blame low vote totals on a radical message. There have always been "vote getting" vs. "no compromise" factions in the LP. Ten years ago, it was the Activists vs. the Purists. Back then, the "vote getter" Activists complained that Purists were holding them back from success. Today, the 'vote getter" Reformers complain that Radicals are holding

No one's holding anyone back. The LP is what we make of it. The "vote getters" were always free to campaign on "non-scary" messages. The LP's historical size and vote totals are as much their handiwork as any other faction's.

But I'm less concerned with vote totals than with changing minds. Influencing the culture. I don't want to "trick" people into voting Libertarian by hiding our message. I want to convert people so they'll want to vote

Volunteers Needed

low is a great time for volunteers to assist at the LPC's office. New documentation and live assistance is available to help volunteers learn how to do the jobs that keep our Party running effectively.

We need volunteers for both recurring tasks (these typically repeat once a week or once a month), and for special projects (these happen rarely, or only once).

We have tasks both for those who live near our Panorama City, Los Angeles office, and for those who live far away and can only work off-site.

On-Site Projects

If you can visit the office an hour or two each week, you can help with filing documents, culling archives, and answering

One much-needed, special project is converting paper documents into electronic records. This requires scanning paper records into a computer, then typing each record's information in the scanned file, so that it can be found easily.

Another special project is sorting returned mail by county. This requires looking up county information about cities (Wikipedia is good for this, and it's easy to learn), sorting the returned mail by county, then conveying the updated address information

Voters, so that they'll update their records. Once the county Registrar of Voters updates their records, we'll save money by reducing the postage for mailing reminders about laps-

ing memberships.

Volunteers who wish to assist outside the office can: (1) merge, print, and mail monthly bills, (2) compile and mail information packages, (3) contact members and donors to help them renew memberships and

Libertarian History California: Birthplace of **Our Movement**

The mid and late 1960s saw the first explicitly libertarian activist movement in the nation. According to most historians, the spark that ignited the freedom movement first appeared in California during "the student libertarian

The University of California at Berkeley had several campus groups with a hodgepodge of libertarian and conservative ideals. The biggest, Cal Conservatives for Political Action (CCPA), was founded in 1964. They supported the U.S. government's foreign policy in Vietnam, but opposed the draft. Mostly followers of Ayn Rand, Barry Goldwater, and H. L. Mencken, CCPA organized pro-Vietnam war demonstrations at a time when the conflict was becoming increasingly unpopular on campus.

Soon these quasi-libertarians were struggling with seemingly insolvable logical contradictions. A pro-war stance conflicted with their individualist Liberty!

philosophy and Jefferson's advice to avoid entangling al-

These inconsistencies became a hot topic of debate among antiwar Leftists who were increasingly vocal about the dangers of U.S. military operations in foreign nations. Failing to see their own glaring inconsistence, these Leftists asked early libertarian leaders how they could oppose government interference in the lives of Americans, while simultaneously demanding government interference in foreign lands?

By 1965, the leaders of CCPA realized that they were not conservatives, but instead "classical liberals" with a libertarian penchant.

> In 1966, CCPA united with the expelled Moise Tshombe chapter of Young Americans for Freedom, changed their name, and created the first nationwide and explicitly libertarian organization in the U.S.-the Alliance of Libertarian Activists

This new student organization took a strict non-interventionist position on domestic and foreign governmental policies, as enumerated in the "Berkeley Statement." They enjoyed a large student following, a headquarters, and a propensity for sit-ins and public demonstrations. They were the driving force behind UC Berkeley's "Filthy Speech Movement."

These libertarian student organizations eventually led to the formation of a national Libertarian Party.

Fighting for YOUR Sexual Freedom SF Ballot Measure Protects Prostitutes, Clients


n Monday, July 7th after posing outside City Hall with our cartons of petitions for a few photos, proponent Maxine Doogan and a half dozen supporters of the measure to defund enforcement of prostitution laws in San Francisco delivered forms bearing 12,763 signatures to the Elections Department.

This was after we thoroughly vetted the signatures, crossing out those of people who lived outside San Francisco, did not list an address, etc. Given that the required number of valid signatures was only 7,168, and we were shooting for 11,000 in order to have a reasonable margin to cover signatures ruled invalid, we believe we are in good shape.

Barring some unexpected occurrence, this measure will appear before San Francisco voters on the November 4th ballot.

The Elections Department has up to 30 days to check and verify the signatures we've submitted, and will inform us when they are ready to begin this process, which we are allowed to observe. This will presumably occur on weekdays. If you can volunteer to observe, please call contact me.

At the 2008 Libertarian Party convention, the Reform Caucus beat the Libertarian Caucus. Mainstream libertarians are not represented on the 2008 LP presidential ticket. It would have been a good move on the part of the Reform Caucus to sponsor a unity ticket with a prominent member of the Libertarian Caucus as the VP candidate. Failing to think strategically, the Reform Caucus wanted their victory over the Libertarian Caucus to be thorough.

The result is a weakened candidate. There is much discontent within LP ranks over this ticket.

The reaction from the Reform Caucus has been to accuse everyone who hasn't warmly embraced the ticket of being sore losers, wanting to destroy the party, etc. The truth is that by placing victory at the convention over strategy, the Reform Caucus

One thing libertarians often lose is more guilty of trying to fracture the party than is the disenfranchised Libertarian Caucus.

Libertarians are notorious for rejecting calls for "you have to vote for me," as a substantial portion of Libertarians are converts from major parties, and those converts realized that they don't have to vote for the candidate of their party. It doesn't matter that the hated other party will win if the candidate of their party is just

That's not to say that Barr is as bad as Obama or McCain-he certainly is not. The question is: Is he good enough to get the vote of those who will analyze a candidate, instead of showing blind party loyalty?

A better thinking of strategy by the Reform Caucus, and Ban wouldn't have to worry about get ting the Libertarian vote and could concentrate on the independent vote. As it stands now, Barr has the potential to gain one at the expense of the other, and that will not result in the growth that the Reform Caucus promised the rest of the LP when they rammed a double reform ticket down the throats of everyone else.

Tired of PC Muslims

Since al Qaeda's radical Arab-Islamic attacks on American civilian and military targets on 9/11, can you tell me what American movies engage in collectivist hate speech against Arabs and

With the exception of American movies that portray what happened on 9/11-The Hamburg Cell and United 93—you won't find movies portraying Muslims as villains—and none of these contain collectivist hate speech against Arabs or Muslims.



Because of this, Barr and his supporters have no moral claims to your party loyalty. You can't demand what you haven't given.

Whatever you decide, please don't leave the LP. Stay and improve it.

More ironies: both Reformers and Radicals are moonlighting in competing libertarian par-

After the Portland convention, disaffected Radicals formed the Boston Tea Party as a purist alternative to the LP. Two years later, at the Denver convention, a BTP state chair-simultaneously serving as an LP delegate-told me the BTP was now a "big tent," more moderate than the LP's Reform Caucus.

Yet after the LP nominated Barr/Root, the BTP nominated the radical ticket of Charles Jay and Thomas L. Knapp. Although running for VP on the BTP ticket, Knapp is simultaneously running for Congress in Missouri on the LP ticket.

The BTP expects to be on the ballot in about 10 states this November. They tapped me as a potential California

state chair. I declined. Barbara "Joy" Waymire did not. Waymire is now the California

chair of the Boston Tea Party. She simultaneously retains her LP titles. She is also an LP candidate for president for 2012.

Thus, with the 2008 race still going on, we already have Root and Waymire to pick from in 2012. (Root says he intends to be the LP's presidential candidate for the next four elections—through to 2024.)

Former LP presidential candidate Alden Link, who failed to get a single vote at the Denver convention-failing even to win a seat for himself on his home state (New York) delegation—is now the VP candidate of the Objectivist Party.

The OP was formed in February 2008 by Dr. Tom Stevens, who is their presidential candidate. Stevens continues to simultaneously serve on the LP's Judiciary Committee.

Stevens tells me he expects the OP to be on the November ballot in Colorado, Louisiana, and Florida. Although he is running against Barr, he says all OP national committee members "are actively involved in helping Barr get elected... I have encouraged all our party members to enroll as Libertarians. I view the OP as an outreach tool to get people involved in politics who were previously sitting on their hands or debating the finer points of the nonaggression principle."

Getting people involved in Party A by running candidates in Party B. That's certainly thinking outside the box.

Finally, former LP presidential candidate George Phillies is the LP's candidate in New Hampshire and Massachusetts. This is not Phillies's doing, but state election law. These states require parties to specify a candidate when gathering signatures for ballot access. Because the filing deadlines
