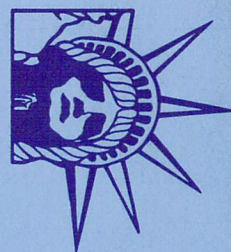

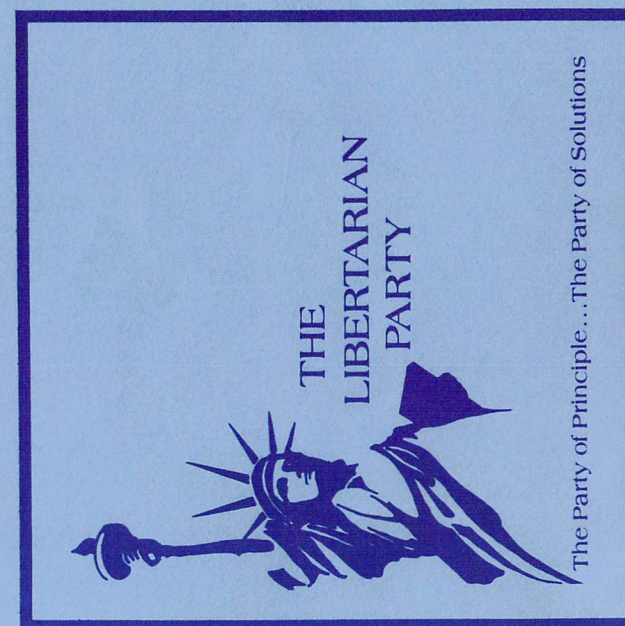

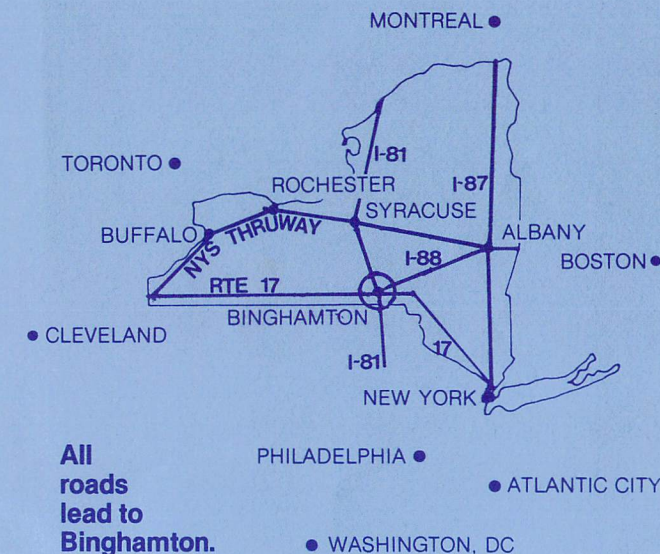

Registration Information

Participation in convention business meetings is open to FLP members. All other convention activities require registration and payment. You may register in advance by using the Prepaid Registration Form, or you may register at the convention. There are many advantages of advance registration: it enables you to check in quickly and avoid lines, preregistration fees are lower than on-site fees, and prepaid registrants are entitled to admission to the Friday evening reception. FLP members can register now — at last year's package price!

The preregistration deadline is April 23. Registrations postmarked after that date must include payment at the higher rate. Preregistered delegates unable to attend must call or write. Those cancelling before April 23 will be refunded in full. Cancellations received thereafter will be subject to a \$10 deduction.

On-site registration will take place at the Holiday Inn-Arena, beginning at 9:00 AM on Saturday, May 1.

Hotel Reservations

There is no need to contact the hotel directly: at your request, we will make reservations for you. To guarantee availability, we must receive your reservation request by April 23. Room prices — for registered delegates — have been negotiated to rates substantially less than normal. Rooms will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Confirmation will be sent by mail. After April 23, you may make reservations by calling Holiday Inn-Arena: (607) 722-1212. Room cancellations require a minimum notice of 48 hours.

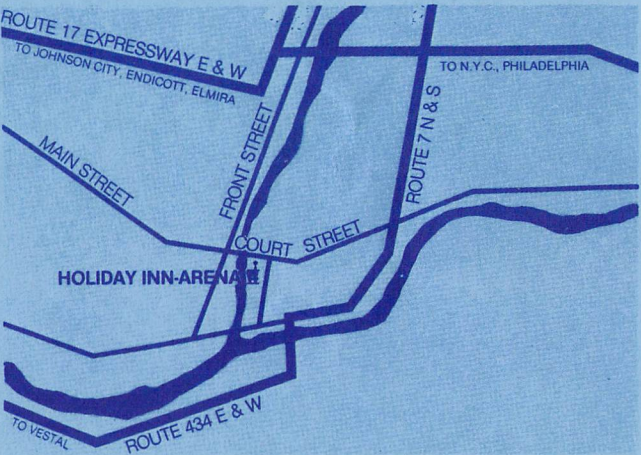
General Information

Location

The convention site is located in downtown Binghamton, only 4 blocks from Greyhound, Short Line and Trailways bus terminals. Broome County airport is served by regularly scheduled commuter airlines, and limosine service is available to and from the hotel. By auto, take I-81 Exit 4S, about 2 miles, then Washington St. to Hawley St.

Principles and Objectives of the Free Libertarian Party

The Free Libertarian Party is a political organization which has as its primary objective the extension of individual freedom to its furthest limits. To that end the Party affirms the following principles:

1. That each individual possesses the inalienable right to life and liberty and to justly acquired property.
2. That no person or institution, public or private, has the right to initiate the use of physical force against another.
3. That all individuals are entitled to choose their own life styles as long as they do not forcibly impose their values on others.
4. That the only moral basis of politics is the preservation and protection of individual rights.
5. That the voluntary exchange of goods and services is fundamental to any socio-economic system which provides for the harmonious integration of divergent value systems.
