The anti-toy-gun bill (Int. 0298), sponsored by city council members Vann (D-Brooklyn), would make it illegal to sell or possess any toy gun. Currently, it is legal in New York City to sell toy guns that are brightly colored or otherwise obviously not actual firearms.
