One action item proceeding from that meeting was the decision to hold another outreach weekend at Hillsdale shopping center. We chose Saturday/Sunday, January 20 & 21; again using the "Operation Politically Homeless" quiz & tools, and some additional brochures, etc.

It was reported that a student is starting a libertarian group at Menlo College.

We appointed Jack to serve on the LPC platform committee.

Finally, we discussed the intentions of LPSM office seekers at the January Annual Meeting, noting that three of our (many) executive committee chairs might go unfilled.

January Notes

The LPSM annual meeting was well-attended (14 members, by my count) and was an amiable blend of camaraderie and annual party business.

Non-business items

Linden kept the proceedings moving along: I read my notes of the previous meeting. Each attendee introduced himself. I presented a summary of the annual report of Treasurer (prepared by Treasurer Margret Schmidt). We voted to deposit \$1,000 with the post office for upcoming mailings.

Robert solicited original articles for upcoming newsletters, and reported that an article of his had been reproduced in the June 1999 edition of *LP News*.

Jack added that the *Santa Clara Libertarian* had picked up a photo of an election event at Stanford at which some of our local candidates had appeared.

Rob related his recent experience speaking in opposition to a proposed

hotel occupancy tax at a Daly City council meeting. He has decided to run for city council himself. *Right On!*

Bob reviewed and adjusted the volunteer schedule for the Hillsdale outreach event. Kathy donated a rubber stamp with our web site address; used subsequently to imprint literature distributed at Hillsdale. *Thanks!*

Finally, we got down to the main business of the evening: officer elections.

Jack, Margret, Robert, and Ann Turner were reelected to the offices of Chair, Treasurer, Newsletter Chair, and Database Chair.
