A bill has been entered in Congress to repeal the private express statutes. Write your legislators in support of this bill to repeal the postal monopoly.



Report on April meeting:

The business meeting was followed by a talk on the Arguments in favor of ending public education, by Steven Schneider, based on two articles in the FREEMAN, November, 1973 and Feb. 1976.

Editor's corner

The Senate committee investigating intellegigence agencies has noted in its report just published that the agencies consistantly violate the constitution as a matter of policy. To them, national security is more important than upholding the constitution. The two are in direct opposition. National security involves protecting the government form its citizens. The constitution was set up to protect the citizens from their government.

Book briefs

America's Great Depression by Murray Rothbard is must reading for anyone who wants to understand the true causes of the Depression. The book is divided into three parts. The first part describes the Austrian Theory of the business cycle, followed by a discussion of why the Keynesian critics of this theory are wrong, followed by a critique of alternate theories for the cause of the depression.

Part 2 describes in detail how the policies of the Federal Reserve caused the inflation of the 1920's and the following collapse which culminated in the great depression.

Part 3 describes the intervention by the Hoover administration in its attempt to end the depression. Rothbard forever ends the notion that the Hoover administration took a laissez-faire stand in dealing with the depression. Published by Sheed & Ward, Inc, Kansas City, 1975.
