

STATE LIBERTARIAN PARTY CONVENTION APRIL 4 ~ 6, 2003, WILKES-BARRE, PA

H ere are some highlights of guests attending this years State LP Convention. Join us this year for some inspiration from fellow Libertarians.

Elizabeth Summers is a noted Libertarian civic activist from the City of Wilkes-Barre and our gracious host and organizer for the 2003 Libertarian Party of Pennsylvania Convention. She heads the Luzerne County Libertarian Party, a member of the state and national LP, and the Pocono Libertarians. She holds two posts as an elected Libertarian: a member of the Luzerne County Government Study Commission and Judge of Elections.

Marty Thomas-Brumme' is the executive director of the The Rose Center, a Scranton-based organization dedicated to the field of conflict resolution, restorative justice and victim restitution. His dedication is evident by his keen listening skills and the respectful and professional manner in which he conducts himself as an impartial mediator.

Dr. James Pendleton is a retired psychiatrist from Bryn Athyn, PA. He is an advocate of a market-based approach to health care with greater use of MSA's (Medical Savings Accounts). His presentation will focus on how individuals and families can benefit from this approach to medicine, and how they can lead more healthy and productive lives while being "educated consumers". **Imad-ad-Dean Ahmad, Ph.D.** Born at sea as his mother fleeing her homeland of Palestine, Dr. Ahmad was raised in Forty-Fort, Pennsylvania. He is author of Signs in the Heavens: A Muslim Astronomer's Perspective on Religion and Science and editor of Islam and the Discovery of Freedom and co-editor of Islam and the West: A Dialog. His essay "An Islamic Perspective on the Wealth of Nations" appears in the International Library of Critical Writings on Economics.

Ray Masters a radio talk show host serves as media representative for the Pocono Libertarians in Stroudsburg, PA. Since its founding in 1991, he is responsible for bringing over 175 guest speakers to Monroe County for the purpose of discussing issues of individual liberty in a public forum.

Dennis Draughon is one of five full-time political cartoonists in Pennsylvania. He spent the first 29 years of his life in Virginia and North Carolina before moving to Scranton. Dennis attended North Carolina State University he studied aerospace engineering, visual design and history while serving for eight years as the editorial cartoonist for the student newspaper, The Technician.

Libertarian Toastmasters is Club Number 9376 in District 38 of Toastmasters International. Their first meeting was April 10, 2000 with about fifteen charter members. The official charter from the international organization is dated September 2000.

Poker Face is a freedom-loving band playing modern music with thick harmonies. In the ten years of their existence, they have made an important presence in the political scene. They believe that their music can help raise the conscientiousness of people; that all those who love freedom should not stand for government encroachments upon their liberty.

WYOMING VALLEY MASSACRE

Tilkes-Barre, city, seat of Luzerne Co., E Pa., on the east bank of the Susquehanna River; settled 1769, inc. as a city 1871. Once a major anthracite coal center, Wilkes-Barre has factories manufacturing pencils, radios, glass, shoes, and electronic equipment. The city was named for John Wilkes and Isaac Barré, defenders of the colonies before Parliament. The settlement was burned in 1778 by the British and Native Americans, just after the Wyoming Valley massacre; it was again burned in 1784. Wilkes-Barre is the seat of Wilkes College, King's College, College Misericordia, and a branch of Pennsylvania State University.

New E-mail Discussion Lists Established

The Libertarian Party of Pennsylvania has set up many new e-mail lists to help foster communications among Pennsylvania Libertarians.

Announce@lppa.org – A broadcast list for LPP announcements, such as the Libertarian Penn, press releases, upcoming events, and other party announcements. Traffic should be limited to only a few a month.

Volunteer@lppa.org – This is a discussion and broadcast list for anyone who says, "I want to volunteer". Whenever envelopes need stuffing, or candidates need help, this is the place where the calls for help are raised.

Discussion@lppa.org -- A wideranging discussion list (similar to the old PaLibernet) generally concerned with Libertarian politics in Pennsylvania. If you have an opinion, this is the place to raise it.

Media@lppa.org -- A broadcast list for press releases being sent to media contacts.

Campaign report from Dave Tartaglia

In 2002 I ran for Pennsylvania State Representative in the 126th District, central Berks County.

After getting on the ballot, I created my campaign web site, www.geocities,com/dtartaglia1.

Writing the web site forced me to think about everything necessary to run the campaign. I included a bio and contact info, campaign issues and events, endorsements, and section on why voters should choose me and the LP.

I publicized my site at PoliticsPA.com, and other local and national portals and search engines. I received over 1000 hits during the campaign.

I was endorsed by FOAC, Firearms Owners Against Crime (www.foacpac.org) who designed literature for me and provided mailing lists.

They said: "David Tartaglia has received a very high score on our questionnaire and his personal comments show that he is willing to stand by his convictions."

The Pink Pistols (www.pinkpistols .com) also endorsed me as 100% progun rights. The Pink Pistols are gay gun-rights activists who meet to help others learn about guns and gunrights.

I spoke at Albright College and at a local high school. I appeared on TV with my opponents in a local LVW forum, repeated many times on the public access channel. WITF-TV Harrisburg gave me five minutes to deliver my views to central Pennsylvania. I ran two drive-time spots 45 times on ESPN/WIOV radio

Final Results:

Dem Dante Santoni - 12,026 - 73.42%

Rep Roberta Carlisle - 3906 - 23.85%

Lib David L Tartaglia - 444 - 2.71% (7.2% in my home precinct)

I had a blast running and I managed to lose 50 pounds during the campaign!

BILL OF RIGHTS DEFENSE COMMITTEE

✓ ake your town a civil lib-M ake your town a crimer erties safety zone. Many provisions of the PATRIOT ACT have raised concerned regarding preservation of civil rights. The Bill of Rights Defense Committee based out of Florence, Massachusetts has led the charge nationwide in bringing attention to this matter. At the time of this writing, fifty towns including several major cities across this country have already have passed resolutions defining where they intend to draw the line with federal authorities, with many calling for repeal of the PATRIOT ACT itself. By passing these resolutions, local governments are sending a strong message to Washington that this type of legislation won't be tolerated.

Now, our representatives in Washington are preparing PATRIOT ACT PART II. We need to send a clear message to them that we wish to preserve our civil rights. One government official informed me that he has heard from many citizens, but nothing from Libertarians. He was surprised that Libertarians weren't leading the charge on this important matter. In view of that, the Delaware County Libertarian Committee has set up a yahoo group for communicating and exchanging information and ideas regarding the passage of resolutions declaring Civil Liberties Safety Zones in communities throughout Pennsylvania.
