NORTHROP LISTS CAMPAIGN ISSUES: PLEDGES LIBERTARIAN SOLUTIONS

Libertarian candidate for Governor, John Northrup, today pledged to provide "specific libertarian solutions to the major issues facing New Yorkers in 1982."

Northrup, a Syracuse CPA, and the only upstate candidate for governor this year listed outrageous taxes and spending, crime, jobs and the deterioration in education as the issues which New York voters demand gubernatorial candidates address with specific solutions.

He went on to state: "My stand on the issues is based on the fact that there is no contradiction between solving problems and individual freedom. In fact, it is the restriction of freedom caused by the Democrats and Republicans which creates the problems in the first place. Between now and election day, I plan to make specific proposals which will address these crucial issues. The voters should expect no less from the other candidates for Governor."

The Libertarian Party is the nation's third largest, and is running 1000 candidates for office this year. Neither left wing nor right wing by contemporary labels, the Party bases its stand
