REPORT OF THE RULES COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE COMMITTEE MEETING OF FEBRUARY 13, 2024

Proposal 1 (G). Remove "primary" as there are no primaries when there is no ballot access.

6.7. **TERM.** State Committee members shall serve until the conclusion of the Organization Meeting following the primary election at which their successors are elected. State Committee members who move their residence out of their Judicial District but within the State of New York may keep their offices until the end of their term.

Proposal 2 (C). Simplify provision for Convention Oversight Committee for organization meetings.

8.5.1. CONVENTION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. The State Committee shall appoint a special Convention Oversight Committee to plan and execute the Organization Meeting. The Convention Committee shall also appoint the following special subcommittees: Convention Arrangements Subcommittee, Program Subcommittee, Rules Subcommittee, Credentials Subcommittee, and Resolutions Subcommittee. The Convention Committee and each subcommittee This committee may appoint subcommittees or assistants for the facilitation of their responsibilities. The Convention Committee This committee and its subcommittees shall cease to exist upon the adjournment of the organization meeting.

- 8.5.2. **AGENDA.** The order of business shall be as follows:
 - (a) The current Chair shall call the meeting to order.
 - (b) The Chair shall call the roll to identify the elected State Committee members present.
 - (c) The Chair shall serve as the Presiding Officer and Secretary shall serve as the Recording Secretary, respectively, of the Organization Meeting, unless they decline or are unable to serve, at which point a Temporary Chair and/or Temporary Secretary shall be elected for the duration of the meeting.
 - (d) Report of Rules Subcommittee Committee and adoption of the Special Rules of Order of the Organization Meeting.
 - (e) Filling of vacancies on the State Committee.
 - (f) Supplemental credentials report of the Credentials Subcommittee.
 - (g) Report of Rules Subcommittee and adoption of the Rules of the Libertarian Party.
 - (h) Election of the officers and five Members-At-Large of the Executive Committee.
 - (i) Discussion and consideration of Platform amendments.
 - (j) Report of Resolutions Subcommittee.
 - (k) Adjournment.

Proposal 3 (D). Cleanup and clarifications for At-Large Delegates procedures. Allows the Executive Committee to ratify the delegate list once the rubric is approved.

13.4. MANNER OF SELECTION OF AT-LARGE DELEGATES. All At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected by the State Committee in accordance with the rubric provided in these Rules the Policy Manual in which a line of succession is established for ranking Delegates and Alternate Delegates. At-Large Delegates shall be selected in the order in accordance with the rubric until all the At-Large Delegate seats are filled. At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected in the order in accordance with the rubric until all the At-Large Alternate Delegate seats are filled. Vacancies of At-Large Delegate positions shall be filled by selecting the next individual in the line of succession. Ties shall be broken by a vote of the State Committee. The final list of Delegates and Alternate Delegates shall be ratified at a meeting of by the State Committee. Additional At-Large Alternate Delegates may be added after the election of the initial election appointment of At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates and shall be added to the end of the list in chronological order of their selection as an additional Alternate Delegate.

13.4.1. **RUBRIC.** Delegates to the Libertarian National Convention shall be selected in accordance with this rubric and in accordance with the Rules of the Libertarian Party of New York.

13.4.2. CRITERIA. Delegates shall be selected in accordance with the rubric in the Policy Manual.

13.5. **TIMING OF SELECTION OF DELEGATES.** At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates to Presidential Nominating Conventions shall be held selected one month before petitioning for the Presidential Primary Begins begins if such a primary is held. For all other National During Non-Presidential Nominating Conventions, At-Large Delegates and At-Large Alternate Delegates shall be selected no later than three (3) months before the Libertarian National Convention.

Proposal 4 (E). Clarify that these are the rules of the LPNY, not just the State Committee.

- 21.1. These rules shall be the exclusive rules of the State Committee of the Libertarian Party LPNY.
- 21.2. These rules supersede and replace any document previously adopted by the Party LPNY and shall remain in effect until such time that the State Committee of the Libertarian Party adopts new or amended Rules. No other rules shall be effective unless approved in writing by the State Committee.


