### INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

MARK BALLOT AND LEAVE X MARKS SHOWING

(Your X marks must be showing for vote to register)

THEN TURN RED VOTER'S SWITCH TO RECORD VOTE

(Switch is located at lower right)

VOTING MACHINES ARE VERY EASY TO OPERATE. JUST FOLLOW THESE SIMPLE INSTRUCTIONS.

1. Step inside the curtains. Once inside, the election official will throw a switch closing the curtains behind you. You will see your ballot listed on the machine.
2. Turn the lever next to the candidate of your choice. A big "X" will show to remind you who you are voting for. If the ballot says "Vote for 3 or 5" you may turn only that many levers.
3. If you turn a lever in error or change your mind, return that lever to its normal position and vote for the candidate of your choice.
4. There are spaces on the side for write-in candidates, numbered to match each office.
5. When you're satisfied with your choice of candidates, just turn the red voter's switch at lower right. This records your vote, erases the "X" marks and opens the curtains.

1 Authorizing the conduct of sweepstakes races

2 An Amendment to Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, providing for a student loan program and the enactment of laws therefor.

3 An Amendment to Article II of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, relating to equality of rights of the sexes.

4 An Amendment to Articles VII and IX of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, concerning the State Institutions of Higher Education, and providing for the governing boards thereof, increasing the number of Regents of the University of Colorado from six to nine; providing for the election of such regents as provided by law; and providing for the removal of the authority of the President of the University of Colorado to vote in case of a tie vote by the regents.

5 An Amendment to Article V of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, relating to the prohibition against increasing or decreasing compensation of certain state and county officers during the term of office to which they have been elected or appointed.

6 An Act to amend the Constitution of the State of Colorado to provide for a privately operated lottery, supervised and regulated by the Department of State of the State of Colorado, and granting an exclusive original ten year license to the United States Sweepstakes Corporation, forty percent of the proceeds of a lottery or lotteries to be allotted to prizes; thirty percent to the United States Sweepstakes Corporation for operating, selling, expiring, and profit; thirty percent to the General Fund of the State of Colorado. An annual lottery shall be held for the benefit of Colorado charities.

7 An Amendment to Section 11 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Colorado concerning the General Property Tax, establishing a maximum limitation of one and one-half percent of the actual value on the annual taxation of property except as permitted by a vote of the qualified electors, designating the maximum amount that may be levied by government units and defining actual value.

8 An Act to amend Article X and XI of the State Constitution to prohibit the State from levying taxes and appropriating or loaning funds for the purpose of aiding or furthering the 1976 Winter Olympic Games.

9 An Act to amend Chapters 3 and 63, CRS 1963, as amended, by adding three new articles which require, first, that public officials disclose their private interests; second, that all lobbyists register and file periodic informational statements; and third, that all official state meetings be open to the public.

10 An Act to protect the consumer of public utility services by defining just and reasonable rates, by creating an Office of Public Consumer Counsel and by requiring the disclosure of certain financial information regarding public utilities.

11 An Act to amend Chapter 13, CRS 1963, as amended by adding a new Article 25 establishing a system of compulsory insurance and compensation irrespective of fault for victims of motor vehicle accidents, setting forth the basis for recovery and the elements thereof, and establishing an assigned claims plan to protect injured victims against unassigned losses.

12 An Act to amend the State Constitution by the addition of a new Article, concerning replacement of property taxes for the financing of schools and limitations on other property taxes; providing for creation of a State Tax Equalization Commission for uniform assessment of all real property; requiring imposition by law effective January 1, 1974, of certain taxes to replace lost property tax revenue sources; mandating Severance taxes; progressively graduated corporate and personal income taxes; and taxes on sales and services; providing sales tax credits and limits sale and service taxes to 3% by the State, and 3% by any local governmental subdivision.
