#### New York Libertarians Convene In White Plains

Approximately 50 people attended the Libertarian Party of New York's 1996 annual convention at the Esplanade Hotel in White Plains on April 27 and 28. Speakers included Irwin Schiff, Mark Tuniewicz, John Famularo and Bill Winter.

The convention elected new officers for the coming year, 29 delegates to attend the national convention in Washington, DC in July and 33 electors for the presidential nominee in this November's election.

#### **Chair Reports**

LPNY chair, Blay Tarnoff, reported that hundreds of names have already been collected from OPH booths and many more OPH booths are planned. Dottie-Lou Brokaw reported that national chair Steve Dasbach says that the national LP will contribute up to \$30,000 to this year's presidential petition drive in New York. Members of LPNY who collect signatures will be offered the opportunity to get

#### Eastman Defeated for School Board

Sally Eastman of the Capital District Libertarian finished fourth in her bid to win a seat on the Shenendehowa school board. The vote was held on May 22. There were seven candidates seeking two seats on the board. The winners of the election were William Barnes with 2,508 votes, and Rosemarie Getty with 2,133 Ronald Schleich. incumbent, finished third with 1,698 votes; Eastman polled 1,416 votes; Vanessa Wolfson was fifth with 911 votes; Carole

Silvera was sixth with 741 votes; and Michael Lisuzzo was seventh with 565 votes. The district is in Saratoga county and includes the towns of Clifton Park, Waterford, Halfmoon, Ballston and Malta. It has an annual budget of almost \$74 million.

Eastman received favorable coverage from the mainstream press. On May 16, the Schenectady *Gazette* reported that "Keeping school property taxes in check while improving

paid for their time or have money donated to LPNY in lieu of pay.

#### LP on the Move

Bill Winter, the LP Director of Communications, was the speaker at lunch on Saturday. He told the audience that national LP membership has reached 14,000. That's an increase of 5,000 members in the past two years. He also said that there are now 174 Libertarians holding elected office (a 130% increase since 1993) and there are 123,000 voters who are registered as Libertarians (a 13% increase since 1994).

#### Beware the FEC

John Famularo, secretary of the national LP, told all LP candidates for public office to be very careful to comply with all government regulations. "The FEC has us on their radar screen and they have an unlimited ability to fine," he warned.

#### **Schiff Stumps for Nomination**

Irwin Schiff addressed the convention during the brunch on Sunday. Schiff who is seeking the LP nomination for president told the crowd that the first thing he would do if he were elected would be to "abolish all tax liens and pardon everyone convicted of a tax crime." He said that the IRS admits that compliance with the income tax is only 82% and he believes that it would drop to 75% if he receives the LP nomination. "A nation of sheep begets a government of wolves," he told the crowd.

#### Talk Show Host Leaning Libertarian

Radio talk show host Scott Lonsberry has announced that he may vote Libertarian this year. Lonsberry is heard from 3 to 6 in the afternoon on WQBK (1300 AM) in Albany.

Lonsberry considers himself a conservative Republican, but he has been very critical of the current Republicans both in Washington and in Albany. On May 16, he told his audience, "Whatever principles the Republicans may have had, they abandoned long ago. I'm thinking of voting Libertarian this year."

Lonsberry attended a Seminar One in Albany in 1988. Seminar One is an outreach technique developed by the Advocates for Self-Government. In it, a group of non-libertarians is led by a libertarian who tries to say as little as possible and let the others discover libertarianism in their own way.

Eastman called for a two-year employee salary freeze and promised to go through the district's budget with a 'very fine-toothed comb."

"'Five percent of the budget is waste and we need to look at it, cut it, and get rid of it,' Eastman declared."

Over 2000 flyers were passed out in the final two weeks before the vote.

Upon learning of her defeat in the election, Eastman said, "Maybe next year."
