STATE COMMITTEE MEETING HELD MARCH 5

On Sunday, March 5, 2023, the State Committee of the Libertarian Party of New York held their third meeting of the 2022-2024 term. Four new members were elected to fill vacancies on the State Committee: Craig Colwell (JD6), Charles Roggen (JD8), John Clifton (JD11), and Francisco Olvera (JD11). See page 3 to learn more about them.

The Rules Committee report was presented. Several amendments were passed and a few failed. Most of the amendments involved minor clarifications and cleanup of the language. The proposal to create a Conflict Resolution Committee failed. In early 2021 the idea of a Judicial Committee was rejected, leading to a two year effort to draft this proposal with the same result.

Two of the more significant new rules amendments codified a requirement that the State Committee, not the Chair, must approve regional agreements as well as vote on any proposed recall of the LNC Regional Representative or Alternate.

Another significant development was the removal of the requirement to hold business meetings in-person at least twice per year, opening the door for holding in-person events (such as with workshops and speakers) without the need to conduct business that can be done online.

The ability to conduct business for unorganized counties was also enhanced by simplifying appointments or renewals of an expiring County Contact to the end of the succeeding quarter. Additionally, quorum for new County Affiliates was set at 4 LPNY members for all counties, regardless of the number of enrolled Libertarians, in which the previous requirement ranged

from 4 to 9.

Finally, rules amendment procedures were optimized to allow proposed Rules changes to be distributed electronically at a minimum as opposed to physically by mail, as well as permitting amendments without prior notice, such as if an amendment is necessary during a business meeting.

Due to time constraints, the Platform Committee report will not be heard until the next meeting.

Finally, the committee passed two significant resolutions: one blocking expenditure of resources for the 2024 ballot access race and a second supporting a bill to limit qualified immunity in New York.

CRAIG COLWELL Judicial District 6



Craig Colwell has been a Libertarian since 2018. He previously served on the State Committee from 2021 to 2022, and is the current Chair of the Chemung County Libertarian Party, having previously served as its Vice-Chair. As a local activist, he has taken a vocal role in protests against government outreach. In 2022, he was a candidate for

Chemung County Legislature. He was also a 2022 delegate to the National Convention.

Colwell is originally from Windsor, New York. He relocated to the Elmira area in 2007, and has lived in the Southern Tier his whole life. He is partners in Colwell Creative Content, a digital marketing and copywriting agency with his wife, Nicole.

CHARLES ROGGEN Judicial District 8



Charles Roggen is a new member of the State Committee, having filled the vacancy left by Gerrit Cain upon his move out of the State. Roggen is currently running for Akron Town Trust-

ee in Erie County. Michael Rebmann is his campaign manager. Roggen lives in Akron and works as a NYS Correctional Officer at Attica Correctional Facility. He and his wife welcomed their first child in February of this year. In his spare time, he enjoys hunting, fishing, and boating.

John Clifton (JD11). John Clifton previously served on the State Committee. He was State Treasurer (1999-2002), Member-At-Large (2002-2003), Chair (2003-2006), and Political Director (2010-2016). He was also the LPNY's candidate for U.S. Senate (2000, 2010), Governor (2006), Comptroller (2014), and also ran for New York City Comptroller (2009). He is a longtime Libertarian and has been involved in the Queens party.

Francisco Olvera (JD11). Francisco Olvera is a Libertarian from Queens County, currently serving as the Queens' party's Vice-Chair. In 2022, he was a volunteer for the campaigns of Larry Sharpe for Governor and Jonathan Howe for Congress.

2022 WRITE-INS: GOVERNOR TOTALS FOR CHEMUNG CO.

There is not much of an update on the write-in totals for the 2022 election. We are still missing data from 10 counties.

However, we now have the full update for Chemung County. In a previous report, a Board of Elections official stated that Larry Sharpe received 25 votes in Chemung County. However, when the full breakdown came

out, Larry actually had 44 votes! This brings his total to 1,795 votes so far. Chemung County has not yet provided the results for the other statewide races. More updates will be announced as we receive them.
