THEATRICAL BENEFIT SLATED FOR TUCCILLE CAMPAIGN

A gala theatrical benefit on behalf of Jerry Tuccille's gubernatorial campaign will be held this Sunday, 27 October, in the Regency Room of the George Washington Hotel, Lexington Avenue and 23rd Street, Manhattan.

Hosting the show are Murray Rothbard and Fran Youngstein. Dr. Rothbard is the distinguished free-market economist and author of numerous works on political theory. Ms. Youngstein, the Free Libertarian Party's mayoral candidate in 1973, received as many votes in that election as all the other minor-party candidates combined.

This year, the FLP's major statewide goal is to win 50,000 votes and a permanent line on the ballot. Jerry Tuccille, the Party's candidate for governor, will be guest of honor at the benefit.

Headlining the cast of players is Bobby Hill, star of the award-winning musical "Don't Bother Me, I Can't Cope." Joining him onstage will be: actor Marshall Bruce Evoy, singer Chi Chi Navarro, nightclub artists Pepe and Carol and Broadway performer Jean Preece. Rudy Stevenson, formerly with The Fifth Dimension, will conduct his orchestra for the show.

John Doswell, producer of the event, bills it as a "festival of libertarianism and freedom."

"Our theme is 'each individual can bring about his own freedom,'" said Doswell. "We intend to entertain and at the same time motivate people to begin putting libertarian ideas into practice."

The show's theme will be executed in music, comedy and drama. The multi-media happening "Libertarian Chronicles," a history of the movement in sight and sound, is the featured presentation.

The program is scheduled to begin at 7:30 p.m. The bar will be open before the show and during intermission. Formal dress is optional.
