## Lou Montesi and the Sinkhole

Libertarian principles are coming into conflict with the government octopus in a current Winter Park brouhaha. Winter Park, in case you hadr't heard, is the home of Florida's latest tourist attraction; a world class sinkhole. In case you are even less informed, a sinkhold occurs when an underground cavern full of water fories up, and the roof falls in. Winter Park's sinkhole started when a large shade tree disappeared into the earth; and continued by gobbling up grass, streets, one hapless residence, a few expensive sports cars, a Dickup truck with camper, and so on. It's bigger than a football field, and people LOVE to get as close as possible to the edge and peer in. The crowds even have an international flavor; the sinkhole is a planet-wide celebrity.

Dur victim, one Lou Montesi, entrepeneur, is the owner of "The Pawn Shop", a business fronting on one of the streets temporarily closed when the hole sank. He decided to make a lemonade out of his lemon, laid in a supply of pictures of the hole, and had T-shirts made with appropriate sinkhole slosans, with the intention of setting up shop on a vacant lot near the hole.

Enter the villain, stage left. When Lou went to a meeting of the City Commissioners of Winter Park to request permission to set up a stand on a vacant lot next to the hole, they informed him that the zoning was wrons for that property. He then asked where the zoning was correct and when they told him he said, "Well, I'll move my tables over there". The City official replied, "You can't do that, you'd have to have a permanent building to house your business". So Lou went back to sellins his merchandise from his shop - about a half a block from the hole.

Then the City proceeded to erect a tent on property similar to that from which they had barred Mr. Montesi, and to use City employees to sell pictures identical to the ones he had in stock. (Df course the City
didn't apply for a zoning variance or zoning reclassification, or for any occupational or vendor's license).

Alons about this time, Lou, whose pressure had been rising dramatically, popped his cork. He protested to the City Commission that they were ensaged in unfair competition. After all, they had no rent, and since the city workers were on the payroll anyhow, they had no wases, utilities, or other related expenses in their foray into the souvenir selling same. The City responded by having Boy Scouts instead of firemen sell the pictures not what you would call an overwhelming capitulation.

Enter our hero, Laurence James Pino, attorney, stage risht. Larry, known to Libertarian activists as "one of us", is chairman of the ACLU in Central Florida. He agreed to represent Mr. Montesi at another meeting of the Winter Park City Commission. His intent was to show the patent ridiculousness of a sovernmental entity settins up a roadside stand and setting into the street-vendor business. The meeting's ambience deteriorated somewhat when one of the Commissioner's launched into a scurrilous and perhaps libelous attack on Mr. Montesi and his past history.

Lou, thoroushly irritated by this time, fired off a few ansry retorts, and our hero, Mr. Pino,

## Dotti Swanson Appointed First LPF Executive Director

At its first business meeting on July 11, the new Executive Committee of the LPF cast a vote in favor of a more professional approach to politics by appointing Dorothy L. Swanson to be the first Executive Director in the party's histary.

I first met Dorothy Swanson when we were both hospitalized in July of 1979 and shared a room for a week. Dotti and I both went to surgery on the second day of my stay and it was during our recuperation that we became friends. Several months passed, however, before I learned about her passion for politics.

Ms. Swanson had enjoyed a lons and successful career as a Dolitical activist for the Republican Party of Florida until very recently - November 1980 to be exact. Shortiy after Ronald Reagan's election as President of the United States, Ms. Swanson and her husband Ralph, who also save much of his time and energy in Republican politics, realized that both major parties had really merged into one - thus
fully justifying the appellation "Republicrats". Alsa, the Swansons decided that these Republicrats were moving rapidly away from the American Tradition of respect for individual freedom and private property, contrary to ali the rhetoric from Washington. (Cont. on Pase 7)
