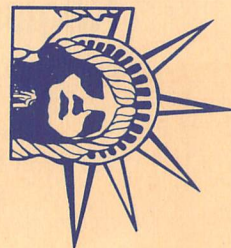
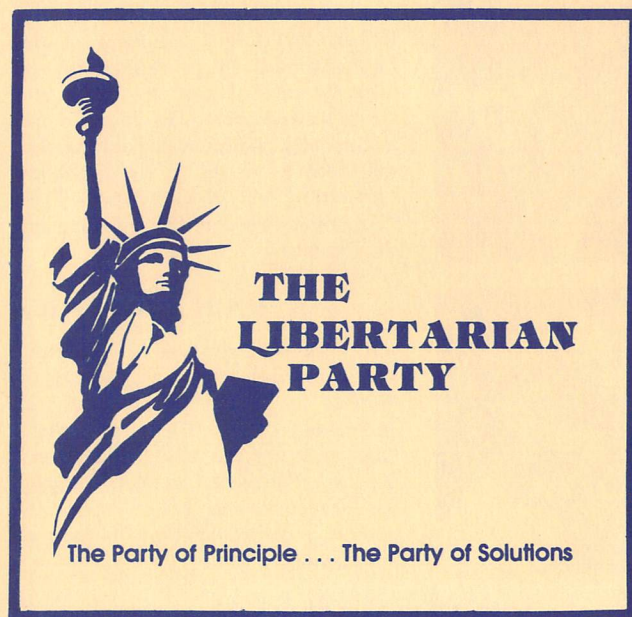

ED CLARK

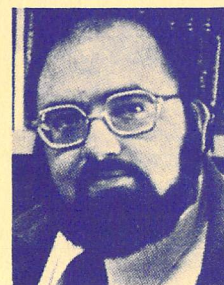
Our guest of honor and banquet speaker is Ed Clark, the 1980 Presidential Candidate of the Libertarian Party. In receiving over one percent and almost one million votes, the Clark campaign brought the libertarian message to millions of Americans for the first time and won widespread respect for its

presentation of libertarian ideas. As *Washington Post* columnist David Broder wrote: "Ed Clark and the Libertarians have had a great success in terms of their own objectives. Clark has emerged as a man of charm and conviction." Mr. Clark's book, *A New Beginning*, was hailed by columnist Nicholas Von Hoffman as "the best campaign book of 1980."



ANNE WORTHAM

Anne Wortham is presently a PhD candidate at Boston College. Her new book *The Other Side of Racism* is a study of how race consciousness is translated into public policy which violates individual rights, and is her convention subject. Ms. Wortham's work has appeared in *Esquire*, *Reason*, and *The Freeman*. She has been a researcher for NBC, ABC, *Esquire*, and the Ford Foundation.



ROY CHILDS

Roy Childs is a well known libertarian author and speaker who currently serves as Editor of *Libertarian Review*. Before joining LR he was a research associate for the Center for Libertarian Studies. His numerous essays include "An Open Letter To Ayn Rand," "Anarchism and Justice," and "Big Business and the Rise of American Statism." Mr. Childs will deliver the

keynote address and will debate Gary Greenberg on libertarian foreign policy.



JOAN KENNEDY TAYLOR

Joan Kennedy Taylor is currently Senior Editor of *Libertarian Review* where her articles appear regularly. She is a commentator on the nationally syndicated radio program *Byline* and is vice president of the Association of Libertarian Feminists. In the 1960's she founded and edited the early libertarian journal, *Persuasion*. At the Last National Convention of the Libertarian Party in 1979 she chaired the platform committee.



PETER BREGGIN, M.D.

Peter Breggin is a practicing psychiatrist in Bethesda, Maryland and also serves as Executive Director of the Center for the Study of Psychiatry. Dr. Breggin is nationally known for his libertarian critiques of psychiatry and more recently for his commentaries on communicating libertarian philosophy. He is author of numerous articles and five books including *Electroshock: It's Brain Disabling Effects* and his most recent *The Psychology of Freedom*. Dr. Breggin's Sunday breakfast speech is titled "Libertarian Principles in Everyday Life."



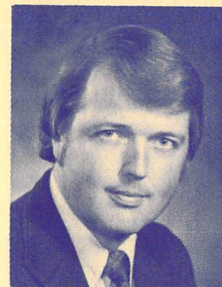
PETER FERRARA

Peter Ferrara is an honors graduate of both Harvard College and Harvard Law School. He is presently an attorney with a major New York law firm. He has been an associate of both the Cato Institute and the Center for Libertarian Studies, whose newsletter he edited for three years. His book *Social Security: The Inherent Contradiction*, explores the problems of Social Security and measures to solve them. It is also the topic of his convention talk.



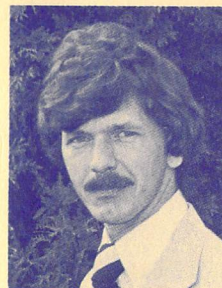
GARY GREENBERG

Gary Greenberg is a New York City trial attorney and was the Libertarian Party Candidate for Governor of New York in 1978. A longtime libertarian activist, Mr. Greenberg is currently Chairman of the New York LP and has served as a legislative assistant in Congress as well as a radio talk show host.



RICHARD WILCKE

Richard Wilcke is president of the Council for a Competitive Economy, an organization dedicated to a free and competitive economy. He founded and is currently chairman of the board of the Institute for the Study of Market Agriculture. Mr. Wilcke's topic will be "Economic Freedom: The Theory and the Practice."



JOHN ZDANOWICZ

John Zdanowicz received his PhD from Michigan State and is a Professor of Finance at Rochester Institute of Technology. In 1980 he ran as a Libertarian for the New York Assembly. Dr. Zdanowicz has been studying the economic and social effects of limited corporate liability, the topic of his convention talk.
