More Petitioning Tips

I discovered a great method of obtaining 60 signatures an hour for the Libertarian Party. This method can't miss. Please try it.

You must hawk for a local candidate first. (If you have no local candidates, run yourself, or recruit someone. It's worth it to get our slate on the ballot this year.)

"Excuse me ma'am, are you a registered voter in Illinois? ...How would you like to help me get a friend on the ballot who is running for Congress. His name is Ralph Miron. He needs 5,000 signatures to get him on the ballot."


At this point, most people will sign. Some will want more information. You can tell this by their hesitancy. "He believes that government which governs least governs best." This usually works. You can continue. "Individual freedom. individual responsibility." If they ask what party affiliation, state proudly, "The Libertarian Party!" If the person then looks at you like you have the plague, remind her that we have no affiliation with Lyndon Larouche. "He's a Demo-

Once you get the person to sign for the local candidate, getting her to sign for the state slate is a snap. Right when they are finished signing the local petition, say, as you hand them the other clipboard, "And one more time for our state slate please." This almost always works without further discussion.

This approach avoids all talk about Perot or LaRouche. They have already committed, so they do sign again. It works! I get about 30 signatures an hour for the local candidate and 30 an hour for the state slate.

Good locations to petition include the K-Marts, Cub Foods, festivals, the Taste of Chicago, train and "el" stops. Get together to petition with a few people, then have a party afterwards. This does not have to be drudgery. It can be a lot of fun. Please let Paul Salander know every week how many signatures you have. Call him at 1-800-484-7942-2037. And send the petitions in weekly to LIFBAC, P.O. Box 67, Evanston, IL 60204.

Remember, the more volunteer signatures we get, the less we have to pay for.

Let's shoot for 10,000 volunteer signatures by July 1.

State Director Discusses New Laws

Jim McDonough, chief deputy director of the Vehicle Services Department, spoke in May to the Oak Brook Association of Insurance Women about upcoming legislation. Speaking in place of George Ryan, who could not attend, McDonough said the secretary of state had to attend an emergency meeting, and was definitely "earning his keep."

McDonough predicts that "agencies will be cut" in the ongoing Illinois state budget battle, which requires \$380 million in spending cuts to get the budget to its 1990 level. Even Aid for Families with Dependent Children is not exempt. Despite tax rate hikes, dollar revenues are flat or down a bit.

Upcoming legislation complicates matters. Bills for "Universal Health Insurance" and mandatory motorcycle helmets will re-emerge. The permissible blood-alcohol level for drivers might even drop to 0.08% from the current 0.10%.

Mandatory auto insurance might be dropped. When enacted, it was put on "sunset" for December 1993; without new legislation, it expires. One reason is that 6.8% of drivers simply cannot get insurance. In comes House Bill 3270 (opposed by the Secretary's Office) which would create a "key" policy for uninsured drivers. No insurance company could refuse to insure anyone licensed 3 years in Illinois who had no major violations.

Another bill called "up-front verification" would require that drivers present an insurance certificate in order to get or renew their driver's license.

Rothschild Introduces Bionomics:

Bringing Life to "The Dismal Science"

Most libertarians sense that economies are like ecosystems. Now Michael Rothschild has formalized that theory in his new book, *Bionomics: The Inevitability of Capitalism*. He recently presented those basic ideas at a Heartland Institute event.

Rothschild points out that looking at economies as machines, engines, or pies is a flawed approach—those things don't grow. A new paradigm is needed to explain economics.

His models yield insights similar to Austrian approaches, but he manages to establish his concepts without their help. He focuses extensively on the role of information, comparing it to coded DNA genetic structure, which provides information for organisms to act in certain effective and efficient ways to perpetuate the species in a continuing competitive world of nature. He uses the concepts of niche and competition to relate specialization and learning to the evolution of species. He even compares chicken-egg production to telecommunications. And the evidence suggests the analogy is right.

The author argues that capitalism is like a rain-forest, and reports that environmentalists applaud his analogy, even when he says that some of their command-and-control proposals make them "the dam-builders of the 1990s."

Rothschild says the old machine analogy also makes people wonder, "why not try to fix it?" An environmental paradigm, on the other hand, suggests a hands-off approach due to unforeseen ricochet effects. It shifts the burden of proof, forcing interventionists to justify taking action. "Don't manipulate; *cultivate*," he says.

If you're unsure about buying the book, an article on Bionomics appeared in *Liberty* magazine, January 1992.

Corrections and Omissions:

Ms. Kohls, noting that the plan would have been partly financed by "sin" taxes on tobacco and alcohol, commented wryly that "I can't smoke or drink that much!"
