## Boddie campaign to hold rally Sept. 13

Richard Boddie, LP candidate for U.S. Senate and arguably the party's most dynamic public speaker, will host a rally for supporters and the general public on Sunday, Sept. 13.

The event will begin at 3 p.m. in Randell's Restaurant and Jazz Club, located in the ground floor of the National Bank of Long Beach building, 3 Hutton Centre Drive in Santa Ana (see map on page 4 of this newsletter).

Boddie's appearance here, and at the L.A. County Fair opening in Pomona the previous day, are part of his plans to campaign throughout California on a full-time basis beginning after the Labor Day weekend. A Boddie speech is an excellent "first LP event" for non-libertarians to experience. The Huntington Beach motivational speaker is incredibly persuasive and has been known to bring a meeting-hall full of Rotarians to their feet clamoring for the libertarian philosophy of free minds and markets.




Come and observe a real, live alternative to the "business as usual" parties' candidates!

flyers on doorsteps in your neighborhood. I want the OCLP to be ready to initiate that kind of grassroots action before the election. With our combined individual efforts, we can boost our vote totals substantially.

From Sept. 11 to Oct. 4, the Libertarian Party of Los Angeles County is running an outreach booth at the Los Angeles County Fair. They have paid the entire \$1,800 cost to gain access to this event, which will benefit the regional organizations in Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino County as well.

During its 23-day run, the fair attracts an astonishing one million visitors, many of whom eagerly want to hear our message. We have a chance to reach a large portion of those one million visitors if the booth can be staffed smoothly and professionally by volunteer activists. Volunteers are needed, since 552 man-hours of staffing have yet to be filled. This a great chance for candidates to gain exposure to thousands of people; I encourage them especially to help.

There are a limited number of passes for fair entry and parking; if you sign up early, you have a much better chance of getting a freebie. To volunteer, call Gail Lightfoot at (714) 623-1117. The best time to reach her is approximately 7:30 p.m. Let's not let this opportunity slip away. This is a great chance to have fun and promote the LP at the same time.


