'LL CLAIM WE WANTED THEM TO HAVE to raise our taxes until the budget is balanced, no matter how much doing that costs each and every one of us, financially or in terms of civil liber-

In short, what we seem to have gotten instead of the balanced budget amendment we demanded, is a "license to kill" for the Internal Revenue Service.

There is absolutely nothing about this to be taken lightly, in America's post-Branch Davidian era, at a time when depraved cretins in the Democratic Party have just introduced legislation creating a "Rapid Deployment Force" for the ever-popular Federal Bureau of Investigation—or as they're known in these parts, "Fundamentalist Baby Incinerators". "Let a hundred Wacos bloom" seems to be the underlying thinking (to the extent there is any) behind a scheme like this.



If I strain your credulity, then meditate upon a friend of mine who was informed a few years ago at a coin show—by a pair of IRS agents—that his charmingly quaint views about the Constitution were obsolete, and that, in today's America, the tax code takes precedence over the Bill of Rights.

Now contemplate a time, in the not-toodistant future, when Congress is up against it at the end of the year. Americans are hard-pressed, already forking over half of what they earn to federal, state, and local governments, and they're starting to get sullen about it.

"Balance the budget" the Constitution commands, "or you're breaking the law." Not that any congressman has ever cared about the Constitution before this, or worried much about breaking the law. But under these circumstances—which is to say, given this excuse, and the precedent currently being established for the FBI—it isn't hard to envision them creating an INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE RAPID DEPLOYMENT FORCE to scour the land in tanks, helicopters, and black nylon uni-

forms, whipping the muzzles of their assault rifles, flame-throwers, and grenade launchers this way and that, night-vision goggles aglow on the lookout for taxable assets.

And all because the budget "must" be balanced, under this idiotic substitute for a decent balanced budget amendment, without any safeguard making it impossible to do that simply by raising taxes.

Damn it, I want my money back—actually, what I want back is my *vote*. Despite my better judgment last November, I voted for two Republicans, and now I'm sorry I didn't just "cast a blank", since there were no Libertarians running for those offices. I'll certainly never vote for a Republican again. Their "revolution"—just like their courage and dedication to principle—is counterfeit.

Republicans: Even when they win, they're losers.

'We don't want you to run our health care. And come to think of it, we don't want you to run much of anything else for us, either," says Edward Crane, president of the Cato Institute, Washington's bastion of libertarian thought. . .

Whatever the cause, the signs of a drift toward libertarianism are everywhere. When freshman Republicans attended an orientation session sponsored by the conservative Heritage Foundation, for instance, some of them immediately began complaining about a Heritage analyst's proposal to phase out farm subsidies over a period of five years. The new lawmakers didn't at all think the idea too radical. Some figured it didn't go far enough, and thus proposed a cold-turkey approach: Why not cut out the subsidies immediately?

And the tiny Libertarian Party, though widely viewed as a minor political force, has experienced an 11 percent jump in both contributors (to 20,000) and enrolled members (to 11,000) in the past year. The party still suffers from an oddball image. But Perry Willis, national director of the party, says that "the more intellectual component of our society is thinking its way

toward this. There's probably another, larger segment of American society that's stumbling its way."

Mr. Willis says the libertarian concept has particular appeal to people in the computer industry. "We have more members in one computer company in Seattle than in some whole counties, and that company is Microsoft," he says. . .

That the public wants change seems clear from the results of last fall's elections. But exactly what sort of change has yet to be spelled out. "In general, it seems like people have lost faith in government as the solution to problems in general, be they social problems or economic problems," says Jeffrey Singer, a 43-year-old general surgeon from Phoenix who considers himself a libertarian. He thinks people are now more disposed to do-it-yourself problem solving.

A sign of the times: The Libertarian Party is about to double its national staff and move out of its current, modest head-quarters on Capitol Hill. The Libertarians' new home: the Watergate office complex, the scene of the crime that brought down Richard Nixon.
