Affiliates active in Project Healthy Choice

rom Hawaii to New Hampshire, from Illinois to Colorado, Libertarian state parties are taking an active role to promote Project Healthy Choice—and to make the Libertarian perspective heard on the health care issue.

"Our state organizations are engaged in a groundswell of activities to publicize our free market health care alternative, and to attack President Bill Clinton's 'tax and spend' socialized medicine," said Director of Communications Bill Winter, coordinator of Project Healthy Choice at the LP's Washington, DC, headquarters.

"If we keep this up, we can turn health care reform into a Libertarian issue!" he said.

The LP's health care proposal—which Winter described as "efficient and compassionate"—calls for free market reforms to increase consumer choice and decrease government interference.

The five-point plan advocates Medical Savings Accounts; restructuring tax policy to make all health care expenditures 100 percent tax deductible; deregulating the health care industry to eliminate harmful and expensive government policies; replacing the FDA with a private-sector



organization; and privatizing Medicare and Medicaid.

The LP organized Project Healthy Choice to lobby for free market health care and to convince congressmen and senators to vote against the Clinton plan.

To support Project Healthy Choice, the national headquarters sent lobbying and outreach material to all 50 state parties, and Winter said he was "delighted" at the activity now erupting on the health care issue. "Word is filtering in from around the country about a whole slew of projects," he said.

Drug War protest

Libertarians and FIJA activists shut down court

In mid-November last year, Libertarian Party National Committee member Ron Crickenberger and other LP members, as well as members of Georgia NORML and the Fully Informed Jury Association (FIJA), staged a protest outside the federal courthouse in Atlanta, GA, that was successful in shutting down the courthouse for the day. The protesters were outraged at the terrorist tactics of Drug Enforcement Administration agents attempting to prosecute the owners of a hydroponics business.

Crickenberger said the protest called attention to a system that is out of control. "A lot of innocent people are being hurt. The Drug War has become a war on the American people," he said.

The following column by Vin Suprynowicz describes the actions that led to the protest and focuses on the FIJA aspects of the case.

The Drug Enforcement Administration's case against Gary and Joanne Tucker, owners of the Southern Lights lighting store in Norcross, GA, is typical of the kind of absurd assault on the innocent into which our national "Drug War" has degenerated.

Federal agents were never able to catch the Tuckers

growing, possessing, or selling marijuana. They are not accused of ever having done so. Nor did any of the standard attempts to entrap the Tuckers into discussing methods of marijuana cultivation with undercover agents posing as "customers" succeed.

No matter. The Tuckers sell lighting units that are capable of sustaining the growth of plants indoors. So the narcs staked out the store's parking lot for months, took down license plate numbers, filmed their customers, tracked them home, and eventually staged raids on 80 private residences, resulting in 29 cases. In other words, 64 percent of those raided turned out to be growing tomatoes or African violets, but what patriotic Ameri-

can could object to a law enforcement method in which a mere 64 percent of those handcuffed and dragged out of their homes naked at dawn turn out to be completely innocent?

In the end, based on some of their customers supposedly having used the lights to grow indoor marijuana, the Tuckers were charged with "conspiracy to manufacture marijuana." The Kmart garden center down the road has not been busted for selling these desperados their potting soil. . . yet.

The Georgia branch of the Fully Informed Jury Association (FIJA) got wind of the Tuckers' November trial date before Chief Judge William O'Kelly at Atlanta's federal courthouse, and chose that day to leaflet prospective jurors with pamphlets informing them of their jury rights.

FIJA's goal is to inform Americans of the power of juries

to decide not just whether a defendant has performed the acts alleged, but also whether the law in question is a law that ought to be enforced, and whether the government has applied the law properly.

American legal history shines with examples of jurors using this power, even when it directly contradicts the attempts of a judge—who is, after all, a salaried government bureaucrat—to intimidate them into merely rubber-stamping the government's case.

Northern juries in the 1850s proved so unwilling to convict Abolitionists of not returning runaways under the Fugitive Slave Act that prosecutors gave up. Eventual result: Slavery abolished.

The John Peter Zenger jury in colonial New York was

Small steps, big payoff

Nominating in '96 offers challenge and opportunity for LP

It's true! Think about it. Was anyone ever more unreasonable than America's Founders? While we meekly suffer under 47 percent taxation, they went to war over a few small taxes on tea and newspapers. And while we still have recourse to the ballot box to redress our grievances, they chose to wage war against the greatest empire on earth.

How did they do it? By perseverance and the accumulation of small victories. And we must achieve our goals in the same way—one small step at a time.

For over a decade, the Libertarian Party has been beating back ballot access barriers, one small step at a time. For 1992, we set the "unreasonable" goal of putting our presidential ticket on every ballot in America. That vision inspired superhuman efforts from Libertarians all across the country. Through perseverance and the accumulation of victories one state at a time, every American had the opportunity to vote

From the Chair

Looking ahead toward 1996, we've set another "unreasonable" goal. On Dec. 11, 1993, the Libertarian National Committee set our next presidential nominating convention for July 4-7, 1996, in Washington DC. We still intend to be on every ballot in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

According to ballot access expert Richard Winger, "This will be the first time since 1972 that any third party which hoped to be on the ballot in all the states, or even most states, has dared to choose its presidential candidate so late in the election year. Although third parties routinely chose their presidential candidates in the late spring or early summer of the election year in the 1920's and earlier decades, hostile ballot access laws enacted since then have virtually forced third parties to make their choices much earlier."

Back in July 1924, when the Progressive Party nominated its first presidential candidate (Sen. Robert LaFollette), the deadline for getting him on the ballot had not passed in any state. Today, it would be too late for such a new party to even attempt to get on the ballot in at least 10 states. This is in spite of a 1983 U.S. Supreme Court ruling saying that petition deadlines must not be earlier than the date the Republicans and Democrats nominate their presidential candidates (July and/or August).

Of course, we are not a new party. Our past ballot access efforts have already earned us ballot status in nearly 20 states. Still, there are seven states whose laws will keep our presidential ticket off the ballot in 1996 if we wait until July 1996 to nominate. Unless we act now to overturn those laws.

Early in January 1994, I signed an agreement with our 1996 convention contractor, committing us to a July '96 convention. We now have the legal standing we need to

National convention awarded to DC in July 1996

At the December Libertarian National Committee meeting, a proposal was accepted to hold the next national convention in Washington, DC, from July 4-7, 1996.

The date of the convention marks a departure from past practices, since LP nominating conventions have normally been held during the Labor Day weekend the year before presidential elections. The accompanying column by national chair Steve Dasbach explains the rationale behind the change.

The convention was awarded to FEE Enterprises, a group made up of John Famularo, Don Ernsberger, and Louise

Ernsberger.

The site of the convention will be the Hyatt Regency Washington, located on Capitol Hill. The theme of the convention will be, "Declare Your Independence," and will mark the 200th anniversary of George Washington's Farewell Address and the 25th birthday of the Libertarian Party.

Highlights of the convention will include a special event at the Jefferson Memorial—"Liberty in Words and Music." The convention will also be built around maximum C-SPAN coverage.

Many more details of the convention will be covered soon in the NEWS.

challenge those laws. Through lobbying and legal action, we intend to overturn these oppressive laws. By perseverance and the accumulation of small victories, we will again be on every ballot in '96.

Why should we nominate in '96 instead of '95? According to Richard Winger, "(the) advantages for the party in holding a late convention are:

1. The party will be able to use its presidential primaries. It will probably have presidential primaries in 1996 in California, Idaho, Massachusetts, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, and South Dakota. A few other states are possibilities as well, depending on where the party qualifies for 'party' status in 1994 and 1995: Maine, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, and Oklahoma.

If there is a contest for the Libertarian presidential nomination, it will be the first time that a nationally-organized third party has used presidential primaries in more than just one state, to help it decide whom to nominate.

2. Candidates for the party's nomination won't need to begin campaigning at the

beginning of 1995; instead they can wait until the end of 1995, or even later. This should increase the number of people who will consider running.

3. The party's decision as to whom to nominate can be made at a time when the issues and likely contenders from the other parties are known." (Ballot Access News, Dec. 12, 1993)

Of course, we could continue letting Democrats and Republicans dictate our convention dates. Moving our convention to '96 does increase the risk that we won't make every ballot. Continuing to do what we've always done would be the "safe" choice, the one that didn't risk failure. But it isn't the choice that leads to victory.

We must follow in the footsteps of America's Founders. We must believe in and be inspired by an inner vision of ultimate triumph, and then make that vision real through the accumulation of small victories.

That means no more pessimism about the chances for success in our lifetime, but not more looking for shortcuts either. Victory soon, but one small step at a time.

When a Libertarian candidate looks like he might actually win, some Democrat and Republican opponents try to slander and smear him with charges like: "You want to cut off Social Security payments to the elderly" or "You're in favor of Drugs" or "You support kiddie porn" or "You condone prostitution...you even ran a prostitute for office in California."

When a Libertarian candidate looks like she might actually get elected, some newspaper and television reporters stoop to sensationalism, sleaze and shock stories about us and our political ideas. Stuff like: "Libertarians defend assault weapons - and claim the NRA is too compromising", "Libertarians would abolish welfare" or "Libertarian Party filled with anarchists."

Every elected Libertarian is an antidote to the slander and smears. What we are will speak so loudly that voters will hear every word we say.

7. Registered Libertarian voters can be converted into dues-paying, contribution-giving Libertarian Party members.

In 1991 and 1992, California Libertarian State Chair Pat Wright doubled dues-paying LP membership from 2,000 to 4,000...by sending letters to registered Libertarian voters and asking them to join.

The California Libertarian Party was able to persuade 1 out of 17 registered Libertarian voters to become dues-paying LP members.

Candidates and new groups

Arizona

In late September, the state Court of Appeals ruled that the number of signatures needed by a candidate to get on a primary ballot should be 5 percent of the number of registered voters in that party, not 5 percent of the votes it polled at the last general election. The court stated, "It makes no sense to say that a Democrat must be supported by 1.5 percent of the registered Democrats, but a Libertarian must be supported by 37.5 percent of the registered Libertarians." The case was brought by Ken Smalley, who ran for Tucson City

Party members registered nearly 100 new Libertarians at an outreach booth during last fall's state fair.

Florida

Richard Vajs, a Fort Walton Beach engineer, has announced his candidacy for the U.S. House seat currently held by Earl Hutto. To provide the financial foundation for a credible campaign, Vajs will contribute \$15,000 of his own money to the campaign.

Vajs and the state party have filed suit in state circuit court in Tallahassee challenging the constitutionality of a peculiar feedistribution statute that provides, essentially, that Florida "major" parties receive a percentage of their candidates' filing fees paid to the Department of State, but "minor" parties receive no percentage of their respective candidates' filing fees.

Handling the case is Tallahassee attorney Daniel Walker, who was co-counsel on the 1993 case in which the LP of Georgia successfully challenged a similar fee-distribution statute. To settle the case, the Georgia legislature repealed the challenged law and enacted a new statute to provide for equal treatment of all candidates' filing fees.

'The law we're challenging is just one blatant example of the 'electoral protectionism' practiced by the major parties against those of us who have the nerve to be something other than Democrat or Republican," said William Bragg, state chair.

National pulse

News from the states

Illinois

Libertarian Michael Krech, a trustee in the village of Lake in the Hills, proved one vote can make a difference. Although his "no" vote wasn't enough to keep the village board from increasing 1994 spending by 43 percent, he was able to kill a proposed road and street tax increase—and that saved taxpayers about \$48,000.

At a recent board meeting, only five of the seven members were in attendance. To increase the road and street tax required a three-fourths majority, meaning all five present trustees had to vote for the increase. But Krech, in true Libertarian fashion, voted against the tax increase, and therefore killed the tax hike for 1994.

Indiana

A new state affiliate is forming in Elkhart County. Scott Baker, Jan Noble, and Sean Frick are organizing the group. "We plan to work on Project Healthy Choice very strongly by holding public policy forums and utilizing public access television," Frick said. Plans are also being made for developing contacts with other community groups, as well as operating booths at the county fair and participation in parades. Frick, by the way, is a senior at Central High School in Bristol. He plans to attend Indiana University next fall.

Maryland

On Nov. 2, Wayne Dougherty lost his bid for election to the Brunswick City Council, 288-171, garnering 37 percent of the votes cast. The special election, to fill the unexpired term of a councilmember who had resigned, was non-partisan.

Massachusetts

Libertarians across the state are urging their local legislators to stop Gov. William Weld's proposed gun control legislation.

"Weld had clearly come out against gun control when he was running for governor—I suppose he felt that he needed the

so-called 'gun nut' vote," said state party executive director **Lee Nason**. "He was running as a small 'l' libertarian and most of us felt that voting for him would help the Commonwealth hold the line on economic freedoms while ensuring a fairly safe environment for civil liberties. In all fairness, I think that he has been doing a pretty good job on a large number of issues—taxes, spending, and term limitations at least. But he has betrayed us on a very important issue and this betrayal involved a lie, a reneging on his campaign promise.

"I predict that many gun enthusiasts will now be abandoning the Republican Party and perhaps some of them will even join us. At least with a Libertarian candidate, they know that they will not be deceived on the issue of gun control," Nason said.

Michigan

The state party, with substantial help from the national LP, turned in more than 40,000 signatures for ballot access. The project was headed up by **Emily Salvette**, **Scott Boman**, and **Barb Vozenilek**. The official ruling from the state is expected in a few months.

Jon Coon is campaigning for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Don Riegle next year. Coon has put together a very good press kit and is receiving good publicity. Coon, 34, is married and has three children. A former U.S. Army officer, Coon lives in Henderson and is vice chair of the state LP.

Missouri

Mike Meara has been named membership chair and chief fund raiser for the LP of St. Louis City. Meara, a 33-year-old financial planner, will contact current prospects for membership and existing members for renewals.

Oregon

Three new affiliate parties have organized in recent months.

The following Libertarians are heading the drives in their respective areas: In Union County, Gary Sublett II; in Clackamas County, Maurice Aho; and in Washington County, Bill Roberts and Thomas Cox.

Organizations are also forming in Umatilla and Columbia counties with efforts being led by **Stevan Sorbets** and **Andy Eggleston**.

Cox, Eggleston, and Sorbets are all new activists in the party. And there are lots of new LP activists in the state. In the last 18 months, Libertarian Party registration has increased from 2,000 to 9,000.



New additions to Libertarian officeholders noted

he tally of Libertarian election successes in November has jumped upward again—with five new victories added to the already impressive list.

In addition, another Libertarian was appointed mayor of a large California city in December, and an LP member was appointed to public office in South Dakota in November.

The five new election victories all occurred in Pennsylvania, bringing to 10 the total number of Libertarians elected in that state last month—and increasing to 14 the total number of LP victories around the U.S. in Campaign '93.

"The hits just keep on coming!" said

Pennsylvania state chair Ken Sturzenacker.

Elected to office were Robert A. Trump, constable (Mechanicsburg); Todd Zollinger, judge of elections (Mechanicsburg); John T. Erb, township tax collector (Lancaster County); William Vogt, judge of elections (North Hampton County); and Christopher Davis, judge of elections, (Lancaster County).

All the victories were won by write-in votes, said Sturzenacker, which is why the results trickled in so late.

"In most cases, the campaigns weren't organized in advance," he said. "In some cases, the people didn't know they had been elected until the vote counts were certified by the county

Boards of Elections!"

Sturzenacker admitted he was surprised by the number of victories, but said they illustrate an important point: "At the local level, there are a lot of opportunities. We just need to be aware of them to take advantage of them!" he said.

Sturzenacker also said the victories are crucial for building the credibility of the Pennsylvania LP.

"These will go a long way towards countering one of the last desperate raps the Republicans and Democrats try to put on us—'they have some wonderful ideas but they don't have any practical experience.' To the degree we continue to win, we can dispel that myth," he said.

Meanwhile, in California, Bonnie Flickinger was unanimously selected by the City Council on Dec. 14 to be the next mayor of the city of Moreno Valley.

Flickinger has served on the nonpartisan City Council of Moreno Valley, a city of almost 140,000 citizens, since 1992. Flickinger, 51, joins Alex Joseph of Big Water, UT, as one of only two Libertarian mayors in the U.S.

And last month, South Dakota Libertarian Art Lampert was appointed to the State Board of Vocational Rehabilitation. In his new, non-partisan office, Lampert will give Libertarian input into state vocational rehabilitation programs.

Merging inner and outer peace

Dr. Mary J. Ruwart, long-time Libertarian activist and author of "Healing Our World," recently met with Dr. John Hagelin, 1992 presidential candidate of the Natural Law Party. The following article is based on their conversations.

n late September, Dr. John Hagelin and I met in Fairfield, IA, to discuss the similarities between the Libertarian Party (LP) and the Natural Law Party (NLP). While at first glance our platforms seemed to have little in common, we found much that each group had to offer the other.

For example, both parties recognize that human nature and the natural laws governing society dictate that certain behaviors will promote life and happiness for both individuals and societies. Hence, the terminology "natural law" used by the NLP and the "natural rights" championed by the LP have been derived from the same source—the nature of humankind.

Libertarians have spent a considerable amount of time detailing the behavior that will create the material peace and plenty conducive to human life and happiness. Libertarians define natural rights as the practice of non-aggression. Thus, initiation of force and fraud against one's neighbor

have no place in the natural order of things. Libertarians have laid out in great detail what the practice of non-aggression actually entails and how aggression is hidden in our culture in the guise of government. Although there are some areas of debate, libertarians have come to consensus on most political issues. The LP platform has truly documented a blueprint for harmony and abundance by defining the physical acts that create or destroy it.

The NLP, on the other hand, starts with the inner realm. Their route to peace and plenty throughout the world starts with the consciousness of each individual. They promote educational programs that stimulate intelligence and creativity, thereby producing inner peace and stability. Through scientific study, they have produced evidence that this peace can extend outward to others, alleviating the individual and societal stress that exacerbate aggressive tendencies. Those who would like to review these data should contact the Natural Law Party at 51 W. Washington, Fairfield, IA 52556, and mention this article.

My personal belief is that each Party has one piece of the puzzle. Natural Law Party members, and indeed most people involved in the quest for inner peace, believe in the principle of non-aggression, and think that they practice it. However, they sometimes don't see the iron fist that backs the aggression through government, because it is so well hidden in its velvet glove. Libertarians can help the NLP to understand how taxes and regulation translate into the aggression that keeps peace from happening. NLP members probably will be very receptive to such knowledge since they already relate to the concept of non-aggression. Indeed, Dr. Hagelin enjoyed "Healing Our World"



and the libertarian perspective of how aggression-through-government can thwart even the best of intentions. How much more effective the NLP could be if they understood how to match inner peace with government policies consistent with outer peace!

Libertarians can learn a great deal about unity and community from the Natural Law Party as well. How did the Natural Law Party get on the ballot in 35 states for the 1992 election even though it was merely six months old that November? How was it able to raise many times more than the veteran Libertarian Party? From our discussions, we concluded that the techniques of inner peace that the Natural Law Party members practice result in the manifestation of outer peace in their one-on-one working relationships. Cooperation instead of infighting was the order of the day. How much more the LP could accomplish if it left factionalism behind!

What would happen if the LP and NLP worked together to complement each other? Better yet, what would happen if libertarians started developing inner peace and Natural Law Party members started promoting the actions required for the manifestation of outer peace? Separately,

we have only part of the picture. Together, sharing what we know, teaching each other a new way, will we see the whole that is more than the sum of its parts? Perhaps it will take the integration of inner and outer peace within our groups to teach the world the way to abundance and harmony. Perhaps we need to embody the *whole* of our human nature, both inner and outer, to precipitate political change.

Dr. Hagelin and I believe that merging our knowledge could result in a holistic perspective never before seen on the American political front. We propose to try it on whatever level possible. We already have begun contacts to explore cooperation in ballot access drives as a minimum outcome.

As a maximum outcome, we'd like to see our nation and our world embrace the principles of inner and outer peace. A strong step in this direction might be a merger of the two parties. Before this could be considered seriously, however, we'd need to get to know each other better. One way might be to draft a platform that both parties agree reflects their principles and values. Dr. Hagelin and I are committed to producing such a document and are inviting the input of both parties through articles in both party newsletters. Certainly, we need to meet each other face-to-face on a local and national level. Perhaps we could even match our slates so that together we promote a candidate dedicated to non-aggression for every office.

We invite you to join us in exploring the possibility of merging our knowledge of inner and outer peace to achieve freedom of the body, mind, and spirit. Please give us your input and critiques. Let us know if you'd like to help!

A call to pens (and phones, faxes, etc.)

I hate to tell you, but Congress appropriated \$26 million for Selective Service. Barbara Mikulski, the chair of the committee that approved this expenditure, argued that since Selective Service registration was authorized, it ought to be funded. So, next year, we'll focus on the authorization bill rather than the appropriation bill. Don't be too down. We're still two for three. Not bad considering what we're up against.

Now, on to new challenges! Not long ago, the United States Postal Service sent inspectors to Equifax, the credit reporting company. These postal operatives discovered that Equifax had used Federal Express for—gasp!—non-urgent mail. "So?" I hear you saying. Well, the postal service has a legal monopoly. They fined Equifax \$30,000, the amount they determined should have been spent on stamps for the non-urgent correspondence. According to federal law, unless your correspondence

requires "immediate response," effectively the same day it is received, it's not urgent and you must use the postal service. Never mind that, as reported by the *Wall Street Journal*, even the postal service's Priority Mail fails 23 percent of the time. Of course, it could be worse, as the Postal Inspection Service reminds us. They could bring a criminal prosecution. But in their magnanimity their current policy is merely to harass and fine.

Fortunately, Sen. Paul Coverdell (one of our more libertarian senators) sees this policy as "a classic example of government intrusion" and has taken steps to stop it. Although his recently introduced bill doesn't repeal the Private Express Statutes passed in 1872 that are the source of the problem, it does modify the law so that the postal service can no longer harass the customers of its competitors. S1541 simply removes the ability of the postal service to penalize these businesses. This bill has a good chance of becoming law. It has the



favorable attention of the *Wall Street Journal* and *The Washington Post*, not to mention Federal Express, UPS, Airborne, and all their customers. Join your voice to the call for passage.

Now for a bill we can all feel good about opposing. NBS. Those three little letters don't look particularly intimidating. But

what they stand for could signal the death knell of property rights in America. "NBS will map the whole nation for all biology and determine development for the whole country and regulate it all . . . ". That is a direct quotation from Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt's science adviser, Thomas Lovejoy. Sec. Babbitt also wants NBS to be exempt from the Privacy and Freedom of Information Acts. This will allow the government to determine NBS policies behind closed doors and to withhold the results of its survey from landowners. Of course, regulators and preservationist organizations will have instant access to the information through a computer database.

Choice special two-page supplement in their monthly newsletter, as did the LP of New Hampshire.

"This kind of packaged project is exactly what we need more of," said the LPNH's "Libertarian Lines" editor Jim McClarin.

In addition, NH Congressman Dick Swett's 1992 Libertarian opponent, John Lewicke attacked the Clinton Health Plan, which Swett was promoting in a public meeting in December. "If it's supposed to be so good, why is it mandatory?" Lewicke

- In Illinois, the state party plans to print and distribute 5,000 copies of the "Solving the Health Care Crisis" brochure distributed by the national headquarters.
- In Colorado, the party is participating in several ways, said state Chair David Aitken. "We're planning to distribute press releases to hopefully all the newspapers in the state," he said. Plus, he said, they are distributing the LP's health care "Briefing Paper" to important state legislators and major media figures, and have printed the two-page supplement in the new issue of the "CLIPboard," their newsletter.
- In Nevada, the party sent Project Healthy Choice press releases to major media, publicizing their participation.
- In Kansas, LP Shadow Cabinet Secretary of Health & Human Services Henry N. Bulter spoke on health care financing at the University of Kansas in October, in a presentation sponsored by the college's

Libertarian student group.

"The audience was very impressed by Dr. Butler's presentation," reported "The Free Kansan," the newsletter of the LP of Kansas. And in a follow-up opinion piece in the newsletter, LP member Damon Black argued that "the all-too-obvious solution to the health care crisis [is to] legalize health care"

- In Minnesota, "the party has been hitting health care since August 1992," reported LP member Brad Eichstadt, and has published an "Issue Paper" on the subject.
- In Pennsylvania, State Chair Ken Sturzenacker has ambitious plans for Project Healthy Choice. "I expect to make it one of the three or four central issues here in Pennsylvania this year," he said.

Sturzenacker said he hopes to turn the Project Healthy Choice material he received from the national LP headquarters into a 12-page outreach piece.

"Tve got a mailing list of 900 physicians and 900 people in the insurance business" to mail it to, he said. "We want to go to the professionals in the affected fields first. We hope to use them to raise money to mass-produce it."

Sturzenacker said he was "very impressed" with the quality of Project Healthy Choice, and predicted it would be effective politically. "Once people see the validity of our approach to this problem, then they will become more receptive to our views in other areas," he said.

There is an up side to this. Recently, the House approved the Taylor-Condit-Pombo Amendment to its version of NBS, which requires that Babbitt get written permission before entering private property. Also approved in HR1845 was the Tauzin Amendment that eliminated the use of volunteers from zealous protectionist groups. Now, we need the Senate to concur with these amendments.

Write your senator and tell him or her that the passage of NBS without these protections to private property rights is unconscionable. Also demand that NBS funding be removed unless and until these protections are established. You see, Congress has already approved \$160 million for NBS even though just what NBS is hasn't yet been established. In your letter or call, be careful not to suggest that you approve of NBS even with the amendments. Although it seems unlikely that passage of NBS can be entirely stopped, tolerating NBS with the property rights protections added is different from approving of it.

Here's more to give you nightmares! As you are writing your letters about health care to Washington, DC, you may want to keep in mind two other unsavory aspects of the planning on Capitol Hill. The first should shock you. Congress is considering exempting itself from the health plan. No one else will be allowed to escape. You may be thinking, "Oh well, if things ever get bad enough, I'll just pay for good care." That will be against the law for everyone but Congress. No doctor may ever bill a patient for services covered by the "health alliance." Any attempt to pay a doctor for such services may be construed as bribery, a new crime under the health care bill. There

Linking gun control to health care is the other source of that incessant buzzing in our nation's capital. Congresspeople are falling over each other to propose new taxes on guns, ammunition, and dealer licenses. In my district, it's hopeless. My representative is just salivating to pass whatever restrictions, taxes, and regulations he can. In a recent mailing, he actually tried to link current health care spending to the federal deficit. I'm not kidding. So, if your congressional representatives are

Finally, there's good news on the Dietary Supplement Act front. In the House, HR1709 has 217 co-sponsors. We need only a few more! Libertarians in New York can help give Rep. John LaFalce that last little push. He's considering co-sponsoring, and a few letters and phone calls may help him make up his mind. Dingell in Michigan and Waxman in California are crucial. They chair the Energy and Commerce Committee and House and Environment Subcommittee, respectively. These two have the power to bring the bill to a vote right now. If you're in their districts, now is your big chance to have one letter make a difference in the direction of national policy

Don't forget about HR3347, the asset forfeiture bill; HR3145 and S1514, "A Cut is a Cut"; or HR237, the Congressional Sunshine Proposal. These bills are still pending and need your support. Write your letters now.





presented with incontrovertible evidence that printer Zenger had violated British law by accusing the colonial governor of corruption, but they agreed with defense attorney Alexander Hamilton that a libel law that did not allow truth as a defense was abhorrent and acquitted Zenger anyway. Result: American Freedom of the Press.

When Judge William O'Kelly learned that as many as 25 percent of the prospective jurors for the Tucker trial had read a FIJA pamphlet that day, quoting such subversives as John Adams, John Jay, Oliver Wendell Holmes, and Chief Justice Harlan Fiske Stone ("If a juror feels that the statute involved in any criminal offense is unfair, or that it infringes upon the defendant's natural God-given unalienable, or Constitutional rights, then it is his duty to affirm that the offending statute is no law at all and that the violation of it is no crime at all..."), O'Kelly dismissed not only the prospective Tucker jurors, but every prospective juror in the building, declaring them to have been "contaminated.'

The judge then marshaled his employees on the courthouse steps to demand the identification of picketers, as well as to intimidate them into staying away on the new scheduled trial date of Jan. 3, by warning them that their actions verged on criminal jury tampering.

"Iasked the court executive, John Shope, 'Do you mean to tell me that this country has reached the point where printing the truth is against the law?' And he said, 'In some cases, yes,'" says Harvey Wysong, the former Marine officer and combat vet-

eran who coordinates FIJA activities in Georgia. "I was appalled."

I was unable to get through to Judge O'Kelly's office last week. But a member of his staff told the Atlanta papers "No one in this office," including the judge, would be talking to the press.

Wysong said his group planned to leaflet again Jan. 3.

Won't that just goad the judge into going further?

"I couldn't give less of a damn; I'm suing everyone involved *except* the judge under 42USC, Section 1983, individual liability against federal officers for civil damages. And the only reason I'm not suing him is I can't get an attorney to do it, they're a bunch of Judas goats. He was out on the courthouse steps, he directed his agents to go after me and the others who were picketing, the Libertarians."

How on earth could a judge object to jurors being told the truth about their historical rights, I asked Wysong.

"This is their territory, and we're reclaiming a part of it. Under Sparf & Hansen vs. United States, in 1894, the big industrialists started putting pressure on the government. Remember, unions were against the law, but juries were turning these union organizers loose. So the Supreme Court said it was OK to lie to the jury or not tell them the truth about the range of their powers. That case pulled the veil of secrecy over the jury, and it's been a downhill slide ever since. The jury in most cases today is nothing more than a dozen mannequins in a box, put there for show alone."

Wysong, with that fabled Southern gift



of oratory, says the hounds who bring a 400-lb. boar to bay can never bring it down alone. That's why boar hunters bring along two pit bulls on short chains. Once released, the pit bulls launch themselves at the wild pig without fear, clamping onto its ears and giving it several hundred pounds of dead weight to swing around. The boar tires quickly, and the hounds finish the job.

"I'm the pit bull. I'm the one who'll go in first and hang on," Wysong says. "We've got a whole lot of pit bulls here in Atlanta, and there are others more aggressive than I am and more tenacious than I am."

Having a government is like having a dog on a leash, Wysong says. "It's good to have your dog on a leash; but it's important to know which end each one of you goes on."

It will be interesting to see whether Chief Judge William O'Kelly will really try to arrest citizens for handing out the words of Tom Jefferson and Noah Webster and Alex Hamilton at a public courthouse this week, or whether he will try to intimidate the Tuckers' jury into believing they left behind the freedoms and the rights we were taught about in school when they entered

his courtroom.

Of course, the pitifulness of the government's case is revealed by this panicked response; no judge or prosecutor would have any concern about a juror voting his conscience in a prosecution for a real crime, like murder or armed robbery.

Thank God there are still a few people like the Fully Informed Jury Association out there fighting for our rights. I just think they ought to do one more thing: Start a list of judges who try to gut our right to trial by a fully-informed jury of our peers, as guaranteed in the very Constitution every judge takes a solemn oath to defend.

Because there is no statue of limitations on violations of that oath.
