## **Ashley Shade wins a seat on the North Adams City Council**

Ashley Shade, our state party chair, has been elected to the North Adams city council. This victory was the culmination of years of effort and hard work. While we have had members elected to other local offices, such as town meeting representative and library trustee, City Council is a big win. This shows that it's possible for libertarians to win nonpartisan local elections, and anyone truly interested in running for office should look into starting that process now. We have also run candidates in many partisan races in the past. In districts where the incumbent is normally unopposed, this can be a great way to get our

ideas exposed to the public during a time when there is more attention focused on politics.
