We demonstrated at the IRS (Phila.) office, spoke to passers-by and handed out leaflets. From the IRS office, we marched through the streets to Independence Hall to continue our leaflet campaign. Our stay there lasted only a few minutes when we were ousted from the premises by the guards. It seems that permits from Big Brother are necessary in order to enter"Federal Property" for protest purposes. Ah, sweet freedom.

Our efforts did not go unnoticed, though, we received film coverage by all three major Phila. TV stations.

The theme of this year's protest was "Uncle Sam, enemy of the American Revolution." In keeping with this, Don Ernsberger, dressed as Uncle Sam,

spent time during the protest harrassing a fellow SIL member, who was dressed in a Revolutionary soldier's costume, with a toy machine gun.
