

# Prop 98: YES Prop: 99 NO

n June 3, 2008, California will hold primary elections for candidates to Congress and state legislature—and two initiatives, both claiming to limit government's eminent domain power. Which is best?

The Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association sponsored Proposition 98-the California Property Owner & Farmland Protection Actwhich, if passed, would prohibit government from using eminent domain to benefit private developers or businesses. Prop 98 ensures that eminent domain be used only for legitimate public purposes, by requiring that:

1. If a public agency takes property under false pretenses, or abandons its development plans, the property must be offered for resale to the original owner at the original "just compensation" price, and the property tax would be assessed at the value of the property when originally condemned.

2. If farmers or business owners are evicted by eminent domain, they would receive compensation for temporary business losses, relocation expenses, business reestablishment costs, and other reasonable expenses

Prop 98 establishes real protections for private property. It protects homes, businesses, and farm land from seizures undertaken to benefit developers and politicallyconnected special interests. Californians for Property Rights Protection has details at: YesOnPropertyRights.com.

Proposition 99-the Homeowners and Private Property Protection Act-also claims to protect property rights. It bans using eminent domain to take

an owner-occupied residence for conveyance to a private person. This is Prop 99's only protection—and only if you've lived in that house as your primary residence for at least



ISWFACE also provides information to media, students, researchers, and others as the "Education" part of our mission. To change the laws, people must see prostitutes as human beings, with talents and skills, and understand the waste of time and money to imprison us for selling what we can legally

Unfortunately, our chief benefactor died in 2003, and we've since been financially struggling. We pay no salaries, but money is needed for our website, phones, exhibits, and my college lectures to future voters. My message isn't just that prostitution should be decriminalized: it's that we own our bodies and the government should leave consenting

#### Anyone for **Civil Rights?**

The government executes a search warrant for an entire community in Texas, takes into custody over 500 women and children, the only probable cause being a phone call from one person-who a week later has yet to

George Phillies. Longtime LP activist and physics professor. Former Army Reservist (1971-77). Loudly opposes the Iraq War and isn't afraid to say "neocon." Strong on civil liberties. Endorsed by Outright Libertarians.

Phillies criticized the LNC for inviting Paul to run for the LP nomination. I agree with the LNC. Paul was the best libertarian candidate in any party. But I respect Phillies for bucking the tide. Mary Ruwart. This longtime LP activist is a favorite with radicals and purists. Her best-selling Healing Our World in an Age of Aggression was praised by Ron Paul.

We hope to collect contributions to provide (initially) \$1,000 per year for students who meet these three criteria.

I spoke with the Director of Development & Student Affairs at California State University at Northridge (CSUN) and learned that they disburse two types of scholarships. One type is paid by the benefactor to the school, and through it to the student. The other is paid directly from benefactor to student.

If a scholarship goes through the school, it cannot discriminate against race, gender, etc. If we do it as our own program, then we can use whatever rules we want.

The advantage of going through the school is that contributions to the scholarship are then tax deductible. If we do it on our own, the deductibility is questionable.

The Director will investigate whether the AVLP's plan complies with CSUN's rules. If so, and if our scholarship fund grows, then maybe we can expand it to other majors




